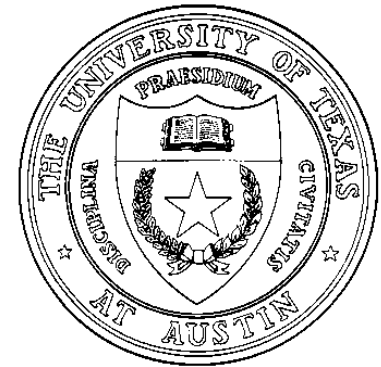

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Texas has the scale, talent and ambition to define the future of health and health care, and The University of Texas at Austin has a singular opportunity to lead. Few institutions can combine the capabilities of a world-class public research university with the freedom to design a new academic health system from the ground up. Anchored by Dell Medical School, UT Dell Medicine is building that integrated system for Texas.

Designed for Texas' growth, rising demand for complex care, and rapid advances in science and technology, UT Dell Medicine is building a de novo academic health system that integrates continuous care, intelligent operations, education, and AI-enabled discovery. Its purpose is to help people remain healthy, resilient, and independent; deliver advanced care when it is needed; and accelerate the translation of discovery into better health. By uniting the strengths of UT Austin with a new clinical enterprise designed for the AI era, UT Dell Medicine will expand access to advanced care, train and retain more physicians and scientists in Texas, strengthen the state's life sciences economy, and establish a replicable model for improving health outcomes across the state.

UT Dell Medicine's de novo design creates a rare opportunity to align facilities, data, care models, research and operations from the outset in a model designed around whole-person health. Connected data and digital tools can extend care across clinics, hospitals and homes; AI can strengthen clinical judgment and accelerate discovery; robotics and automation can expand capacity and reduce administrative burden. By connecting clinical care, education, research, trials and real-world evidence in one learning system, UT Dell Medicine can support earlier intervention, faster translation and more time for health professionals to listen, explain and care.

Building on this momentum, Michael and Susan Dell became UT Austin's first billion-dollar supporters through cumulative giving in 2026, marking a defining investment in the University's future. Their latest commitment is helping establish the UT Dell Campus for Advanced Research and UT Dell Medical Center, as an integrated environment that will unite advanced computing, university research, education, innovation, and clinical care.

Opening in 2030, UT Dell Medical Center will serve as the flagship academic medical center of UT Dell Medicine. It will include a new UT Austin hospital focused on caring for patients with complex and serious conditions, a full-service emergency department, comprehensive outpatient facilities, and integrated cancer care delivered in strategic collaboration with The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center.

The collaboration with UT MD Anderson establishes a new model for cancer care in Central Texas by combining and leveraging UT MD Anderson's internationally recognized expertise in cancer prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and clinical research with UT Austin's strengths in engineering, artificial intelligence, advanced computing, diagnostics, and clinical translation. Together, these complementary capabilities will greatly expand access to world-class cancer care and clinical trials.

The vision for UT Dell Medicine and UT Dell Medical Center builds on a foundation established more than a decade ago. In 2012, The University of Texas System Board of Regents allocated \$25 million in annual funding to establish a medical school at UT Austin, along with \$40 million over eight years for faculty recruitment. Travis County voters approved Proposition 1 that same year, providing \$35 million annually to support the school as part of a broader investment in community health.

Within four years, Dell Medical School welcomed its first class. In 2017, Ascension Seton opened Dell Seton Medical Center at The University of Texas at Austin as the school's primary teaching hospital, and the school's ambulatory clinical practice began seeing patients. Dell Medical School earned full accreditation and graduated its first students in 2020. From that foundation, the school expanded graduate medical education, advanced specialty care, research, and community partnerships across Central Texas, including with Central Health and Ascension Seton.

Dell Medical School's first decade established a strong foundation for the next phase of growth. The school has graduated 321 physicians from its M.D. program and has more than tripled its graduate medical education enterprise since 2015, now sponsoring 50 accredited residency and fellowship programs—18 residencies and 32 fellowships—with approximately 500 residents and fellows training across 64 sites. This investment is strengthening Texas' physician workforce: of more than 600

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residency and fellowship graduates who entered practice immediately after training since 2015, nearly half have remained in Central Texas and more than two-thirds have stayed in Texas. Likewise, nearly half of Dell Medical School's more than 230 M.D. graduates since 2020 have remained in Texas for residency, including approximately 20% who stayed in Austin.

