### **Executive Summary**

#### **Overall Assessment:**

In our opinion, the FY 2020 **Annual Financial Report** submitted to the Texas Higher **Education Coordinating Board** present fairly, in all material respects, its revenues, expenses, and unexpended fund balance, and all expenses were appropriate in support of the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley's (UTRGV) Knapp Medical Center Family Practice Residency Program. In addition, all other required reports were fairly stated.

**Background**: The Family Practice Residency Program (FPRP) is designed to enhance physician training and provide medical care to the under-served urban and rural areas of Texas. UTRGV operates Knapp Medical Center FPRP program and will apply for funding for the program under the provisions of the Texas Education Code, Chapter 61. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (Coordinating Board) issued the Family Medicine Residency Program Guidelines for Funding Operational and Optional Rotation Programs pursuant to their responsibility for administration. These guidelines include a requirement for submission of an annual financial report (AFR) of FPRP revenues and expenditures along with an internal or independent auditor's opinion.

**Objectives**: To assess whether revenues, expenditures and the unexpended fund balance were reported accurately in the annual financial report.

Scope/Period: Knapp Medical Center Family Practice Residency Program funding and associated expenditures presented within the FPRP annual financial report for FY 2020.

- **Key Observations**: 1). Knapp Medical Center FPRP operating budget \$2.7 million.
  - 2). Resident, Faculty, and support personnel compensation \$2.5 million.
  - 3). Operating expenses \$68,000.
