


In Texas (2009):

- Dentists:
 - 86% (9401/10,977) are general dentists
 - 3 dental schools in Texas (UT-Houston, UT-San Antonio, Texas A&M-Baylor)
- Dental Hygienists:
 - 9,820 practicing dental hygienists
 - 23 dental hygiene programs in Texas


Figure 46. Dentists per 100,000 Population, U.S. and Texas, 1981-2009


Figure 50. Dental Hygienists per 100,000 Population, U.S. and Texas, 1981-2009

Dental Hygiene:

2-year program following 0-2 years of college prerequisites

Dentistry:

	Pre-dental	Dental School	Residency
Current U.S. Model	3-4 years	4 years	Optional
Possible 6+1 Model	Combined 6 years		Required 1 year


"Mid-level" Providers:

- Dental Health Aide Therapist (DHAT) Alaska, 2003
- Community Dental Health Coordinator (CDHC) ADA, 2006
- Advanced Dental Hygiene Practitioner (ADHP) ADHA
- Dental Therapist (DT)/Advanced Dental Therapist (ADT) 2009

Oral Health Workforce Education

- Need a plan in collaboration with organized dentistry that addresses access to care
- Consider workforce models that can be supported educationally, and that are effective and sustainable in practice
- Develop funding models for changes to/new educational programs
- Increase enrollment and develop incentives for practitioners to work in underserved areas