Research has advanced alongside this educational growth. Since 2021, Dell Medical School researchers have secured \$387 million in research awards spanning basic, translational, clinical, and population health research. In 2025 alone, faculty secured or participated in 138 new research awards and collaborations, including more than \$105 million annually in National Institutes of Health funding.

Clinical excellence has advanced just as rapidly. The Texas Center for Pediatric and Congenital Heart Disease, a collaboration between Dell Medical School and Dell Children's Medical Center, rose from unranked to number 10 nationally in pediatric cardiology and heart surgery within three years. Within five years of its founding, the center earned the Society of Thoracic Surgeons' highest rating while reducing mortality below national benchmarks despite increasing surgical complexity. Faculty performed Austin's first pediatric heart transplant in 2020 and, in 2023, the first pediatric partial heart transplant in Texas—only the seventh performed worldwide. Earlier this year, faculty also performed the region's first successful pediatric bone marrow transplantation, expanding access to highly specialized care for Central Texas families.

As a public academic health system, UT Dell Medicine has a responsibility to ensure that technologies shaping care are scientifically sound, clinically accountable, securely governed and worthy of public trust. New tools must be validated in real clinical settings, monitored for safety and effectiveness, and used with clear human oversight. Digitally enabled care must also be designed to reach Texans across urban and rural communities, including those with limited access to care.

Baseline Request

Currently, direct formula funding accounts for 100% of state General Revenue appropriations to UT Dell Medicine.

For the coming 2028-29 biennium, UT Austin Dell Medical School's baseline request meets the institution's General Revenue Limit as determined by the Legislative Budget Board.

Exceptional Item

Maximizing the Federal New Hospital Match

UT Dell Medicine has developed an eight-year plan to maximize the number of new medical residency positions that will eventually receive federal reimbursement for Graduate Medical Education (GME). This will lead to an increase in the number of doctors who practice in Texas. UT Dell Medicine will open a newly constructed 400 bed hospital in 2030 and is requesting exceptional item support of \$23.4 million in the 2028-29 biennium to maximize the subsequent drawdown of federal dollars to support up to 250 additional resident positions. Exceptional item support will allow UT Dell Medicine to maximize the number of medical residents and federal GME support in future years. The intent is that state funding would be sunset in 2035.

Facilities

Research, Education & Innovation Building

If the 90th Legislature considers authorizing Capital Construction Assistance Projects (CCAP), UT Dell Medicine would request \$150 million to construct the Research,

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Education & Innovation Building (REI), a new 127,000 GSF multidisciplinary facility at the UT Dell Campus for Advanced Research (formerly Pickle Research Campus). The REI Building will be the clinical translation hub for UT Dell Medicine—bringing clinicians, scientists, engineers, learners and industry partners together to move ideas from unmet clinical need to design, testing and deployment. Its program will include immersive and simulation-based learning; AI, digital health, visualization and digital-twin environments; human-factors and workflow testing; design, robotics-integration and rapid-prototyping spaces; and flexible areas for industry collaboration, entrepreneurship and venture development. Deliberate connections to the hospital, ambulatory facilities and clinical production capabilities will allow technologies and care models to be co-designed, validated, prepared for clinical use and continuously improved in real-world settings.

