Results of the 83rd Legislative Session

- Regular Biennial Session of 140 days
 - No emergency matters from Governor Perry
- Three Extraordinary or Called Sessions
 - Governor sets the agenda
 - 1st dealt with redistricting
 - 2nd addressed abortion and juvenile justice
 - 3rd finally passed transportation funding legislation



Higher Education Funding

- **Higher Education Funding Up**
 - \$13.1 billion in General Revenue for all of higher education
 - Increased \$604 million (4.8%)
 - Up \$305.7 million in General Revenue for all four-year institutions
 - Up \$233.9 million in General Revenue for all healthrelated institutions

THECB Sunset

S.B. 215

- THECB extended to 2025, but much changed
- THECB may review, but construction projects and real estate acquisitions are no longer subject to prior approval of the THECB
- THECB may not close low-producing programs but shares information with regents
- Action on proposed degree programs must occur within one year; no summary disapproval of proposed programs without full review
- Universities will now have more direct involvement in rulemaking, including negotiated rulemaking on admission policies, curriculum, allocation or distribution of funds, data requests, and compliance monitoring
- THECB must publish allocation methodologies for trusteed funds, including financial aid
- . THECB is prohibited from issuing certificates of authority to foreign post-secondary institutions
- New power of THECB to conduct risk-based compliance monitoring regarding funds allocated by THECB and data reporting; misuse or misallocation of funds is reported to regents, legislature, and governor, but no sanctions
- Express reservation to institutions of powers not granted to THECB



Legislation of Interest to Regents

- H.B. 31 Requires meetings of Board of Regents to be webcast and archived on the internet
- H.B. 2414 & S.B. 984 Facilitates greater electronic participation in Board meetings by Regents
- S.B. 1604 Allows Regents to appoint someone other than Chancellor to UTIMCO Board
- H.B. 12 Establishes reporting requirements for gifts designated as salary supplements and for information on staff compensation
- H.B. 16 Requires web posting and updates of internal audit plan and annual audit report

What Failed

- Tuition revenue bonds
- Campus carry
 - But S.B. 1907 prohibits rules preventing concealed weapons in vehicles
- Outcomes-based funding
- Clarification of roles in higher education governance (S.B. 15 vetoed by Governor Perry)
