### **Preface**

Facts & Trends is designed as a basic reference document with admissions, financial aid, enrollment, persistence, graduation and outcomes, degree, semester credit hour, faculty and staff, research, and financial information for the nine academic and six health-related institutions and The University of Texas System as a whole. This document is intended to provide accurate and consistent information for internal use and for the general public, and as a statistical supplement to the U.T. System Accountability & Performance Report. For the most part, data are reported for the most recent five years to identify trends over time.

Data maintained by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board have been used extensively in this publication. However, these data may vary somewhat from information presented and used internally by individual System institutions due to differences in management information systems, data definitions and intended application.

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### **General Analysis – Admissions and Financial Aid**

U. T. System is committed to access and affordability for college bound students in Texas. Admit rates, the percent of students who applied and were admitted, are over 70% at five of the academic institutions. Financial assistance is available to students with need through tuition set asides and guaranteed tuition programs. Since tuition deregulation, students and faculty are increasingly involved in the tuition setting process and are developing flexible tuition plans that meet the needs of their institution and community.

### **Admission Trends**

Overall, U. T. System academic institutions (excluding U. T. Brownsville) received 68,152 applications, admitted 45,021 students and enrolled 22,192 first-time undergraduates in fall 2009. The admit rates ranged from 48.8% at U. T. Dallas to 98.4% at U. T. El Paso, and the ratio of admits to those who actually enrolled ranged from 40.2% at U. T. Permian Basin to 65.0% at U. T. Pan American.

The percent of first-time enrolled students from Texas who were in the top 10% of their high school class at U. T. Austin increased to 80.4% in fall 2009. At other U. T. System institutions, the top 10% represented less than one-third of first-time enrolled students from Texas.

From fall 2005 to fall 2009, average SAT test scores for entering freshmen increased by 10 or more points at two U. T. System academic institutions (U. T. Permian Basin and U. T. San Antonio), while ACT test scores increased at three institutions (U. T. Austin, U. T. Dallas and U.T. San Antonio). U. T. San Antonio had the largest increase in average SAT scores, from 996 to 1033.

During the same time period, average GRE test scores for entering graduate students increased by 10 or more points at three U. T. System academic institutions (U. T. Brownsville, U. T. Pan American, and U. T. Permian Basin). Average GMAT scores also increased at the majority of the institutions. LSAT test scores increased slightly at U. T. Austin.

### **Financial Aid**

Based on actual fee bills in fall 2009, the average total academic cost for resident undergraduates at academic institutions ranged from \$2,764 at U. T. Pan American to \$4,915 at U. T. Dallas. For health institutions, the average total academic cost for resident undergraduates ranged from \$1,574 at M. D. Anderson to \$4,518 at the HSC-San Antonio.


For academic year 2008-09, the U. T. System average total academic cost was \$7,471. Almost 45% of full-time undergraduate students received need-based grant aid. For these students, the net cost (after aid) was \$1,569, a discount of 79%. Applying this amount of aid across all full-time undergraduate students, the average net cost would have been \$4,830, a discount of 35%.


The number and total amount of undergraduate financial aid continues to increase at all U. T. System academic institutions. In 2004-05 undergraduate awards totaled around \$738.9 million. In 2008-09 undergraduate awards totaled over \$1 billion, an increase of 39.3%.

From 2004-05 to 2008-09, as a result of tuition set asides and increasing institutional support,

- The total amount of institutional awards increased from \$92.2 million to \$151.2 million, an increase of 64.0%
- Institutional awards, as a percent of all financial aid increased from 12.5% to 14.7%

### **General Analysis - Enrollment**

In 1999 the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) published the first *Closing the Gaps (CTG)* report and challenged colleges and universities in the state of Texas to increase the number of students participating in higher education. U. T. System met this challenge by increasing both the number and diversity of its student body by the first benchmark in 2005. In order to meet the 2010 target of 203,422 students, total enrollment at U. T. System must increase by approximately 0.6% for the next year.

### **Enrollment Trends**

In fall 2009, total enrollment at U. T. System institutions was 202,240 students, an increase of 16,424 students (8.8%) from fall 2005 and 7,133 students (3.7%) from fall 2008.