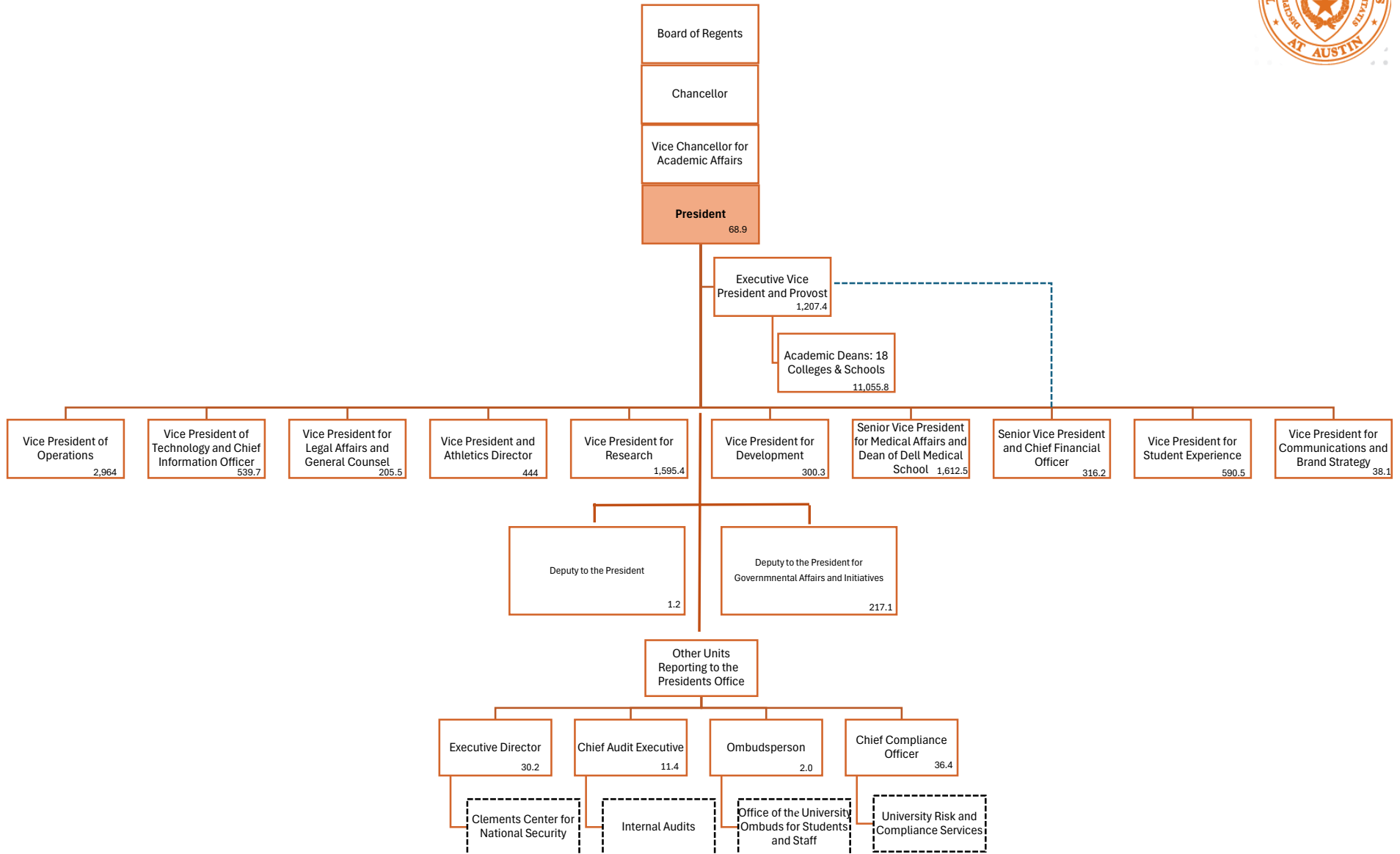
Background Checks

Descriptions of Functional Units

Board of Regents – Governing body for The University of Texas System. It is composed of nine Regents and one Student Regent who are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate.

Chancellor – The Chancellor is the chief executive officer of The University of Texas System. The Chancellor reports to and is responsible to the Board of Regents. The Chancellor heads the System Administration, which is used by the Board to exercise its powers and authorities in the governance of the U. T. System. The Chancellor has direct line responsibility for all aspects of the U. T. System's operations.

Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs – Works regularly with the presidents of the nine academic institutions, ensuring that the missions of the institutions are advanced and appropriate plans and programs are developed and implemented. The responsibilities of the office include oversight of administrative and policy issues related to the general academic institutions and monitoring a wide range of issues related to higher education policies and practices.

Office of the President - The President is the chief executive officer of the University and exercises broad delegated authority for campus administration.

University Risk and Compliance Services – Is responsible for the strategic design and implementation of the Compliance and Ethics Program. It provides education and training for faculty/staff to help develop strategies to avoid compliance and ethics failures. Oversees the security of the university's Information Technology resources and the existence of a safe computing environment to support the university's teaching, research, and public service missions.

Office of Governmental Affairs and Initiatives – Assist University administration in working with local, state and federal governmental entities on matters of higher education policy, as well as implementing certain presidential and strategic initiatives, including OnRamps and the University Interscholastic League.

