HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH

AND IMA HOGG FOUNDATION

Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health and Ima Hogg Foundation to the following institutions and agencies:

1. AIDS Foundation Houston, Inc.

Mental Health and Counseling Services for Persons with AIDS - \$25,000

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a first year grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. This program is designed to provide mental health services to persons with AIDS who are clients of the AIDS Foundation Houston, Inc., and their supporters. A secondary goal of the project is to develop psychological support and mental health training programs for volunteers of the Foundation. Curtis Dickson, Executive Director, will be responsible for administration of the project.

2. Because We Care, Inc.

Substance Abuse Prevention Model - \$27,000

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a second-year grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. These funds will be used to continue support of the substance abuse prevention specialist at Dunbar High School in Fort Worth. The particular components of the budget for this persons' position are set by the Fort Worth Independent School District, since the specialist is actually one of their employees. Ms. Johanne R. Kibbie. Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

3. Esperanza, Inc.

Development of a Comprehensive Adolescent Residential Treatment/ Alternative Educational Program - \$1,920

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a grant for the period September 1, 1986 to October 31, 1987. A five-member consulting team, consisting of two Hogg Foundation research assistants, a licensed psychologist, a research/statistician, and a mental health professional will assist the staff of Esperanza, Inc. to refine the overall project design and begin the process necessary to establish an evaluation system for a new mental health services component for residents of La Esperanza Home for Boys and the Villa Bethany Home for Girls in Brownsville. Additional Foundation support will be considered upon receipt of a satisfactory work plan for a well-designed demonstration project capable of being replicated in similar settings. Dr. Juan Sanchez, Executive Director, will be responsible for administration of the project.

#### 4. Houston Child Guidance Center

Family Crisis Intervention Program - \$98,674

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. This grant will continue support of a highly successful crisis intervention program serving adolescents in the Houston area. During the past year, the Family Crisis Intervention Program served over 150 adolescents and their families. The program has also been active in training other Houston agencies in the application of this model to children in crisis. Dr. Jay Tarnow, the Executive Director will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

#### 5. Houston Child Guidance Center

Houston Child Guidance Center Day Treatment Program - \$100,044

The Executive Committee of the Ima Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a third-year grant for the period September 1, 1986 through August 31, 1987. These funds will be used to continue day treatment services to children in the Houston area. The day treatment program at the Houston Child Guidance Center has been very successful, serving 18 adolescents from the Houston area during 1985-86. The Guidance Center has raised over four million dollars for a new facility which will house their day treatment program, and the ground-breaking will commence within the next two months. Dr. Jay Tarnow, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

#### 6. Mental Health Association of Texas

Self-Advocacy Training Program - \$29,851

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period September 1, 1986 through August 31, 1987. These funds will be used to initiate a consumer self-advocacy movement in Texas. The goal of this project is to develop a training manual and to implement the direct training of 200 mental health consumers so that they will have the knowledge and skills to engage in self-advocacy for more effective mental health services in Texas. A training manual will be developed, and at least 200 mental health consumers will be identified and will participate in training, using the manual as a basis. Mrs. Stella C. Mullins, Executive Director, will be responsible for administering the funds.

#### 7. Texas Tech University, Department of Psychology

Battered Wives, Battering Husbands, and the Marital Relationship - \$9,618

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second and final grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. These funds will be used to continue counseling services to battered wives and battering husbands as part of the project entitled "Abusive Families Project: An Outcome Study on a Comprehensive Treatment Program for Battered Wives, Batterers, and the Marital Relationship". Dr Kim Faulkner and Dr. Cal Stoltenberg, Principal Investigators, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

#### 8. U.T. Health Science Center - Houston

Primary Prevention and Mental Health in the Border Region of Texas and Mexico - \$4,683

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a grant for the period September 1, 1986 to December 31, 1986. The establishment of bi-national community studies in noncommunicable disease prevention and mental health promotion is an important first step in developing effective materials and technologies that can be used through such mass media channels as radio or television to reach large numbers of Mexican Americans and Mexican nationals in the U.S.-Mexico border region. Developing a Mexican component in the study of the relationship between primary prevention in mental health and the ongoing work in health education/promotion for prevention of chronic disease and injury already undertaken with support from the National Cancer Institute will make it possible to improve the quality and relevance of Spanish-language materials for mental health promotion. Dr. Alfred L. McAlister, Associate Director and Associate Professor of the Center for Health Promotion Research and Development will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