- Enrollment at academic institutions was 189,980, an increase of 15,134 students (8.7%) since fall 2005 and 6,754 students (3.7%) since fall 2008.
- Enrollment at health institutions was 12,260, an increase of 1,290 students (11.8%) since fall 2005 and 379 students (3.2%) since fall 2008.

The proportion of undergraduate enrollment at U. T. System academic institutions increased slightly from 78.4% in fall 2005 to 78.9% in fall 2009. At the health institutions, the proportion of graduate and professional students decreased, from 45.1% to 41.8%, and 37.5% to 36.9% respectively.

Overall, gender distributions at U. T. System remained fairly steady, with male enrollment around 47% and female enrollment around 53%. The proportion of women attending the health institutions decreased slightly from 61.0% in fall 2005 to 59.9% in fall 2009.

As the population of Texas became more diverse, ethnic distributions at U. T. System institutions also changed from fall 2005 to fall 2009.

- Systemwide, the percentage of white students decreased slightly from 40.8% to 37.1%.
- At the academic institutions, the proportion of African American students increased from 5.2% to 6.1%, and the Hispanic population increased from 37.8% to 40.3%.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of African American students increased from 6.1% to 6.7%.

### First-time Undergraduates

Enrollment of first-time undergraduates at the U. T. System academic institutions increased from 22,026 in fall 2005 to 24,378 in fall 2009, an increase of 10.7%. In fall 2009, first-time undergraduates are predominantly female (51.5%), full-time (94.9%) and non-white. Between fall 2005 and fall 2009, the proportion of white students decreased from 37.4% to 32.8%, while the proportion of African American students increased from 5.6% to 6.3%, Hispanic students from 42.4% to 46.0% and Asian American students from 10.3% to 12.0%.


### **Transfers**

Transfer enrollment has increased 13.9% since fall 2005 from 12,453 to 14,186 undergraduate transfers entering U. T. System academic institutions in fall 2009. Most of this growth was from fall 2008 to fall 2009, with an increase of 13.1%.

In fall 2009, transfer students are predominantly female (54.5%), transferred from a Texas community college (64.5%), and are ethnically diverse. About 41.2% of transfers are white, 34.9% are Hispanic, 9.2% are African American and 8.1% are Asian American.




U. T. System Total Enrollment Fall 2005 to Fall 2009




Enrollment by Level Academic Institutions, Fall 2009

#### **General Analysis – Persistence, Graduation and Outcomes**

In February 2006, the U. T. System Board of Regents passed a resolution making the improvement of graduation rates one of its highest priorities for the next decade.

The U. T. System Graduation Rate Improvement Initiative called for the nine academic institutions to set graduation rate targets for 2010 and 2015. These targets were approved by the Board of Regents in May 2006. While the impact of this initiative cannot be fully measured until the entering class of fall 2006 graduates, most institutions are already improving their graduation rates.

First-year persistence is an early indicator of student success. Based on a comparison of the entering classes of 2004 and 2008, first-year persistence rates for first-time, full-time degree-seeking undergraduates increased for four institutions:

- U. T. El Paso, from 68% to 70%
- U. T. Pan American, from 67% to 73%
- U. T. Permian Basin, from 57% to 61%
- U. T. Tyler, from 60% to 64%

Based on a comparison of the entering classes of 1997 and 2002, the most current information available, six-year graduation rates from the same institution increased for five institutions. U. T. Pan American has exceeded its 2010 target (35%) with a six year graduation rate of 36% for the fall 2002 cohort.

- U. T. Austin, from 71% to 78%
- U. T. Dallas, from 57% to 59%
- U. T. El Paso, from 26% to 31%
- U. T. Pan American, from 26% to 36%
- U. T. Permian Basin, from 29% to 31%

Graduation rate effectiveness can also be measured by the percentage of students who graduate or persist at any Texas institution of higher education. These rates are especially important for students who enter under the Coordinated Admission Program (CAP) and are expected to continue their studies at another U. T. System institution. The six-year composite graduation and persistence rates from the entering class of fall 1998 to the entering class of fall 2002 increased for these four institutions:


- U. T. Arlington, from 60% to 66%
- U. T. Austin, from 85% to 87%
- U. T. El Paso, from 56% to 58%
- U. T. Pan American, from 54% to 61%

