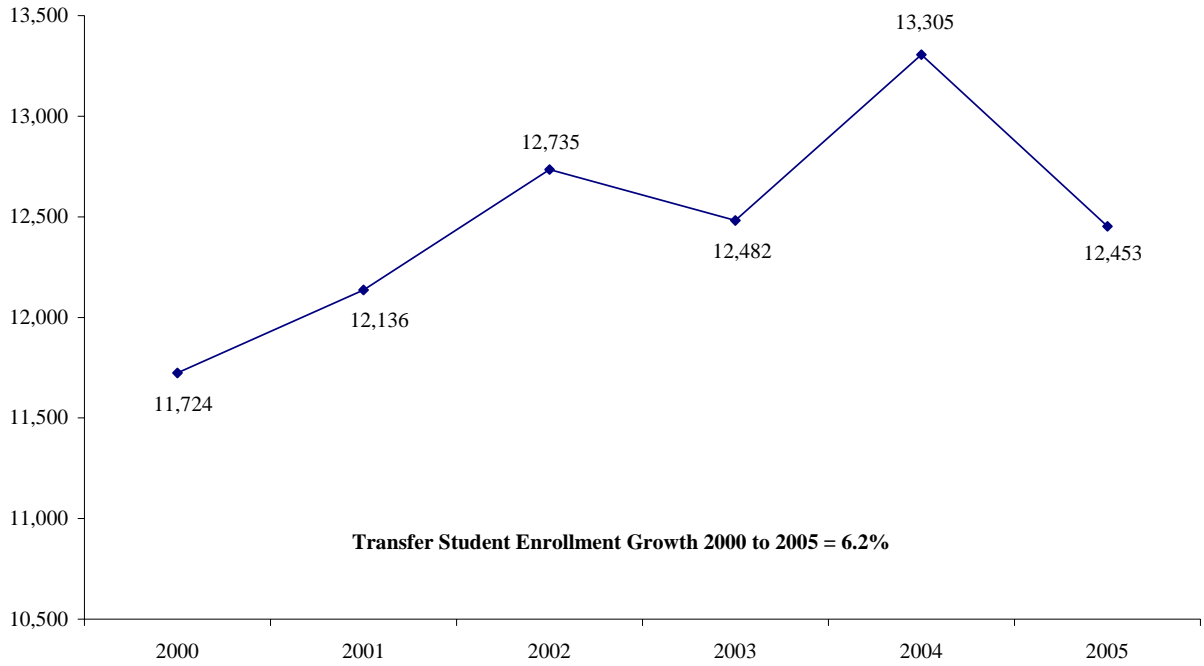
## Undergraduate Transfer Student Enrollment Trends at U. T. Academic Institutions

### Fall 2000 to Fall 2005

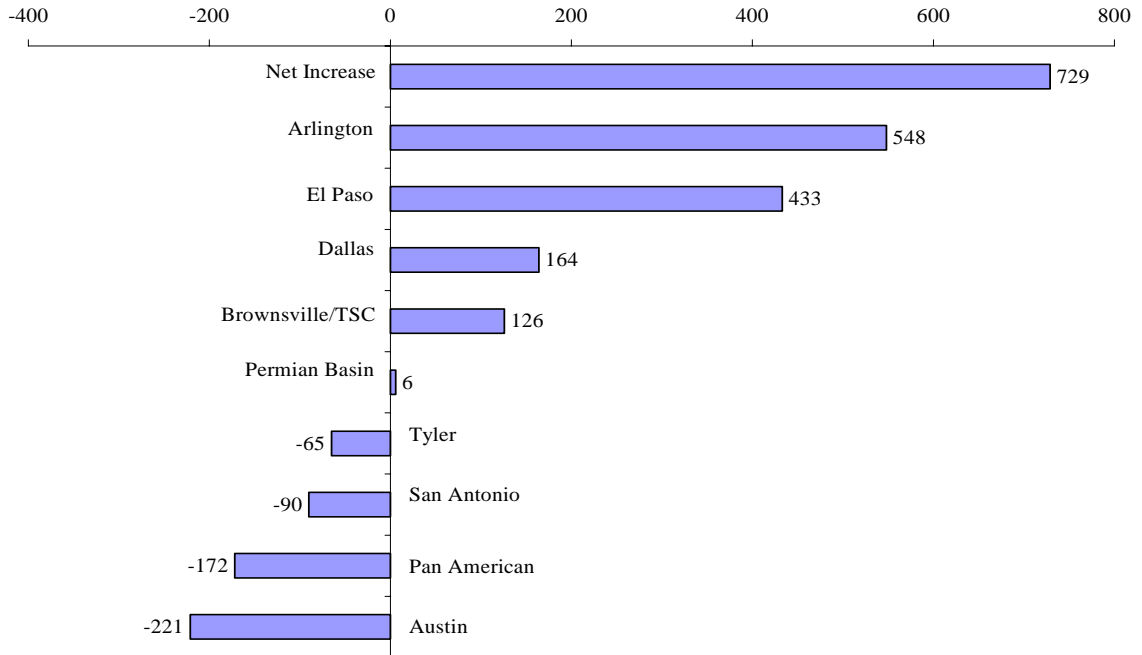
1. Undergraduate transfer enrollment at U. T. System academic institutions grew from 11,724 to 12,453 (an increase of 729 students or 6.2%). This rate of growth was much lower than that for first-time-in-college students (19.5%).
2. Without U. T. Austin (which is operating under enrollment management controls), undergraduate transfer enrollment at all other academic institutions combined increased by 950 students or 9.9%.
3. From fall 2000 to fall 2005, undergraduate transfer enrollment increased at some institutions, while it decreased at others. U. T. Arlington (+548 students) and U. T. El Paso (+433 students) experienced the largest increases in transfer students, while U. T. Austin (-221 students) and U. T. Pan American (-172 students) experienced the largest declines.
4. Undergraduate transfer enrollment growth varied by ethnicity. The number of white transfer students declined by 279 students (-4.8%), driven largely by declines at U. T. Austin (a loss of 221 students) and U. T. Tyler (a loss of 118 students).
5. The number of Hispanic transfer students increased by 472 students, a 13.2% net gain. U. T. El Paso (+316), U. T. Arlington (+193) and U. T. Brownsville (+88) had the largest net enrollment growth.
6. From fall 2000 to fall 2005, African American transfer students increased by 216 students, representing a 26.8% growth rate. Institutions with the largest net growth were U. T. Arlington (+128), U. T. Dallas (+43) and U. T. San Antonio (+40).
7. The net enrollment growth for Asian American transfer students was 202 students, a 31.4% increase. Institutions contributing the most to this enrollment growth were U. T. Arlington (+79) and U. T. Austin (+60).
8. Between fall 2000 and fall 2005, the proportion of transfer students attending full-time increased from 66.7% to 69.2%
9. A slightly larger percentage of the transfer students were younger in 2005 than in 2000. The proportion of students 22 years old and younger increased from 56.9% to 59.4% and the proportion of students over 30 years old decreased from 14.8 to 12.8%.
10. With the exception of one institution, the majority of transfer students entering U. T. System academic institutions came from Texas two-year colleges, ranging from 62.2% of the transfers at U. T. San Antonio to 76.3% of the transfers at U. T. Pan American. At U. T. Austin, 29.0% of the transfers came from Texas two-year colleges, while 47.3% came from Texas four-year colleges.
11. Total undergraduate transfer enrollment reached its peak in fall 2004 with 13,305 students. In fall 2005, undergraduate transfer enrollment declined by 6.4% to 12,453.