#### 9. U.T. Austin, Department of Psychology

Phobias and Preparedness - A Schematic Interpretation - \$18,500

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. While there have been some understandable delays in getting started on the project because the principal investigator, Dr. Susan Mineka, has just arrived on campus, a great deal of data collection has been accomplished in the initial phase of the project. A revised budget request is in line with the expectations originally approved in the fall of 1985. RBC D13

#### 10. Austin Groups for the Elderly

Integration of Multipe Services for the Elderly - \$10,000

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a one-year grant for the period October 1, 1986 to September 30, 1987. Austin Groups for the Elderly is a coalition of board and staff members from agencies serving the elderly in Austin. Recently they have negotiated the use of a facility which can become a central care facility for this population. Within this facility, both pragramatic and administrative activities will be carried out. Mr. Jack Martin, Executive Vice-President, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

#### ll. Avondale House

Young Children's Full-Day Program - \$15,000

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a one-time grant for the period November 1, 1986 to October 31, 1987. The grant will be used to begin an extended day program for high-risk disabled children. The new service, will create a therapeutic learning environment for the children both before and after Avondale's regular day program, allowing their parents to maintain employment. A nutritional meal program will also be provided. Ms. Debrah Hall Bossin, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

#### 12. Teenage Parent Council of Austin, Inc.

Stepping Stone - Service for Pregnant Teens/Teenage Parents - \$1,000

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a supplemental grant for the period October 1, 1986 to February 28, 1987. These funds will be used to pay consultation fees for the development of an evaluation component for the Stepping Stone project. This project is designed to enable Austin Independent School District junior and senior high school students who are pregnant, or are parents, to remain in school by assisting them to meet their basic needs through the use of volunteers as advocates and brokers of services. Volunteers will be screened, trained, and matched to one or more youngsters for a one-year period. The teen/advocate pairs will be supported and monitored throughout the term of the project by the program coordinator. Ms. Karen Quebe, Executive Director, will be responsible for administration of the project.

16-19	For students seeking the BS in Pharmacy degree, the option of seeking the degree in a 1:4 sequence is made available. That is, a student may go through one year of prepharmacy studies and four years of professional pharmacy studies. The current 2:3 sequence, i.e., two years of prepharmacy studies and three years of professional pharmacy studies, is retained. The College of Pharmacy admission process also is clarified.
19	The requirement that students purchase professional liability insurance coverage is applied to fourth year students since clinical and pharmacy internship courses are moved from the fifth to the fourth year of study.

Opportunities to explore concepts of self, professional nursing, the nurse-patient relationship within the context of the philosophy and conceptual framework of the UTMB-BSN program are introduced. Two lecture hours average per week per semester. Two semester hours credit.

# RS 3123 Pathophysiology

The focus of this course is the study of basic pathophysiological processes, continuing the development of students' knowledge of the scientific basis for nursing practice. The course explores factors that contribute to altered physiological functioning and also interrelationships among selected pathophysiological processes. Common physiological alterations and pathophysiological processes throughout the life span are included. Three lecture hours average per week per semester. Three semester hours credit.

#### RS 3135 Nursing Process: Introduction

In this course the student is introduced to the nursing process with emphasis on the assessment phase. Basic psychomotor skills necessary for providing nursing care are introduced with practice in a simulated laboratory setting. Emphasis is placed on the principles and theory basis of psychomotor skills. Students are given the opportunity to perform psychomotor skills and apply the steps of the nursing process in a variety of settings. Two lecture and nine laboratory hours average per week per semester. Five semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$5.00.

#### IRS 3144 Health Assessment of Individuals

In this course, the student is introduced to the theoretical basis for physical, psychological, sociological and cultural assessment of individuals throughout the life span. In a supervised laboratory setting, the student has the opportunity to practice the procedural steps necessary to perform assessments. Two lecture and six laboratory hours average per week per semester. Four semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$4.00.

