Regents created the \$300 million **Promise+** endowment to expand tuition assistance programs at UT academic institutions. UTEP will receive \$2.5 million in the first year alone, making it possible for an additional 450 students whose families make less than \$75,000 to have their entire tuition covered.

- A campus transformation project to create walkways, bike paths, and green spaces that connect campus buildings, improve pedestrian access, increase pedestrian safety, and create inviting gathering spaces on campus.
- Construction of the Interdisciplinary Research Building to integrate research, institutional research support, and teaching spaces.
- Construction of the Center for Advanced Manufacturing and Aerospace to house UTEP's growing research and teaching program in additive manufacturing. This new 85,000-square-foot building will start construction in September.

\$20.6 million over the last decade to recruit and retain 42 notable UTEP faculty members through the Regents' successful STARs

(Science and Technology Acquisition and Retention) program. STAR recipients have generated additional research grants and support for UTEP that amount to more than 18 times the Regents' initial investment.



\$122.4M

\$122.4 million from the Texas Legislature in capital construction assistance for UTEP's Interdisciplinary Research Building (2015) and the Advanced Teaching and Learning Complex (2021).