Improving the graduation rates of students who transfer from a community college is also a priority of the U. T. System. A community college initiative has been developed in an effort to streamline and enhance the pipeline from community college to universities. The four-year graduation rates for community college transfer students entering U. T. System academic institutions with 30 or more credit hours in fall 2005 were:

- Over 40% U. T. Arlington (46.0%), U. T. El Paso (48.6%), U. T. Permian Basin (42.7%), and U. T. San Antonio (48.8%)
- Over 50% U. T. Tyler (51.1%)
- Over 60% U. T. Austin (68.6%), U. T. Dallas (61.7%), and U. T. Pan American (62.7%)



#### **General Analysis – Degrees and Certificates Awarded**

System institutions produce over one-third of the degrees and certificates awarded by public universities and almost two thirds of health care degrees and certificates awarded by health-related institutions in Texas.

In 2008-09, U. T. System institutions awarded 41,779 degrees and certificates, an increase of 4,989 degrees or 13.6% over the 2004-05 academic year.

- The number of degrees and certificates awarded at the academic institutions increased from 33,778 in 2004-05 to 38,276 in 2008-09, a 13.3% increase. Degrees awarded at the baccalaureate level grew by 17.6%, master level by 4.6% and the doctoral level by 12.3%.
- At the health institutions, the number of degrees and certificates awarded increased from 3,012 to 3,503, a 16.3% increase over the same time period.

Overall, around 56% of the awards went to women, remaining constant over the past several years. At the health institutions, the growth rate of degrees and certificates awarded to women was 18.1% from 2004-05 to 2008-09, compared to a 13.3% increase for men.

- In 2008-09, women earned 57.5% of baccalaureate degrees at the academic institutions and 70.7% of the certificates and baccalaureate degrees at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, women earned 51.2% of the awards at academic institutions and 60.2% at health institutions.

Systemwide, the proportion of degrees and certificates awarded to African American and Hispanic students increased over time, while the proportion awarded to Asian American students remained constant and white students decreased. In 2008-09, over half of the awards were to non-white and International students with Hispanics receiving almost one-third of the total awards (30.4%).

- At the undergraduate level, non-white and International students earned 56.0% of the degrees at academic institutions and 43.7% of degrees and certificates at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, non-white and International students earned 55.1% of the degrees and certificates at academic institutions and 41.9% of degrees and certificates at health institutions.

With an increased emphasis nationally in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), U. T. System contributed to these degrees at every level. In 2008, 22.2% of baccalaureate, 20.3% of master's and 47.4% of doctoral degrees awarded at U. T. System academic institutions were in a STEM field. Overall, more than one out of five degrees awarded at U. T. System academic institutions was a STEM degree (22.6%), a higher percentage than other public universities in Texas (18.2%) and the nation (18.5%).

U.T. System institutions increased the number of health professional degrees to meet growing demands within the state. The number of nursing degrees awarded at the academic and health institutions increased by 23.3%, from 1,782 in 2004-05 to 2,197 in 2008-09.


- At the academic institutions, baccalaureate degrees in nursing increased from 769 to 1,044 (35.8%) and master's degrees in nursing increased from 160 to 215 (34.4%).
- At the health institutions, baccalaureate degrees in nursing increased from 607 to 615 (1.3%) and master's degrees in nursing increased from 211 to 260 (23.2%).


The health institutions also significantly increased the number of doctoral degrees in Biomedical Sciences (by 55.2%) from 183 in 2004-05 to 284 in 2008-09. The number of professional medical degrees increased from 791 to 819 (3.5%), while the number of professional dental degrees increased by 11.3%, from 150 to 167 during the same period.

AY 2004-05 to 2008-09





U. T. System Degrees and Certificates Awarded by Ethnicity AY 04-05 and 08-09

### General Analysis – Semester Credit Hours (SCH) and Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Students

From fall 2005 to fall 2009, the number of semester credit hours taught at U. T. System academic institutions increased from over 1.9 million to more than 2.0 million, a 7.7% increase\*. Most of this increase occurred at the undergraduate level, growing from almost 1.7 million to just over 1.8 million semester credit hours, or 7.3%.

- The number of master's hours increased by almost 25,000 semester credit hours from 179,152 to 203,999 (13.9%).
- The number of doctoral hours increased from 56,378 to 61,161 (8.5%).
- The number of professional credit hours decreased from 26,973 to 23,917 (-11.3%).