### JRS 3152 Role Development: Teaching/Learning - Family

This course provides students with the opportunity to explore the nurse's role as patient educator. Teaching/learning theories and principles and patient education as an integral part of the nursing process are emphasized. Assessment of and planning for individual/family learning needs are facilitated by knowledge of family development stages, role theory, communication patterns, family power structure, cultural background, and value systems. Factors which affect learning, such as health status, are discussed. Continued learning as a personal professional nursing responsibility is emphasized. Two lecture hours average per week per semester. Two semester hours credit.

#### JRS 3162 Pharmacology

The focus of this course is the study of basic pharmacological concepts. The course continues to expand the scientific basis of nursing practice by exploring general principles of drug action and examining the major actions, intended beneficial effects and common side effects of various categories of drugs. Special implications of drug therapy in infants, children and in the elderly are explored. Two lecture hours average per week per semester. Two semester hours credit.

## JURS 3172 Nursing Therapeutics

This course provides students with the opportunity to acquire psychomotor and drug administration skills necessary for the implementation of the interactive nursing process. In a laboratory setting, the student practices the procedural steps necessary to perform the identified basic skills safely and efficiently. Emphasis is also placed on principles and rationale associated with each procedure and theory base necessary to adapt the procedure as needed according to the client situation. One lecture and three laboratory hours average per week per semester. Two semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$2.00.

#### NURS 3185 Nursing Process: The Older Adult

The focus of this course is implementation of the nursing process to assist older adults who are experiencing disruptions in functional health patterns. Emphasis is given to experiences that clarify the nurse's role in assisting the individual, the family, or both to meet health related goals. Clinical practice is concentrated in acute care settings. Three lecture and six laboratory hours average per week per semester. Five semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$5.00.

# NURS 3195 Nursing Process: The Childbearing Family

This course focuses on the implementation of the nursing process with childbearing families in a variety of settings. Course concepts emphasize the nurse's role in promoting wellness of families experiencing normal and complicated childbearing. Three lecture and six laboratory hours average per week per semester. Five semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$5.00.

## URS 3205 Nursing Process: Families With Children

The focus of this course is on the nurse's role in assisting children and their families experiencing illness and the effects of hospitalization. Concepts of growth and development, play and coping will be integrated into specific course content. The student will utilize health assessment skills within the framework of the nursing process to assist children and their families in achieving health care goals. Utilizing both ambulatory and acute care settings, experiences with children in different age groups with common health problems will be the focus of student clinical learning. Two and a half lecture and seven and a half laboratory hours average per week per semester. Five semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$5.00.

# NURS 4215 Nursing Process: The Adult

This course focuses on the nursing care of adults in the young and middle years and their families who are experiencing health problems. Concepts in this course are presented within the framework of the nursing process and focus on exploration of preventative strategies to promote wellness of adults, families and groups. Students refine the use of the nursing process with emphasis on planning, intervention and evaluation of care of adults, families and groups in a variety of acute care settings. Three lecture and six laboratory hours average per week per semester. Five semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$5.00.

# NURS 4222 Nursing With Groups

This course focuses on the role of the nurse in interaction with clients and groups. It provides students the opportunity to study theories of group interaction and to participate in and analyze the dynamics of a group, and to utilize leadership and management theory to modify group dynamics. The teaching/learning process and the nursing process are applied to assist meeting the health needs of a client group. Course content incorporates concepts of self-care and self-help and the interaction of community self-help groups with health care providers. Selected nursing diagnosis related to physical and mental conditions are studied as they relate to self-help groups with respect to autonomy, advocacy, health policy and health economics. One lecture and three laboratory hours average per week per semester. Two semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$2.00.

#### NURS 4233 Role Development: Scientific Method

This course focuses on use of scientific methods in professional nursing practice including understanding the research process and its contribution to nursing. Opportunity is provided for students to develop skill in critical thinking through identification of nursing care problems, analysis of literature, selection of scientific method, computerized data analysis and interpretation of findings. Emphasis is also on knowledgeable utilization of research findings. Three lecture hours average per week per semester. Three semester hours credit.

### NURS 4244 Nursing Process: Community Health

One lecture and nine laboratory hours average per week per semester. Four semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$4.00.

