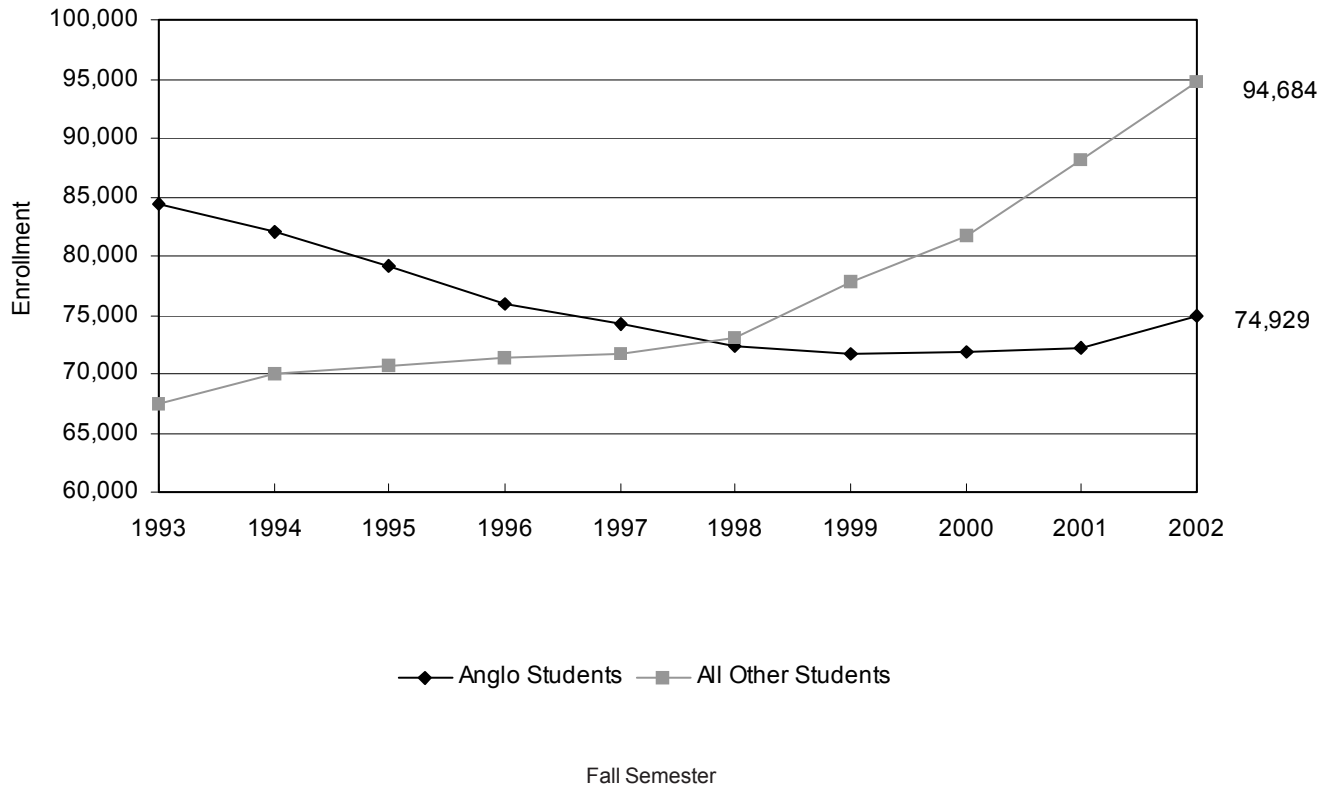

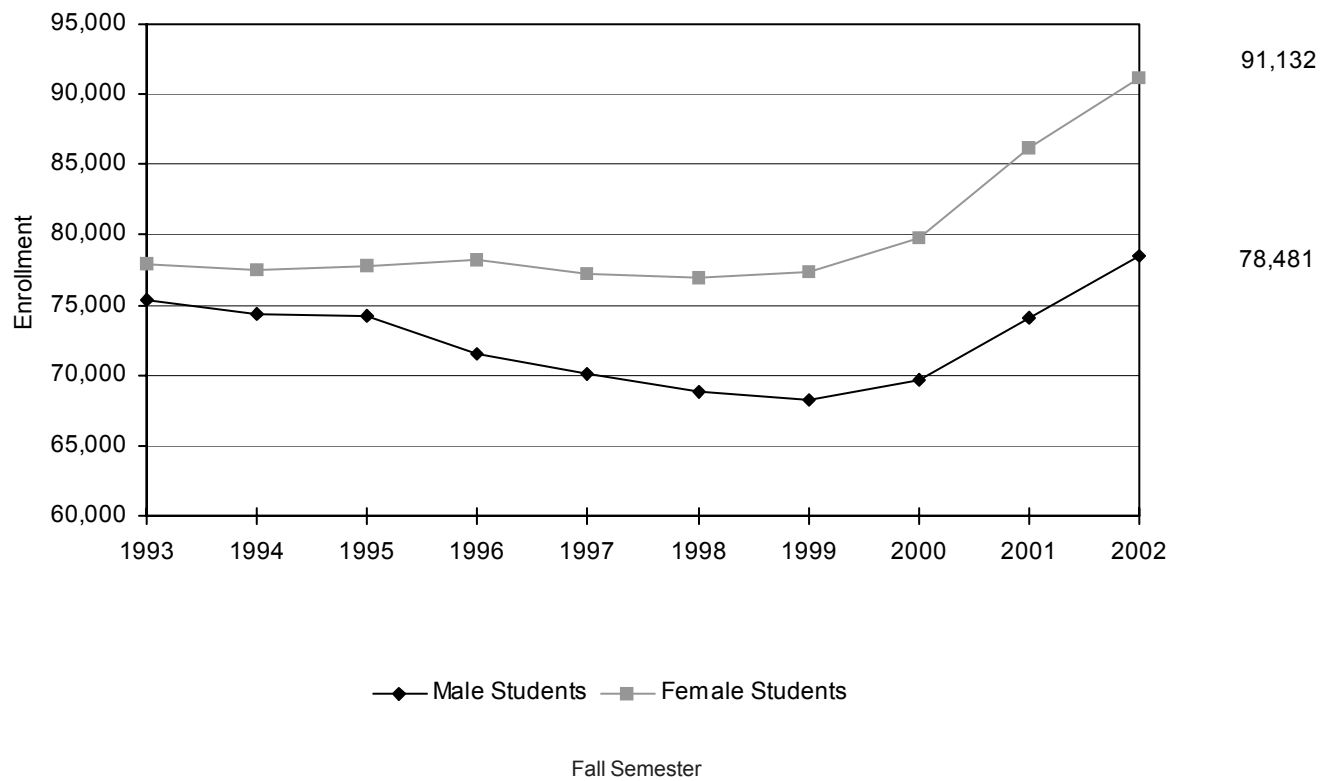
Student Enrollment Trend by Ethnic Origin Anglo vs. All Others

