#### THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS SYSTEM Explanations of Variances to Practice Plans Summary of Operations For the Nine Months Ending May 31, 1999

Explanations are provided for variances equal to or greater than 10% of the year-to-date allocated budget and greater than \$500,000.

#### **Expenditures and Other Deductions**

(1) <u>Fringe Benefits</u> – The \$9.2 million (10%) variance below budget is primarily attributable to *U.T.S.M.C. Dallas* (\$5.2 million) and *U.T.M.D. Anderson* (\$3.4 million).

When developing the 1999 Operating Budget, *U.T.S.M.C. Dallas* overestimated the amount of fringe benefits for the year, causing a \$5.2 million (21%) variance for the third quarter of 1999. The variance is expected to increase as the year progresses.

U.T.M.D. Anderson's Operating Budget included fringe benefits for new and vacant positions at the full annual amount. However, at the end of May there were still a number of unfilled faculty and administrative positions, causing actual fringe benefits expenditures to be \$3.4 million (10.6%) under budget. This variance is expected to continue.

- (2) Other (Travel, Official Functions & Debt Service) The \$945,000 (10%) variance of expenditures under budget is largely due to U.T.M.B. Galveston (\$1 million). Due to its operating deficit, U.T.M.B. Galveston expended less than anticipated on travel and official functions through the third quarter of this year. The variance is expected to increase.
- (3) Other Deductions The \$4.3 million (102.5%) variance over budget is largely attributable to U.T.S.M.C. Dallas (\$2.8 million) and U.T.M.B. Galveston (\$2 million).

*U.T.S.M.C. Dallas* variance is primarily due to unbudgeted transfers to provide start-up costs for the construction of a radiation oncology center (\$300,000) and to establish endowments (\$2.1 million).

The majority of *U.T.M.B. Galveston's* variance is due to an unbudgeted transfer to plant funds of \$1.3 million that represents matching funds on a federal grant to construct a laboratory facility. The remainder of the variance is due to unbudgeted transfers to various funds to establish new programs.

CAPITAL OUTLAY - Cost of capital acquisitions funded from plan resources not reported in "Debt Service" below

COMMERCIAL INSURANCE -- Income received from insurance agencies.

CONTRACTUAL INCOME - Income received for contractual physician services to affiliated hospitals and contractual physician services to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice at U.T. Medical Branch at Galveston.

FACULTY SALARIES -- All faculty salary payments including salary augmentation.

FRINGE BENEFITS -- Group insurance premiums (net of premium sharing) paid by the plan, supplemental retirement annuities, parking, and mandatory state benefits (retirement, OASI, WCI, premium sharing, etc.).

INTEREST INCOME - Income earned from investments.

MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS - All expenditures not classified elsewhere, i.e., utilities, supplies, repairs and maintenance, shipping and postage, etc.

MEDICAID - Income received from the State of Texas for the care of certain indigent patients.

MEDICARE - Income received from the Federal government for the care of certain indigent patients

MSRDP/DSRDP/PRS — Medical Services Research and Development Plan/Dental Services Research and Development Plan/Physicians' Referral Service. These plans are trust funds established by the U.T. Board of Regents that operate under approved bylaws, authorizing the specific types of expenditures that can be made. The expenditures in these plans come from the services provided by physicians' services to patients and include outlays for supplies, equipment, salaries, and staff benefits.

OTHER ADDITIONS - Transfers from non-practice plan funds, which are not budgeted.

OTHER DEDUCTIONS - Annual change in Accrued Compensable Absences payable and transfers to non-practice plan funds for the establishment of quasi-endowments, to provide funding for new programs outside the plan, to provide reimbursement for services rendered, and to provide salary and program enhancement supplements.

#### OTHER EXPENDITURES:

TRAVEL - All costs associated with travel.

OFFICIAL FUNCTIONS — Business related events, which are of documented benefit to the institution.

DEBT SERVICE — Principal and interest paid on any debt, i.e., building construction, renovation, lease-purchase agreements, etc.

OTHER - Other revenue items not identified elsewhere, and net change in Accounts Receivable.

OTHER INCOME - Income not related to patient care.

#### OTHER SALARIES:

RESIDENT SALARIES - Salaries paid to resident physicians.

STAFF SALARIES - All non-faculty salary payments, excluding resident salaries.

PRIVATE PAY - Income received from individuals.

PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE - Professional liability insurance premiums paid by the institution on behalf of plan members.

The following Plan to Manage Potential Conflicts of Interest has been reviewed by the Office of General Counsel and approved by the Executive Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs and is recommended for approval by the U. T. Board of Regents.

 Plan to Manage Potential Conflict of Interest for Dr. Jonathan Uhr and Dr. Emilan Racila

The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas (the "University"), on behalf of The University of Texas System Board of Regents ("Board"), wishes to enter into an exclusive License Agreement with Immunicon Corporation ("Licensee"), a Pennsylvania corporation having a principal place of business in Huntingdon Valley, Pennsylvania. The provisions of this exclusive License Agreement have been reviewed and approved pursuant to the Regents' Rules by Peter H. Fitzgerald, Ph.D. as designee of the Chief Administrative Officer of the University, and by the Office of General Counsel. The License Agreement covers the following invention ("Invention") in the field of immunodetection of circulating tumor cells:

Use of ferrofluid-antibody conjugates to isolate and enrich circulating carcinoma cells from the sera of patients for the diagnostic assessment of metastatic disease.