### NURS 4255 Nursing Process: Mental Health

This course provides students with theoretical and clinical experiences in mental health promotion along the mental continuum and nursing care of persons with acute and chronic psychiatric conditions. Theories, concepts and principles related to nursing intervention are presented. A variety of settings are utilized for clinical application of theoretical content. Three lecture and six laboratory hours average per week per semester. Five semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$5.00.

## NURS 4263 Wellness In The Community

This course provides the student with the opportunity to develop theoretical bases for appraisal/change of risk factors that influence wellness behavior in society. Theories, concepts and principles related to assessment of populations at risk and concepts of program development are presented. A life span approach is utilized to present scientific content on wellness programs. Three lecture hours average per week per semester. Three semester hours credit.

## NURS 4274 Role Development: Leadership/Management

This course provides students the opportunity to refine and expand their knowledge of leadership and management and to apply these principles in a selected nursing care setting. Students apply for a clinical placement in a nursing practice area of interest. Student/faculty contracts specify clinical objectives, experiences and evaluation criteria. One lecture and nine laboratory hours average per week per semester. Four semester hours credit. Lab fee: \$4.00.

1.3312 The Joint Medical Staff/Hospital Quality Assurance Committee shall consist of the Chief of Staff, the Chairman of the Medical Staff Quality Assurance Committee, the man of the Medical Staff Patient Care and Utilization Committee, the Director or Assistant Director of the Medical Staff Quality Assurance Department, a Physician Review Advisor, the Vice President for Hospital Affairs, the Hospital Quality Assurance and Accreditation Coordinator, a Hospital Executive Director, the Director of Medical Records, the Chairperson of the Nursing Advisory Council, and ex-officio members without vote: the Vice President for Medical Professional Affairs, the Chairman of the Institutional Risk Management Committee, and the Medical Malpractice Liaison to the Institution. This catalog is a general information publication only. It is not intended to nor does it contain all regulations that relate to students. The provisions of this catalog do not constitute a contract, express or implied, between any applicant, student or faculty member and The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio or The University of Texas System. The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio reserves the right to withdraw courses at any time, to change fees or tuition, calendar, curriculum, legree requirements, graduation procedures, and any other requirement affecting students. Changes will become effective whenever the proper authorities so determine and will apply to both prospective students and those already enrolled.

Conduct and Discipline

Students are responsible for knowing and observing the University's Regulations Governing Student Conduct and Discipline and the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents of the University of Texas System. In addition to these regulations, standards of professional conduct may be set by each school of the Health Science Genter. Copies of the regulations are available from the Office of Student Services. Whose Director is responsible for the enforcement of regulations and the administration of University discipline.

If the accused does not dispute the facts and waives a hearing, the Director of Student Services or the person acting in the capacity of Dean of Student Affairs assesses a penalty consistent with those outlined in the regulations. If the student desires a hearing, a hearing officer will be selected by the University President to hear evidence, to adjudicate guilt or innocence, to render a written decision with findings of fact, and to impose a penalty if one is due. The decision my be appealed in turn to the President of the Health Science Center. and the Executive Vice Chanceller for Health Affairs of the University System.

Penalties which may be imposed include a warning, probation, a financial penalty when property damage is involved, suspension of rights and privileges deriving in whole or part from the University, suspension of eligibility for office or honor, loss of credit for scholastic work, reduction of the grade in an assigned course, a failing examination grade, a failing grade in the course, suspension from the University, expulsion, withholding of grades, degree, or official transcripts or other penalty recommended imposed by the hearing officer or the Director of Student Services.

#### Residency Glassification

Students are responsible for registering under the proper residency classification. Those who have questions regarding residence may wish to consult the applicable statutory provisions (Title 3, Chapter, 54, Section 54.001 at seq.), Texas Education Code, and the surrent Rules and Regulations of the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System. A student whose legal residency is not clearly established may have a University opinion rendered by requesting a copy of The University of Texas Legal Residency Questionnaire from the Office of the Registrar.

#### Residence Classification

Generally, students who have resided in the state for 12 months immediately preceding the time of enrollment are classified as residents. Such individuals, if dependent, must have resided with their parent(s) or guardian(s) in the state for 12 months immediately preceding enrollment.

