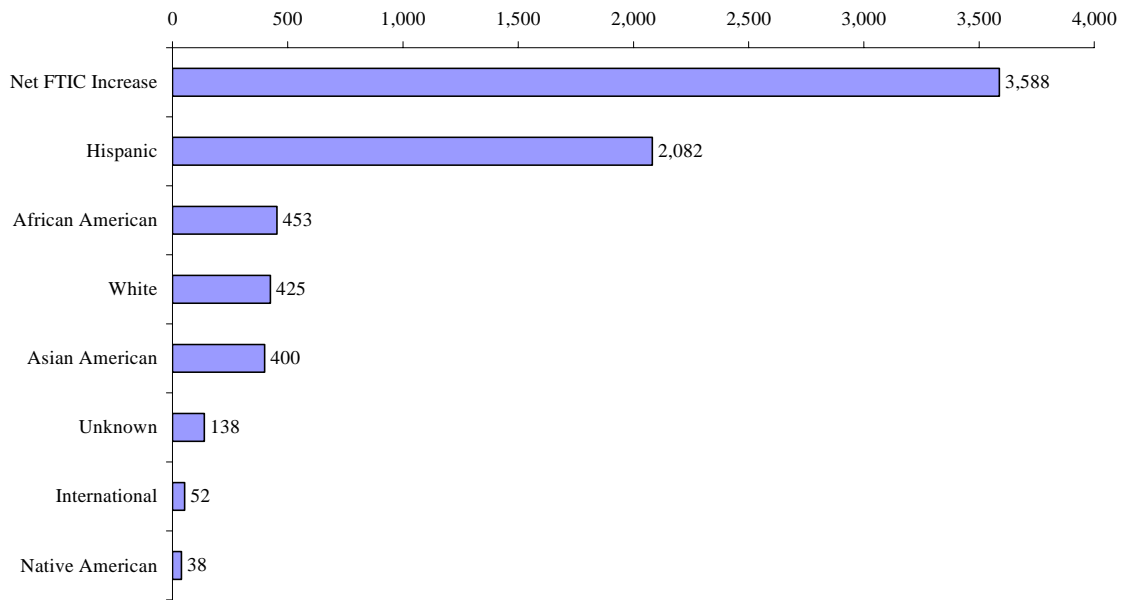
First-Time-in-College Undergraduate Enrollment Trends at U. T. Academic Institutions