From fall 2005 to fall 2009, the number of faculty increased at a faster rate than enrollment. This resulted in lower student to faculty ratios at five U. T. System academic institutions in fall 2009:


- U. T. Austin (17:1), U. T. Dallas (19:1), U. T. Permian Basin (16:1), U. T. San Antonio (24:1), and U. T. Tyler (16:1).
- U. T. Pan American has the largest student/faculty ratio at 25 to 1, resulting from a shift in faculty member assignments to include research and public service and less direct instruction.

From fall 2005 to fall 2009, the average semester credit hours (SCH) for undergraduate and graduate students increased slightly from 12.1 to 12.2 and 7.6 to 7.7 semester credit hours respectively.



### **General Analysis – Faculty and Staff**

To keep pace with enrollment and research growth, U. T. System institutions employ an increasing number of faculty and staff each year.

From fall 2005 to fall 2009, the number of faculty employed by U. T. System institutions increased by 11.5%, from 16,685 to 18,607.

- At the academic institutions, the number of faculty increased from 9,267 to 10,204, a 10.1% increase, driven primarily by enrollment and research growth.
- At the health institutions, the number of faculty increased from 7,418 to 8,403, or 13.3%. The increase in health faculty was driven by enrollment increases and the expansion of research and clinical care activities at these institutions.

Following a national trend, the proportion of faculty in tenured/tenure-track positions (professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor) is decreasing, from 43.9% in fall 2005 to 41.3% in fall 2009.

Although the majority of faculty at U. T. System are men, the overall proportion of women increased between fall 2005 and fall 2009, from 38.8% to 40.5%.

- At the academic institutions, the proportion of women faculty increased at all levels; from 24.8% to 26.0% for tenured women, from 39.4% to 42.9% for tenure-track women, and from 50.9% to 51.2% for other professional women.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of women faculty also increased at all levels. The proportion of tenured women increased from 23.0% to 26.3%, tenure-track women increased from 32.3% to 34.3%, and other professional women faculty increased from 43.2% to 44.5%.


Faculty employed at both the academic and health institutions were slightly more diverse in fall 2009 than fall 2005.

- Within the academic institutions, the proportion of white faculty declined from 70.9% in 2005 to 68.1% in 2009. The representation of most of the non-white ethnic groups increased during this same time period. The proportion of African American faculty increased slightly from 2.7% to 3.0%, Hispanic from 15.1% to 15.3% and Asian American faculty increased from 7.9% to 9.1%. The percentage of International faculty increased from 2.9% to 3.6% and the percentage of Native American faculty remained about the same at less than 1%.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of white faculty decreased from 67.4% in 2005 to 63.2% in 2009. The Hispanic faculty increased from 7.1% to 7.8%, Asian American faculty from 18.8% to 21.6% and International faculty from 3.3% to 3.6%. The percentage of African American faculty remained the same at 3.1%.


In fall 2009, there were 6,238 administrative staff, 60,355 other non-faculty staff and 21,483 student employees employed by U. T. System institutions. From fall 2005 to fall 2009, administrative and non-faculty staff increased from 61,684 to 66,593, an 8.0% increase. Student employees increased from 18,973 to 21,483, a 13.2% increase.

#### General Analysis - Research

Research is not only a measure of faculty innovation, competitiveness and productivity, but also an economic driver for Texas. U. T. System research expenditures from all sources were \$2.25 billion in FY 2009. Federal research expenditures increased by 19.1%, from just over \$1 billion in FY 2005 to \$1.25 billion in FY 2009.

- Between FY 2005 and FY 2009, total research expenditures increased by almost \$170 million at M. D. Anderson, \$112 million at U. T. Austin and nearly \$60 million or more at U. T. Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas, U. T. Health Science Center–Houston, and U. T. Health Science Center–San Antonio.
- In FY 2009, federal research expenditures accounted for 55.7%, private research expenditures accounted for 20.0% and state expenditures accounted for 16.4% of total U. T. System research expenditures.
- Between FY 2005 and FY 2009, federal research expenditures increased by 27.8% at academic institutions and by 14.7% at health institutions. The largest dollar increases for academic institutions were U. T. Austin, U. T. San Antonio, and U. T. Arlington.