A nonresident classification is presumed to be correct as long as the residence of the individual in the state is primarily for the purpose of attending an educational institution.

Applicants whose residence status is not clearly established may request a Residence Questionnaire available from the (Registrar's Office) so that a University opinion may be rendered in advance of the student's initial registration. The University may request that a student claiming Texas residency for tuition purposes complete a Residence Questionnaire and provide substantiating documents to affirm Texas residency. It is the prerogative of each institution to decide the proper residence classification of its students in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System.

Nonresidents who may qualify to pay tuition at the resident rate without regard to the length of residence in Texas include:

- (1) Military personnel assigned to duty in Texas and their spouse and children:
- (2) Faculty employed at least one-half time on a regular monthly basis at a state institution of higher learning and their spouse and children;
- (3) Teaching or research assistants employed at least one-half time in a position which is related to the assistant's degree program under institutional regulations;
- (4) A student who holds a competitive academic scholarship for at least \$200 which was awarded in competition with Texas students by a scholarship committee recognized by the University and the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System.

The filing fee is nonrefundable and is paid at the time of application. It ranges from 635 to 660, depending on the number of schools to which application is made. (See Application Procedure.)

An identification fee of \$5, payable upon initial registration, is for a name tag which must be worn during all the medical program and for a student identification card. Lost items which must be replaced sest \$4 each at a cost of \$3 for a nametag and \$2 for an ID card.

#### Other Expenses

A parking fee of \$12 per year which includes one decal is assessed students who park or drive on campus. Additional decals are provided at no cost for a second or replacement vehicle are \$4 each per year. The fee for motorcycle parking is \$1.50 per year.

Books and equipment, excluding the microscope rental fee, cost approximately \$600 \$900 the first year and \$250 the second year. Each year thereafter, the cost will be at least \$150. These are estimates which vary according to individual choice and market-price fluctuations.

#### Installment Payments

Payment of tuition and rees in installments is an option for students attending state institutions of higher education. The following alternatives for paying tuition and required fees are available:

- (1) Full payment of tuition and fees in advance of the beginning of the semester (academic year); or
- (2) One-half payment of tuition and fees in advance of the beginning of the semester (academic year) and one-half payment prior to the start of the eighth class week or;
- (3) One-fourth payment of tuition and fees in advance of the beginning of the semester (academic year) and separate one-fourth payments prior to the fourth, eighth and twelfth class weeks.

A fee of \$15 will be assessed for handling of installment payments of tuition and fees and a \$10 fee will be assessed for each late payment. Late payments will result, at the University's option, in one or more of the following actions: (1) the student's being barred from class until payment is made; (b) withholding of credit if payment is not made by the end of the semester, with the University adjusting records to reflect the student's failure to have properly enrolled for that semester (academic year); or (c) bar against readmission and withholding of grades, degree, and official transcript.

CSBL 10910. Gross Anatomy and Embryology

Department of Cellular & Structural Biology 9 semester hours

Lectures, conferences, and laboratory work cover normal human
developmental and gross anatomy. Lectures on early embryonic
development and implantation are presented at the beginning of the
sewres. Lectures on the development of the systems are correlated
with the presentation and dissection of the gross structure of the
adult. Groups of four students dissect a cadaver under supervision of
the departmental staff. Prosections, demonstration specimens, X-rays,
films, and other learning aids supplement the laboratory work.
Applied anatomy and malformations are discussed by clinical
specialists.

CSBL 10505. Microscopic Anatomy

Department of Cellular & Structural Biology 5 semester hours Current concepts in cell biology and human histology and basic science aspects of genetics are covered by means of a series of lectures and laboratory sessions. Basic information on the structure and function of cells and tissues is presented in the lectures; this is followed by staff-supervised laboratory sessions emphasizing the recognition of cells and the fundamental tissues. Each student is provided with a box of microscopic slides of human tissues. The laboratory sessions are accompanied by microscopic slide demonstrations and/or television tapes of tissues under study. Supplemental study material, such as films, television tapes, and transparent photomicrographs, are available upon request through the Office of Educational Resources and the Learning Resources Teaching

and Learning Center. The general purpose of this course is to acquaint the student with basic cytology and histology of normal human tissues, thereby providing a firm foundation of knowledge for the understanding of normal and disease processes.