Fall 2000 to Fall 2005

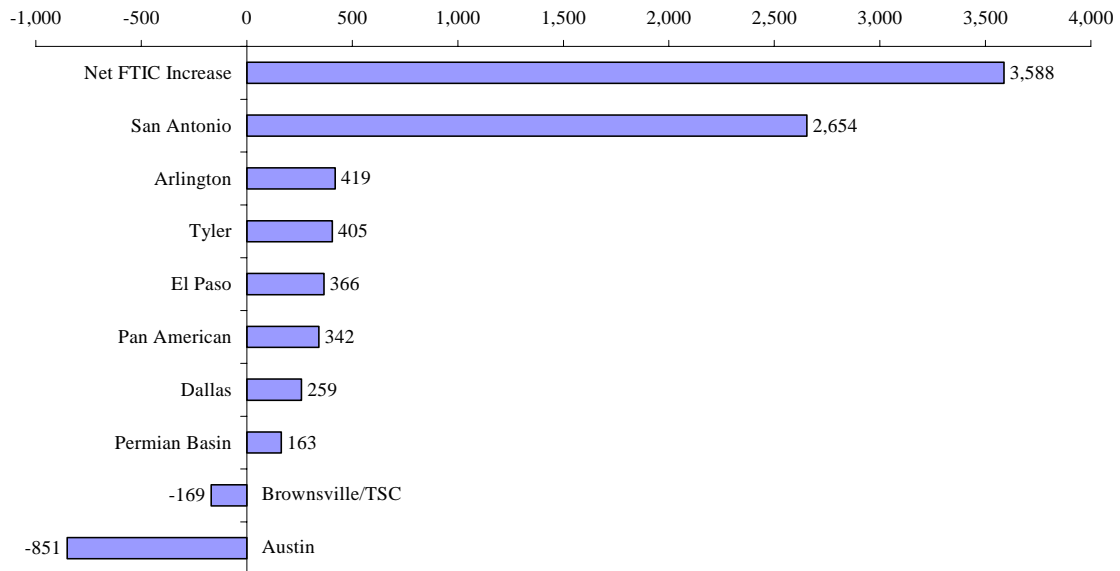
1. Enrollment of first-time-in-college (FTIC) students at the University of Texas System academic institutions grew from 18,438 to 22,206 (by 3,588 students or 19.5%) between fall 2000 and fall 2005.
2. Without U. T. Austin (which is operating under enrollment management controls), first-time-in-college enrollment at all other academic institutions combined increased by 4,439 students, an increase of 41.3%.
3. Overall, Hispanic enrollment increased from 7,252 to 9,334 (by 2,082 students or 28.7%) and represents over half of the FTIC enrollment growth. The proportion of Hispanic students increased from 39.3% in fall 2000 to 42.4% in fall 2005. Institutions with the largest increases of Hispanic students were U. T. San Antonio (929), U. T. Pan American (451), U. T. El Paso (353) and U. T. Austin (254).
4. African American enrollment grew from 777 to 1,230, a net increase of 453 students or 58.3%. The proportion of African American students increased slightly, from 4.2% to 5.6%. Institutions with the largest increases of African American students included U. T. San Antonio (242), U. T. Arlington (97), and U. T. Austin (53).
5. Between fall 2000 and fall 2005, white FTIC enrollment grew at a much slower rate, from 7,805 to 8,230, or 5.4%. The proportion of white students decreased from 42.3 % to 37.4%.
6. The growth rate for male and female students was similar, approximately 19%, although females represent a larger portion of first-time-in-college students, 52.1% in fall 2005.
7. The percentage of FTIC students enrolled full-time increased from 90.8% in fall 2000 to 95.2% in fall 2005. Without U.T. Austin, the percentage of full-time students increased from 85.4% in fall 2000 to 93.3% in fall 2005.
8. Overall, the proportion of traditional-aged FTIC students (19 and younger) has remained stable, around 95%. Excluding U.T. Austin, the proportion of traditional-aged FTIC students increased slightly from 90.6% in fall 2000 to 93.6% in fall 2005.
9. U.T. San Antonio experienced the largest FTIC enrollment growth, from 1,828 to 4,482 students, a net increase of 2,654 or 145.2%. U.T. Permian Basin and U.T. Tyler, with a much smaller base of entering students, also more than doubled their FTIC enrollment.
10. Total first-time-in-college enrollment reached its peak in fall 2003 with 22,390 students and has declined slightly for academic institutions even when U. T. Austin is excluded from these counts. This indicates that in addition to the demographic pipeline issues demonstrated by a slight drop in Texas high school graduates in 2004-05, other U. T. System academic institutions may be starting to manage their growth.

Academic Institutions, Fall 2000 to Fall 2005**

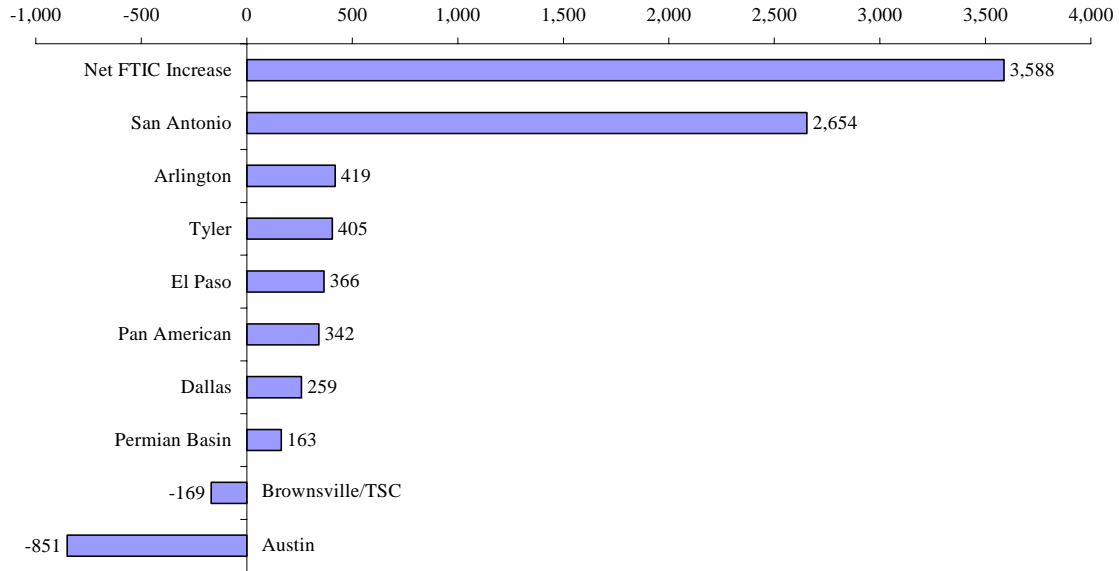
