



Widespread adoption of Electronic Health Records, fueled by the ARRA incentive programs and new CMS requirements, including achieving compliance with the criteria for Meaningful Use, are creating new challenges and opportunities for Privacy and Security Officers in health care organizations.

In this webinar we will explore the Privacy and Security implications of the CMS Incentive Programs for Meaningful Use. An overview of the Meaningful Use requirements, including how HITECH has become a catalyst for compliance with the HIPAA Privacy and Security Rules will be presented. The session will include a discussion of strategies health care organizations can deploy in achieving Meaningful Use in the context of HIPAA/HITECH and their existing Privacy and Security Programs.
