

General Analysis – Persistence, Graduation and Outcomes

In February, 2006, the U. T. System Board of Regents passed a resolution making the improvement of graduation rates one of its highest priorities for the next decade.

The U. T. System Graduation Rate Improvement Initiative called for the nine academic institutions to set graduation rate targets for 2010 and 2015. These targets were approved by the Board of Regents in May 2006. While the impact of this initiative cannot be fully measured until the entering class of fall 2006 graduates, most institutions are already improving their graduation rates.

First-year persistence is an early indicator of student success. Based on a comparison of the entering classes of 2002 and 2007, first-year persistence rates for first-time, full-time degree-seeking undergraduates increased for three institutions:

- U. T. El Paso, from 69% to 70%
- U. T. Pan American, from 66% to 71%
- U. T. Tyler, from 54% to 65%

Based on a comparison of the entering classes of 1997 and 2001, the most current information available, six-year graduation rates from the same institution increased for these five institutions:

- U. T. Austin, from 71% to 78%
- U. T. El Paso, from 26% to 29%
- U. T. Pan American, from 26% to 33%
- U. T. Permian Basin, from 29% to 34%
- U. T. San Antonio, from 28% to 30%

Graduation rate effectiveness can also be measured by the percentage of students who graduate or persist at any Texas institution of higher education. These rates are especially important for students who enter under the Coordinated Admission Program (CAP) and are expected to continue their studies at another U. T. System institution. The six-year composite graduation and persistence rates from the entering class of fall 1997 to the entering class of fall 2001 increased for these seven institutions:

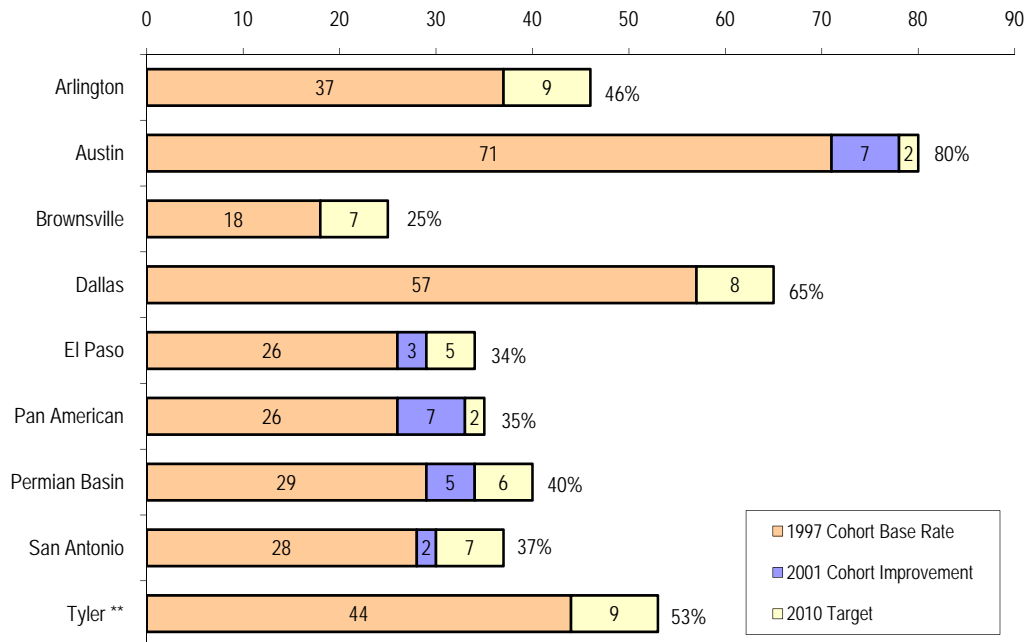
- U. T. Arlington, from 62% to 65%
- U. T. Austin, from 82% to 86%
- U. T. Dallas, from 73% to 79%
- U. T. El Paso, from 52% to 55%
- U. T. Pan American, from 53% to 57%
- U. T. Permian Basin, from 57% to 58%
- U. T. San Antonio, from 57% to 61%

Improving the graduation rates of students who transfer from a community college is also a priority of the U. T. System. A community college initiative has been developed in an effort to streamline and enhance the pipeline from community college to universities. The four-year graduation rates for community college transfer students entering U. T. System academic institutions with 30 or more credit hours in fall 2004 were:

- Over 40% - U. T. Arlington (46.4%), U. T. El Paso (42.7%) and U. T. Tyler (48.9%)
- Over 50% - U. T. Permian Basin (51.5%) and U. T. San Antonio (53.0%)
- Over 60% - U. T. Austin (68.0%), U. T. Dallas (62.0%), U. T. Pan American (61.2%)

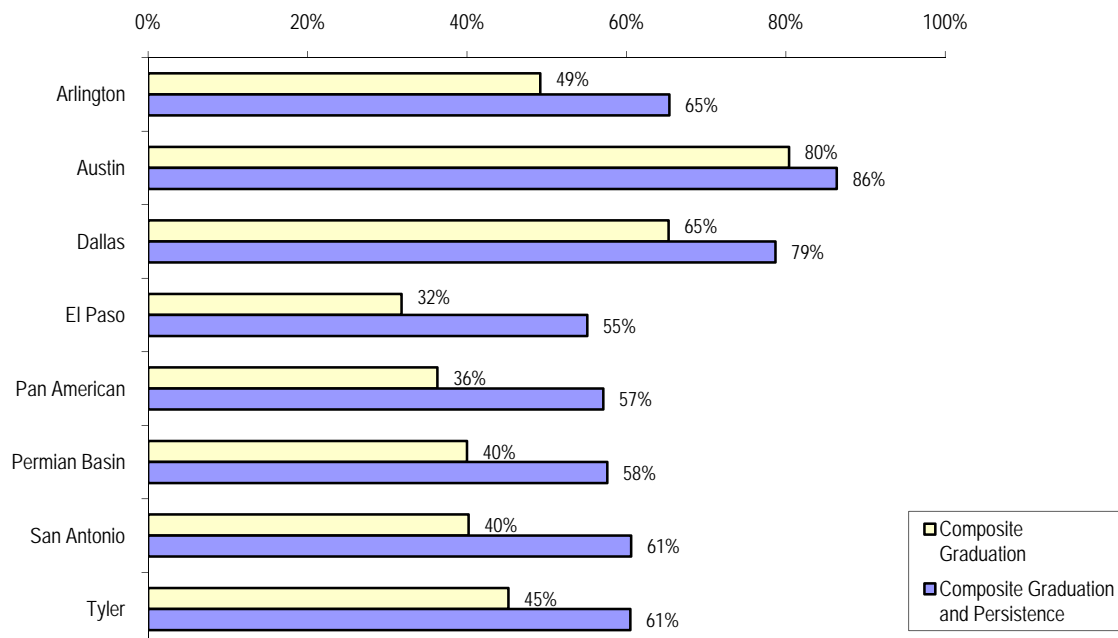
Progress to Six-Year Graduation Rate Targets