Office of the Vice President for Communications and Brand Strategy – Manages media relations, researches, writes, designs, shares, and broadcasts content across print and digital platforms to elevate the brand and experience to generate increased investment and support to attract top students, faculty, and staff.

Office of Internal Audits - A service organization dedicated to assisting managers at all levels in the effective discharge of their duties and managing internal controls to successfully achieve their department's as well as the University's goals and objectives.

Clements Center for National Security – A nonpartisan research and policy center that draws on the best insights of diplomatic and military history to train the next generation of national security leaders.

Office of the Vice President for Development - Supports the University's fundraising efforts, working closely with the university's deans and program directors.

Office of the Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer - Oversees a diverse array of financial, business, procurement and payment service units. Through the responsible planning and management of the university's resources, Financial and Administrative Services supports and enhances its core mission to be more effective, efficient, and achieve operational excellence.

Office of the Executive Vice President and Provost – Coordinates the academic mission of the University, manages the academic experience for students, and implements policies and procedures related to faculty and administration.

Office of the Vice President for Student Experience - Facilitates students' discovery of self and the world in which they live while enhancing students' educational experiences through programs and services that support academic success, physical and mental wellness, student development, leadership, and community engagement through an array of programs, spaces, and resources.

Office of the Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel - The chief legal officer and general counsel of the University, serving as the University's representative in state and national discussions on legal and policy issues. Responsibilities of the office include managing and coordinating legal affairs, serving a resource for ethical informed decision-making, educating personnel and providing training, overseeing campus safety.

Office of the Vice President and Director of Athletics - Provides opportunities and support for university student-athletes to achieve academically and compete athletically at the highest level and provide programming and resources that help prepare them with skills for life.

Office of the Vice President for Research - Coordinates research throughout the University and handles applications for research funding, coordinates strategic areas of research focus and tracks guidelines and regulations governing research.

Office of the Vice President of Operations - Oversees a diverse array of financial, business, physical infrastructure, and operational service units whose responsibilities include managing a number of the University's key development and commercialization partnerships with business and industry.

Office of the Vice President of Technology and Chief Information Officer – Responsible for the provision of the core information technology infrastructure and coordination of campus-wide information technology for the University providing foundational IT services effectively and efficiently to support the University's educational, research, and public service mission.

Office of Senior Vice President for Medical Affairs and Dean of Dell Medical School - Provides medical education and health care to improve health outcomes by offering opportunities and support for students to excel academically in the medical field through innovative clinical training and equips them with the skills needed to lead and advance health care in their communities and beyond.

Office of the University Ombuds for Students and Staff – Assists in resolving student/staff problems, concerns, and complaints. Also helps University officials including faculty, and administration by providing information and problem solving.

DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

UT Dell Medicine has developed an eight-year plan to maximize the number of new medical residency positions that will eventually receive federal reimbursement for Graduate Medical Education (GME). This will lead to an increase in the number of doctors who practice in Texas. UT Dell Medicine will open a newly constructed 400 bed hospital in 2030 and is requesting exceptional item support of \$23.4 million in the 2028-29 biennium to maximize the drawdown of federal dollars to support up to 250 additional resident positions. Exceptional item support will allow UT Dell Medicine to maximize the number of medical residents UT can place when the hospital opens its doors and maximize federal GME support in future years. An additional benefit to the state would be that medical residents performing their residencies at the new hospital would be more likely to practice medicine in Texas.

UT Dell Medicine is requesting temporary state funding to bridge the gap prior to federal support. The intent is state funding would be sunset in 2035.

The institution requests \$7.2 million in fiscal year 2028 providing for 40 state supported resident positions at a rate of \$180,000. Fiscal year 2029 would be \$16.2 million providing for 90 state supported resident positions. Recurring costs would continue until fiscal year 2035.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

Texas and the United States face a growing shortage of physicians, particularly in the field of primary care and in rural communities. While medical school enrollments have increased, the total number of GME opportunities needed for medical graduates to become licensed physicians has not kept pace. All medical school graduates must complete a period of graduate medical education to be licensed to practice, and research shows that residents tend to stay and practice in the same state as their residency training.