The Invention was developed by Jonathan Uhr, M.D., Professor of Microbiology, and Emilan Racita, Ph.D., Assistant Instructor at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas; and by investigators at Immunicon Corporation. Under the proposed License Agreement, Licensee is granted an exclusive, worldwide license and right to make, have made, use, lease, rent, sell and distribute the Invention. Additionally, the Board will receive:

- (1) an annual license fee of \$25,000 within 30 days of the third anniversary of the effective date of the agreement and at subsequent anniversaries of the effective date;
- (2) a running earned royalty equal to 1% of net sales of any licensed diagnostic product;
- (3) 200,000 shares of common stock of Licensee (to be shared with Drs. Uhr and Racila in accordance with the Regents' <u>Rules</u>) within thirty (30) days following execution of the license;

(4) reimbursement of all Invention expenses to date and on patent applications filed in the future.

In addition, under terms of a Sponsored Research Agreement, attendant to this License Agreement, Licensee shall provide research funding to Dr. Uhr to total \$570,000 over a three year period, commencing with the effective date of the License Agreement.

Currently, neither Dr. Uhr nor Dr. Racila hold equity in Licensee. However, upon execution of the License Agreement, Dr. Uhr would hold 0.45%, and Dr. Racila, 0.05%, of the total common shares of Licensee. In view of this potential conflict of interest, the University has developed the following measures to eliminate the likelihood that actual conflicts will arise:

- (1) As required by <u>Texas Education Code</u>, Section 51.912(b), and the Regents' <u>Rules</u>, Part Two, Chapter XII, Section 7.3, Drs. Uhr and Racila have provided the University with a disclosure of all potential conflicts of interest that might emanate from the terms of the License Agreement. Thus UT Southwestern has dutifully complied with regulations governing the definition of potential conflicts that might arise through the proposed License Agreement.
- (2) In review of this disclosure, the University has determined that a license to a company with faculty equity is appropriate inasmuch as the activities of Licensee involve applied research and the potential discovery and manufacturing of diagnostic agents useful in the management of epithelial carcinomas, and Dr. Uhr's University laboratory performs basic research. Most specifically, under the terms and financial support of the Sponsored Research Agreement derivative to this License Agreement, Dr. Uhr's University-based research will seek further definition of the basic immunophenotype of metastatic cells. The University has determined that no inherent conflicts of interest exist in the written, proposed research plan of Dr. Uhr.
- (3) The University has implemented a management strategy to minimize the risk of a future conflict of interest. Under this plan, written descriptions of ongoing and planned research conducted in the laboratory of Dr. Jonathan Uhr will be reviewed by Perrie M. Adams, Ph.D., Associate Dean for Research and co-chair of the Conflict of Interest Committee, and Dennis K. Stone, M.D., Vice President for Technology Development at the University. These written descriptions will be in the forms of required annual

reports for all agencies (including the Licensee under the terms of its Sponsored Research Agreement) currently providing research funding to the University laboratory of Dr. Uhr, as well as any new research proposals soliciting funding from public and private agencies. All research projects described in these reports will be reviewed by Drs. Adams and Stone for any potential conflicts of interest pertinent to the terms of the License Agreement, and all such projects shall require approval by Drs. Adams and Stone. If any such research project shall be found by Dr. Adams or Dr. Stone to result in an actual conflict of interest pertinent to the terms of the License Agreement, Dr. Uhr will be required to either modify his research plan such that it is deemed by Drs. Adams and Stone to no longer create a conflict of interest or to transfer the portions of research that have been found to create a conflict of interest to an independent investigator, to be designated by the mutual consent of Drs. Adams, Stone and Uhr. Thus, the University has developed a diligent review procedure to prevent the actual development of a conflict of interest pertinent to the License Agreement.

(4) Further assurance that a conflict of interest will not develop is evidenced by the facts that under the terms of the License Agreement, Dr. Uhr, will hold less than 0.5%, and Dr. Racila, less than 0.1%, of the outstanding shares in the Licensee; thus, neither Dr. Uhr nor Dr. Racila has received disproportionate compensation relative to the standard share of equity they might receive for technology licensed to a similar company. Further, as set forth in the License Agreement, Drs. Uhr and Racila are not precluded from attempting to obtain grant funding for the fundamental focus of Dr. Uhr's laboratory.

In view of the forgoing, U. T. Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas believes that the proposed arrangement is consistent with Section 51.912 of the <u>Texas Education Code</u> and corresponding provisions of The University of Texas System Intellectual Property Policy. Pursuant to Part Two, Chapter XII, Subsections 6.2 and 7.1 of the Regents' Rules, approval by The University of Texas System Board of Regents is necessary for Drs. Uhr and Racila to hold equity in the Licensee.
