Regents created the \$300 million **Promise+** endowment to expand tuition assistance programs at UT academic institutions. UT Arlington will receive \$2.3 million in the first year alone, making it possible for 4,000 students whose families make less than \$85,000 to have their entire tuition covered.

\$25.6M

\$25.6 million in Library Equipment Repair and Rehabilitation (LERR) funds over the last decade to fund additional major upgrades and repairs to buildings, the purchase of lab equipment, and the addition of new technology and improvements to provide critical campus infrastructure at UT Arlington.





\$102 million in PUF funding over the last decade toward facilities to support education and research at UT Arlington, including:

- The School of Social Work & College of Nursing & Health Innovation's academic building will offer flexible, state-of-the-art technology classrooms, teaching and dry research labs, faculty and staff offices, student engagement space, study and support spaces, and infrastructure support space.
- o The Science & Engineering Innovation & Research Building offers large multiuse collaborative spaces, large classrooms and lecture halls, and innovational research and teaching labs for the College of Engineering, the College of Science, and the College of Nursing and Health Innovation.

\$36.8M

\$36.8 million over the last decade to recruit and retain 73 notable UT Arlington faculty members through the Regents' successful

STARs (Science and Technology Acquisition and Retention) program. STAR recipients have generated additional research grants and support for UT Arlington that amount to more than three times the Regents' initial investment.



\$122.4M

\$122.4 million from the Texas Legislature in capital construction assistance for UT Arlington's Science and Engineering Innovation and Research Building (2015) and the Life Science Building renovation (2021).