Sponsored revenue is a more comprehensive measure of an institution's overall success in securing funding to support research, public service, training and other activities. In FY 2009, U. T. System institutions received more than \$2.73 billion from all sources, an increase of 35.7% from \$2.01 billion in FY 2005.

- Sponsored revenue received from federal sources accounted for 61.7% of the total while 16.7% came from local sources, 15.2% came from private sources and 6.4% came from state sources.
- Between FY 2005 and FY 2009, sponsored revenue at health institutions increased by 37.0% and increased by 33.8% at academic institutions.


Another measure of research productivity is the number of external research grants held by tenured, tenuretrack and non-tenured faculty and the average number of research dollars per full-time equivalent (FTE) tenured/tenure-track faculty.


- Between FY 2005 and FY 2009, the number of research grants to tenured/tenure-track faculty increased at seven of the nine academic institutions.
- Research expenditures per FTE tenured/tenure-track faculty increased at eight of the nine academic institutions and averaged more than \$100 thousand at U. T. Austin, U. T. Dallas, and U. T. El Paso.
- Research expenditures per FTE tenured/tenure-track faculty increased at every health institution between FY 2005 and FY 2009 and averaged over \$350 thousand at four of the six health institutions in FY 2009.



#### **General Analysis – Finance**

Major revenue sources for U. T. System institutions include state appropriations, government grants and contracts, tuition & fees for the academic institutions, and sales and services of hospitals for the health institutions.

The percent of revenues from state appropriations relative to total revenues declined among the academic institutions but increased among the health institutions.

- In FY 2009, state appropriations accounted for 24.4% of the academic institutions' revenue, down from 25.2% in FY 2005.
- State appropriations accounted for 15.6% of the health institutions' revenue in FY 2009, up from 14.3% in FY 2005.

When adjusted for inflation, state appropriations increased from \$4,800 to \$5,060 per full-time equivalent (FTE) student between FY 2005 and FY 2009 for all academic institutions, but still remained well below the benchmark of \$5,850 per FTE student in FY 2002.

In fall 2009, the largest categories of expenses for all U. T. System institutions are hospitals and clinics, instruction, institutional support and physical plant, and research.


• From FY 2005 to FY 2009, operating expenses for hospitals and clinics increased 25.0%, from \$2.37 billion to \$2.96 billion; instruction increased 23.1%, from \$2.11 billion to \$2.60 billion; institutional support and physical plant expenses increased 94.1%, from \$1.05 billion to \$2.04 billion (some of this increase was a result of a change in post employment benefits reporting requirements in FY 2008); and research expenses increased 35.1%, from \$1.32 billion to \$1.78 billion.


Even with the economic downturn, endowments for the U. T. System increased slightly (3.2%) from over \$13.0 billion to almost \$13.5 billion between FY 2005 and FY 2009, but remained well below a high of \$16.8 billion in FY 2007.

- For the academic institutions, endowments increased from \$6.16 billion to \$6.36 billion from FY 2005 to FY 2009, a 3.3% increase, and by 14.1% from \$2.3 billion to \$2.6 billion for the health institutions.
- Donor support increased for U. T. academic and health institutions from \$488.5 million to \$612.7 million between FY 2005 and FY 2009, but remained below a high of \$801 million in FY 2008.
- Donor support increased at six of the nine academic institutions and total donor support increased from \$200 million in FY 2005 to \$297 million in FY 2009, a 48.1% increase. Donor support increased at three of the six health institutions and total support increased from \$283 million in FY 2005 to \$314 million in FY 2009, a 10.8% increase.
- U. T. System health institutions generate revenue from hospital patient care. Faculty also provide a significant amount of unsponsored charity care in state-owned and affiliated facilities.
- Patient care revenue in FY 2008 was \$3.58 billion, an increase of 62.3% over FY 2004.
- Total charges for unsponsored charity care provided by U. T. System faculty and hospitals were over \$1.4 billion in FY 2008.


• The amount of money expended for administrative costs relative to total expenses decreased from 7.8% to 7.4% for academic institutions and remained at 5.7% at health institutions from FY 2005 to FY 2009.






### Health Institutions Key Revenues, FY 2009




### Health Institutions Key Expenses, FY 2009