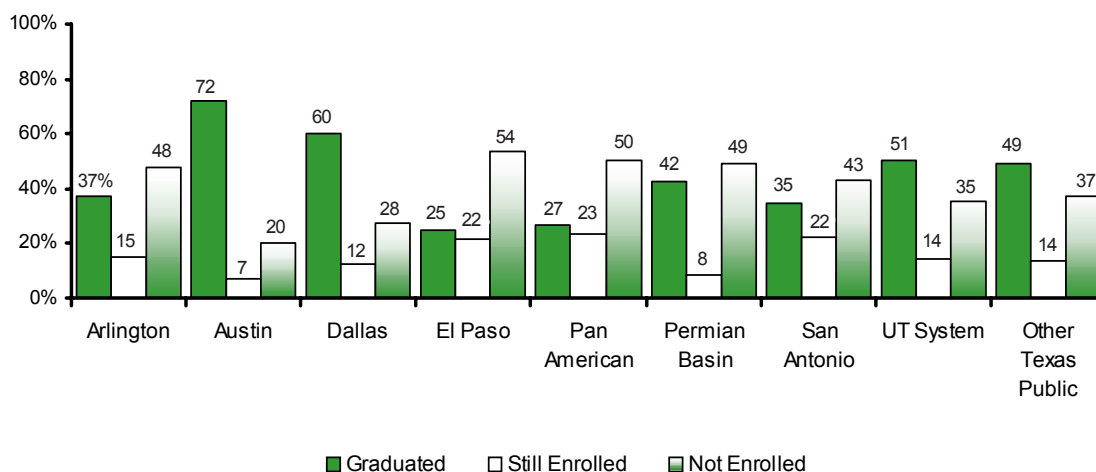

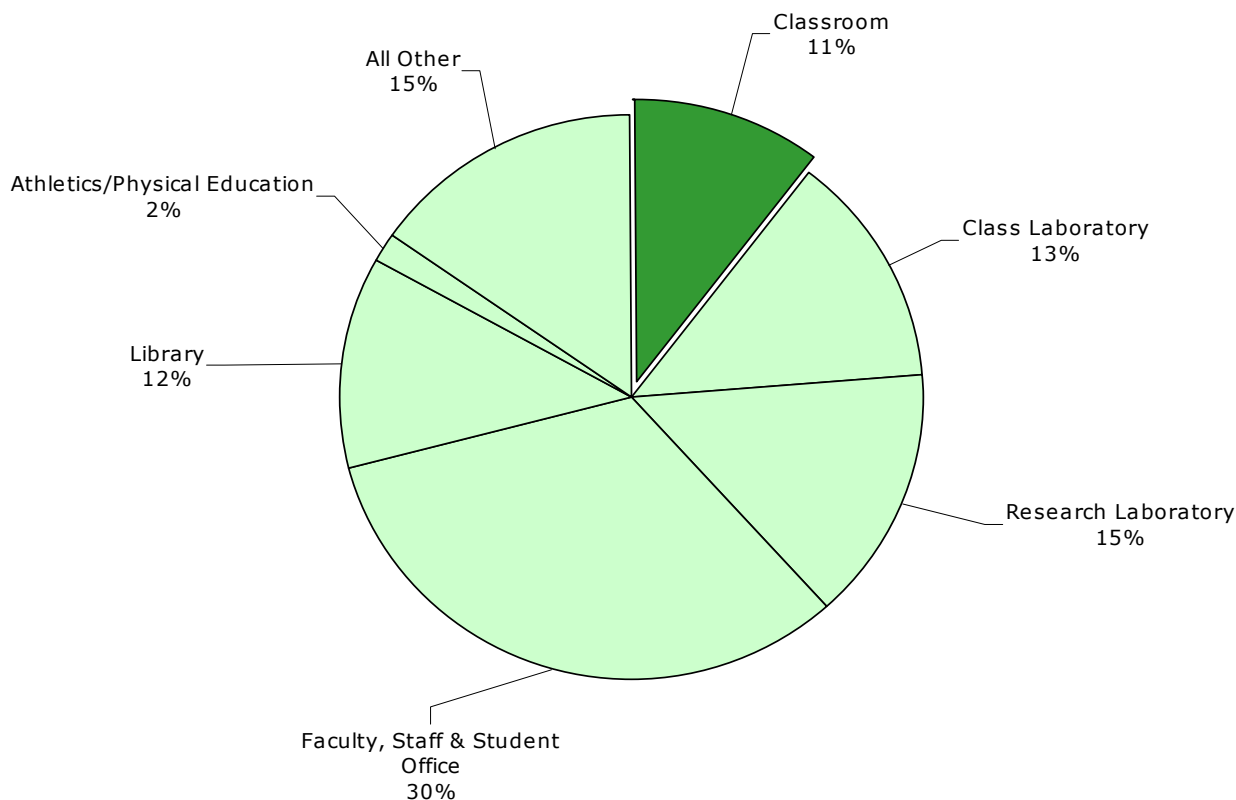
Assignable Educational and General Space Explanation

All Other includes the following categories: Currently Unusable, Special Use, General Use, Institutional Support, and Health Care Facilities.

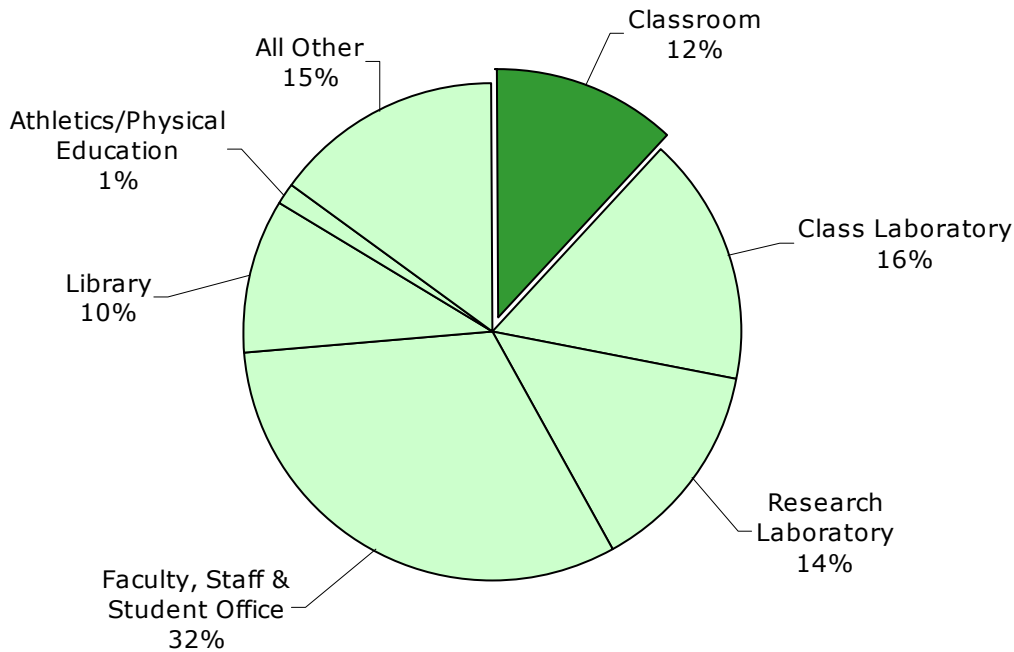
Explanation of **All Other** Categories:

- **Currently Unusable** space includes inactive areas, areas under conversion, and unfinished areas.
- Since **Athletics/Physical Education** space is usually the largest sub-category of **Special Use** space, it is shown separately.
- Other types of space included in **Special Use** are armory; audio/visual, radio, TV service; demonstration facilities; animal quarters; and greenhouses.
- **General Use** space examples are theaters, auditoriums, concert halls, arenas, museums, art galleries, and non-class (student government, community group) meeting rooms.
- **Institutional Support** space includes data processing, printing, repair and maintenance shop, central warehouse, and vehicle storage facilities.
