Valerie Dixon has been with UCSD for more than 19 years in the areas of External Relations and Research Affairs. She currently serves as Director of the Conflict of Interest Office and is the Chief Specialist for the administration of federal, state and University policies, procedures and programs related to conflict of interest for the UCSD campus, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, and the UCSD Medical Center. She has direct management responsibility for effective interpretation of the UC Conflict of Interest Code by assessing circumstances under which outside activities or interests may inappropriately conflict with professional responsibilities; and coordination of conflict of interest compliance standards for the UCSD campus in the areas of research, purchasing, technology transfer and licensing, and the use of University facilities.
