Based upon a request dated April 2, 1997, from Mr. Mike Kelly, Director of Libraries at U. T. San Antonio, an allocation of up to \$32,500 from the PUF Library Special Collection Reserve is recommended.

The University of Texas at San Antonio has an opportunity to purchase the James Morgan Texas Revolution and New Washington Association Collection. This manuscript archive contains 28 documents and letters relating to events in the Texas Revolution and the establishment and history of the New Washington Association. Many of the manuscripts bear James Morgan's handwritten notes. Morgan (1786-1866) was a pioneer Texas settler, merchant, land speculator, and Commander at Galveston during the Texas Revolution.

The collection, which has been in private hands since the nineteenth century, will be offered for sale at public auction on April 5, 1997 by Dorothy Sloan, a well-recognized rare book and manuscript dealer. U. T. San Antonio has consulted with other U. T. libraries and will make the collection available to scholars throughout the System. U. T. San Antonio proposes to bid for the collection and will match dollar-for-dollar the amount used from the Special Collection Reserve. The amount to be allocated from the reserve will depend on the outcome of the bidding process but shall not exceed \$32,500, half of the estimated maximum value of the collection.

As of April 4, 1997, the balance in the PUF Special Collection Reserve is \$324,736.80.