Congress has capped the number of residencies the federal government supports throughout the United States at 1997 levels. However, the federal government provides a mechanism to support newly established GME slots at hospitals, including newly constructed hospitals. The federal GME cap for a newly established hospital is calculated at

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the conclusion of the hospital's fifth year. Once set, the GME cap for the hospital is permanent. To maximize future GME support from the federal government, the formula encourages a high number of GME slots to be in operation in years three, four, and five of the hospital's creation. Exceptional item support will help UT Dell Medicine recruit faculty to train residents, place more residents when the hospital opens, and maximize federal GME dollars.

DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

UT Dell Medicine's request for Capital Construction Assistance Project (CCAP) support will allow the institution to construct a new multidisciplinary facility, the Research, Education & Innovation Building (REI) at the UT Dell Campus for Advanced Research (formerly Pickle Research Campus). The REI Building will be the clinical translation hub for UT Dell Medicine - bringing clinicians, scientists, engineers, learners, and industry partners together to move ideas from unmet clinical needs to design, testing, and deployment. Its program will include immersive and simulation-based learning; AI, digital health, visualization and digital-twin environments; human-factors and workflow testing; design, robotics-integration and rapid-prototyping spaces; and flexible areas for industry collaboration, entrepreneurship and venture development. Deliberate connections to the hospital, ambulatory facilities and clinical production capabilities will allow technologies and care models to be co-designed, validated, prepared for clinical use and continuously improved in real-world settings.

The project includes design and construction of the new collaborative facility and would total approximately 127,000 gross square feet. REI will advance research and instruction creating a modern, collaborative environment designed for interdisciplinary discovery. Clinicians, data scientists, educators, and community researchers will share innovation spaces that accelerate problem solving and translate ideas to real world impact, including improvement of patient care.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

CCAP authorization will support the long-term needs of UT Dell Medicine. The total estimated cost of the 127,000 GSF facility is \$170 million, of which UT Dell Medicine is requesting \$150 million in CCAP support from the state.

Debt assumptions: \$150,000,000 CCAP with an interest rate of 6% annualized over a twenty year period.

Project Description

UT Dell Medicine's request for CCAP support will allow the institution to construct a new multidisciplinary facility, the Research, Education & Innovation Building at the UT Dell Campus for Advanced Research (formerly Pickle Research Campus). It will serve as multi-use interdisciplinary space providing for immersive lab space and facilities for instruction and technological training. The facility space will serve as a research and innovation hub where UT Dell Medicine and UT Austin faculty and researchers can collaborate on complex projects. REI will also serve as incubator space for startups to develop business models and products for healthcare.

CCAP authorization will support the long-term needs of UT Dell Medicine. The total estimated cost of the 127,000 GSF facility is \$170 million, of which UT Dell Medicine is requesting \$150 million in CCAP support from the state.

UT Dell Medicine has developed an eight-year plan to maximize federal reimbursement for Graduate Medical Education (GME) while increasing the number of Texas doctors. Exceptional item support will allow UT Dell Medicine to maximize the number of medical residents UT can place when the new hospital opens its doors and maximize federal GME support in future years. An additional benefit to the state would be that medical residents performing their residencies at the new hospital would be more likely to practice medicine in Texas.

The institution requests \$7.2 million in fiscal year 2028 providing for 40 state supported resident positions at a rate of \$180,000. Fiscal year 2029 would be \$16.2 million providing for 90 state supported resident positions.

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Texas and the United States face a growing shortage of physicians, particularly in the field of primary care and in rural communities. While medical school enrollments have increased, the total number of GME opportunities needed for medical graduates to become licensed physicians has not kept pace. All medical school graduates must complete a period of graduate medical education to be licensed to practice, and research shows that residents tend to stay and practice in the same state as their residency training.

Congress has capped the number of residencies the federal government supports throughout the United States at 1997 levels. However, the federal government provides a mechanism to support newly established GME slots at hospitals, including newly constructed hospitals. The federal GME cap for a newly established hospital is calculated at the conclusion of the hospital's fifth year. Once set, the GME cap for the hospital is permanent. To maximize future GME support from the federal government, the formula encourages a high number of GME slots to be in operation in years three, four, and five of the hospital's creation. Exceptional item support will help UT Dell Medicine recruit faculty to train residents, place more residents when the hospital opens, and maximize federal GME dollars.
