#### REBATE OF U. T. SYSTEM PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL LIABILITY BENEFIT PLAN PREMIUMS

# THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS SYSTEM Explanations Of Variances To Practice Plans Summary Of Operations For the Nine Months Ending May 31, 1998

Explanations are provided for variances equal to or greater than 10% of the year-to-date allocated budget and greater than \$500,000.

(1) Restated Beginning Balance – All the 5.01(a) corporations (the corporations) should be reported in other designated funds, separate and distinct from practice plan funds. The September 1, 1997 beginning balances have been restated by \$1.4 million to exclude the fund balances for the corporations reported in practice plan funds in 1997.

U.T. Health Science Center at San Antonio restated fund balances by \$17.2 million due to a settlement with the U.S. government affecting prior years. The settlement stems from allegations that the university submitted unsubstantiated claims to Medicare, Medicaid, and other agencies. The \$17.2 million will be paid in four installments of \$4.3 million with the first payment being recorded in June, 1998, and the remaining three payments due over the next three fiscal years.

### **Expenditures and Other Deductions**

- (2) <u>Capital Outlay</u> The \$1.4 million (13.9%) variance below budget is primarily attributable to U.T. Medical Branch at Galveston which has been scrutinizing capital outlay expenditures more closely, resulting in a reduced level of year-to-date capital expenditures.
- (3) Other Deductions The \$1.5 million (33.9%) variance over budget is primarily attributable to U.T. Southwestern's \$2 million transfer of additional MSRDP funds to Endowment funds than originally budgeted. Since these transfers were not included in the budget, the variance is expected to continue.

### **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

AD DEBT WRITE-OFFS -- Write-offs of uncollectible charges on patients who are not financially or edically indigent.

APITAL OUTLAY -- Cost of capital acquisitions funded from plan resources not reported in "Debt Service" low.

INTRACTUAL ADJUSTMENTS -- Contractual adjustments with commercial carriers such as PPOs. HMOs, etc.

ONTRACTUAL INCOME - Income received for contractual physician services to affiliated hospitals and ntractual physician services to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice at U.T. Medical Branch at Galveston.

ACULTY SALARIES -- All faculty salary payments including salary augmentation.

UNGE BENEFITS -- Group insurance premiums (net of premium sharing) paid by the plan, supplemental tirement annuities, parking, and mandatory state benefits (retirement. OASI, WCI, premium sharing, etc.).

ROSS CHARGES -- Posted charges and contract income.

VESTMENT REVENUES - Income earned from investments.

AINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS — All expenditures not classified elsewhere, i.e., utilities, supplies, repairs d maintenance, shipping and postage, etc.

SRDP/DSRDP/PRS — Medical Services Research and Development Plan/Dental Services Research and revelopment Plan/Physicians' Referral Service. These plans are trust funds established by the U.T. Board of Regents at operate under approved bylaws, authorizing the specific types of expenditures that can be made. The penditures in these plans come from the services provided by physicians' services to patients and include outlays supplies, equipment, salaries, and staff benefits.

ET COLLECTIONS -- Cash collections during the period, i.e., gross charges less all deductions.

THER ADDITIONS -- Transfers from non-practice plan funds, which are not budgeted.

THER DEDUCTIONS -- Annual change in Accrued Compensable Absences payable and transfers to non-practice in funds for the establishment of quasi-endowments, to provide funding for new programs outside the plan, to ovide reimbursement for services rendered, and to provide salary and program enhancement supplements.

#### THER DEDUCTIONS FROM GROSS CHARGES:

PROFESSIONAL COURTESY -- Unbilled charges on medical profession patients.

CHANGE IN ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE -- Ending accounts receivable less beginning accounts receivable to arrive at a cash basis "Net Collections" balance.

### **HER EXPENDITURES:**

TRAVEL -- All costs associated with travel.

OFFICIAL FUNCTIONS -- Business related events, which are of documented benefit to the institution. DEBT SERVICE -- Principal and interest paid on any debt, i.e., building construction, renovation, lease-purchase agreements, etc.

HER INCOME - Income not related to patient care.

#### HER SALARIES:

RESIDENT SALARIES -- Salaries paid to resident physicians.
STAFF SALARIES -- All non-faculty salary payments, excluding resident salaries.

HER UNREIMBURSED MEDICAL COSTS -- All other write-offs, i.e., charges for non-preapproved secondary cedures, pathology professional charges, charges for "not medically necessary" procedures, and unbilled charges it discounts for personal courtesy and employees.

In regard to Health Care: Increased patient care volume has resulted in increased expense and revenue. Increased unsponsored care has resulted in the need to fund some of the increased expenses from unappropriated surplus. In regard to Instruction: New regulations in the supervision of Operating Rooms and the reduced number of Residents selecting Anesthesiology as a field of study has necessitated increasing the number of faculty to supervise and staff the operating room. Internal Medicine has been enhanced for the care of Cardiology and GI patients. During Fiscal '98 budget preparation, Medicine School departments provided for faculty compensation increases totaling approximately \$4M. Increases were accomplished by restructuring departmental budgets. This \$4M transfer to the Medical School departments provides funds equivalent to the faculty compensation increases provided.

### SAHS Competitive Academic Scholarship Awards

Competitive Academic Scholarship awards are designed to facilitate the scholastic development of students who are in high academic standing. The benefits of this award are twofold. First, a direct financial award and second, if the recipient is not a resident of Texas, the change in status to resident tuition for that academic school year (September through August). All degree seeking program students in the School of Allied Health Sciences are eligible to compete for these scholarships. The Competitive Academic Scholarships are available and dependent on the availability of funds each year. The award amount is set at a minimum of \$1000 by HB 54.064 as passed by the State Legislature of Texas. If funds are not available, the award will not be offered.

The award is based on documented academic excellence and the criteria for selection therefore include, but are not limited to:

- Grade point average documented by the Director of Admissions from the Student Information System in the Registrar's Office.
- Pattern of Academic Achievement
- Recommendation of the Students Advisory Committee members
- Success in overcoming socioeconomic and educational disadvantages.

#### Interview

The second component for admission is a personal interview. Every applicant will have an interview with at least two members of the admissions committee. One interview will be with a faculty member in the Health Informatics Department and the other will represent the health field of the applicant and/or the applicant's prospective work, e.g., nursing, medicine, telehealth, public health, dentistry. The interview will focus on the applicant's goals and how they can be achieved in the master's program. The applicant will bring to the interview an essay describing the applicant's goals and objectives in health informatics.

Applicants who are presenting course work from universities or colleges outside the United States to meet admission or graduation requirements should see the section on International Applicants on page ? of this catalog for a listing of additional requirements.

Students who wish to transfer must meet all admission requirements. A maximum of six semester credit hours will be accepted toward a graduate degree. However, the student's advisory committee will have the flexibility to determine whether comparable courses have been taken at other institutions. If equivalent courses have been taken in other institutions, the student will not be required to repeat the equivalent course in this program. If the semester credit hours are transferred from another institution, they will not count toward the degree. However, if the student has more than six semester credit hours that parallel courses in this program, only six semester credit hours will be counted toward the degree. Other courses may be taken as equivalent courses but they will not affect the total number of semester credit hours that must be taken for the completion of a degree. The selection of any courses must be with the approval of the student's advisory committee.
