

SmartBook 2024 Facts and Trends: Summary



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- UT Brownsville and UT Pan American campuses closed at the end of AY 2014-15.
- UT Rio Grande Valley began enrolling students in fall 2015.
- Beginning with Smartbook 2022, OIRA reports combined data for UTT and UTHSCT under UTT. Data will also be combined for past years as needed for the calculation of change.
- UT Austin Dell Medical School and UT Rio Grande Valley School of Medicine began enrolling students in fall 2016.





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
Undergraduate Enrollment Profile: Academic Institutions








Undergraduates as a % of Total Enrollment









Average Total Academic Cost represents the sum of all statutory, designated (including differential tuition), and board-authorized tuition, along with mandatory fees (including college and course fees). It is derived from actual fee bills for resident undergraduate students enrolled in 15 semester credit hours in the fall and spring semesters.

Average Net Academic Cost for all full-time students is derived by subtracting the total need-based grant aid from the total academic costs of all students and then dividing by the total number of students.

As an example: Of all full-time resident undergraduates at UT Arlington, 54.2% received at least one dollar in need-based grant and scholarship aid. On average, this aid covered 76.1% of total academic costs for this subgroup.


Retention is calculated as the percentage of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduates who are enrolled in at least 12 semester credit hours (SCH) in the fall semester and are still enrolled at the same initial institution one fall semester later. Retention information may differ from what is reported by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and UT Institutions. The UT System utilizes an internal data warehouse to track student progress over time.

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4-Year Graduation Rates


2019 First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking (FTFTDS) Fall Cohort as of 04-30-2024





STEM + Health Degrees as a Percent of Total Degrees Awarded





When students take out student loans, they are investing in their future. It is important to view loan debt in context with what the future return on investment (ROI) will be. One way to gauge ROI is through earnings outcomes from post-graduation employment (highlights on the following pages).

The average loan debt for UT baccalaureates in the most recent graduating cohort was \$20,486.



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

Faculty Counts by Rank and Status



Academic: Headcount by Tenure Status




Health: Headcount by Tenure Status




Academic: Other Professional Status





All UT Faculty by Race/Ethnicity











An additional metric of patient care: UT physician practices provided care to **2,497,912 unique patients** in FY 2023. The number of unique patients represents the number of unique medical records with at least one active visit within the year. According to Fitch Ratings, the significance is that this measures the number of unique patients accessing—as well as remaining in—the healthcare organization. This is an indicator of access, demand, and market presence.

For FY 2023, **44.7%** of UT System revenues comes from hospital, clinic, and professional fees related to patient care. Hospitals and clinics account for **37.0%** of total expenses.