CSBL 10162. Medical Genetics

1 semester hour Department of Cellular & Structural Biology Principles of medical genetics, including patterns of inheritance of diseases in human populations; inborn errors of metabolism; and abnormalities in human chromosomes revealed by karyotyping. Prenatal diagnosis and genetic counceling will be emphasized. The applicability of comatic cell genetics and DNA technology to study genetic disease will be reviewed, and somatic cell genetics will be studied. The applicability of biochemical analysis and DNA technology to study genetic diseases will be emphasized for the purpose of diagnosis, prenatal diagnosis and genetic counseling. Genetic disease case histories will be studied in a genetic counseling laboratory experience.

PHYL 10905.

Department of Physiology

9 semester hours This course starts with the subject area of cell physiology with emphasis on transport processes, excitable tissues, and muscle function. It then involves proceeds with a sequential coverage of the following areas: cardiovascular system, renal physiology and body fluids; the digestive system; respiratory physiology; the endocrine system; reproductive physiology; metabolic regulation. It is primarily a lecture course with periodic conferences and laboratory experiences to solve specific problems.

PSYC 10305. Psychosocial Dimensions of Health Care Department of Psychiatry

3 semester hours The course deals with the role of sociocultural, psychological, and economic factors in the various aspects of health care--clinical, preventive, and public medicine. The instruction covers human growth and development over the life cycle, with attention to stage-specific and adaptive tasks and problems. The doctor-patient relationship is examined as a fundamental element of the treatment process. Students undertake individual and family interviews to gain skill and knowledge of medically relevant sociocultural and psychological materials. Approximately one-half the time is spent in the classroom covering the basic substantive and conceptual content, including those of public health and preventive medicine. The latter half is devoted to agency clinics where students work with families. In addition to the Department of Psychiatry faculty, which includes psychiatrists, psychologists, and sociologists, and anthropologists, members of the departments of Family Medicine, Pediatrics, and Physical Internal Medicine participate in the course.

#### MICR 105705.

Department of Microbiology

57 semester hours The medical microbiology course is designed to provide a foundation in pathogenic microbiology and to prepare the medical student for subsequent offerings in the pathophysiology pathology, epidemiology, and prevention of infectious diseases. The scope of the course includes an introduction to the biology of microorganisms; the concepts of host-parasite interrelationships for pathogenic bacteria, viruses, fungi, siekettsiae, shlamydia, protesea, and belminths parasites; and the fundamentals of immunology as related to infectious diseases.

FAPR 10205. Physical Diagnosis Department of Family Practice

2 semester hours

The fundamentals of history-taking and physical examination are presented, with emphasis on the normal findings in the healthy person. The course includes lectures, demonstrations, and practical exercises and patient examinations under the close supervision of instructors.

ORTO 10101. Emergency Medicine

Department of Orthopaedics

1 semester hour In this course emphasis is placed on the pre-hospital care of the sick and injured patient; that is, the clearing and maintenance of an adequate airway, control of hemorrhage and shock, fracture splinting, and the emergency care and bandaging of wounds. During approximately one-half of the course, advance-trained Emergency Medical Technicians demonstrate the necessary practical skills. These skills include cardiopulmonary resuscitation, splinting, bandaging, and extrication. A standard textbook on emergency medical care is utilized to insure that all medical and surgical emergencies will be covered. Students are instructed by representatives from the clinical disciplines of the

PATH 21205. Pathology Department of Pathology

12 semester hours

This course provides an introduction to the fundamentals of human disease followed by a review of the principal diseases of major organ systems. Teaching methods include lectures, laboratory exercises, small group discussions, and a variety of selected self-instructional materials. The interpretation of gross and microscopic tissues specimens is stressed as a means of illustrating the application of principles to actual clinical problems. Participation in a specified number of autopoics is a requirement, and faculty consultation is available for individuals or groups. The course includes a review of medical biestatistics. Faculty consultation is available for individuals or groups. The course also includes a review of medical biostatistics and an introduction to clinical pathology (laboratory medicine).

Medical School. CPR certification is a part of this course.

MEDI 20255. Epidemiology Department of Medicine

2 semester hours

An intensive introduction to the concepts and methods of epidemiology is provided as the basis of preventive medicine. Fundamental concepts, including incidence, prevalence, other rates, types of epidemiological studies, and host-agent environment relationships are presented initially. relating to epidemiologic and clinical measurements, to relative risk, and to study design, including prevalence studies, case-control studies, incidence studies, and clinical trials are presented initially. This is followed by a series of discussions of the application of these fundamental epidemiologic concepts to the prevention of representative diseases -- diseases such as acute infections and food-borne outbreaks and chronic diseases, particularly cardiovascular diseases and cancer. Glassie studies from the medical literature, such as Snow on Cholera, are presented because of their value in illustrating basis spidemiologis principles. The primary objective is that students have the opportunity to develop skills in the critical interpretation of data regarding disease frequency, conditions causing or contributing to disease incidence, and effectiveness of preventive or therapeutic regimens. To this end, frequent small group sessions are used to discuss outbreaks and critical appraisal of the medical literature. The role of epidemiology as the basic science of preventive medicine is emphasized.

PSYC 20305. Introduction to Clinical Psychiatry Department of Psychiatry

3 semester hours

previding The primary goal of this course in dynamic and descriptive psychiatry is to provide opportunities for students to acquire psychiatric knowledge, skills, and attitudes that are applicable to the general practice of medicine. is the primary goal of this source in dynamic and descriptive psychiatry. Classroom work involves a study of basic concepts, the psychopathological entities, the major mental disorders, psychiatric interviewing, organization of a clinical report, and the application of psychotherapeutic prinicples in the care of all patients. In addition to the presentation of clinical material in the classroom, each student has eight two-hour periods of small group clinical teaching with two faculty members wherein a variety of patients are studied psychiatrically persons with mental disorders are interviewed and discussed.

SURG 20810. Introduction to Clinical Surgery

Department of Surgery 8 semester hours About 100 classroom hours and 50 hours of laboratory and ward work are devoted to a review of general surgical principles and surgical pathophysiology of the various organ systems. The fields of general and thoracic surgery are covered, as well as urology, neurosurgery, and orthopaedics. The laboratory component of the course takes place in the experimental surgical facility, where the students operate on dogs and on non-living models and are thus introduced to sterile technique, anesthesia, resuscitation, and the performance of minor procedures. The laboratory also serves to study animal models of disease in areas such as hemorrhagic and endetexin shock, bewel obstruction, pneumothorax, pericardian tamponade and coronary occlusion. The third component of the course includes physical examination sessions designed to offer students practice in eye, ear, nose, and throat and abdominal examinations.

PEDI 20210. Introduction to Pediatric Medicine Department of Pediatrics

2 semester hours

The source emphasizes the importance of basis science pathophysiologic concepts in the analysis and understanding of clinical medicine.

Intrautorine growth, nutrition, shild development, congenital heart disease, emotional and cognitive development, immunologic development, and endocrine by dysfunctions are examples of topics included. This course reviews growth and development of infants and children. It emphasizes the differences and similarities between children and adults. It presents the ways growth and development affect the pathophysiologic and clinical expressions of diseases in infancy and childhood and how these diseases affect growth and development. The course utilizes the workshop approach to teaching these principles, with small groups of 15 students reviewing educational material on the basis of clinical cases.

PHAR 20605. Medical Pharmacology

Department of Pharmacology

6 semester hours

The course consists of an introduction to the basic principles of pharmacokinetics with emphasis on the application of pharmacodynamics to therapeutics, followed by coverage of the pharmacology of each class of drugs. The objectives for the course include providing opportunities for students to acquire a fundamental knowledge of the actions and appropriate uses of the drugs and an appropriation for the importance of the pharmacological basis of therapeutics. The course is taught by the faculty of the Department of Pharmacology with the

assistance of clinical faculty in the Clinical Correlation Genferences. This course is designed to provide the student with a fundamental knowledge of the actions and therapeutic uses of drugs. The topics covered will include basic principles of drug action, pharmacokinetics, autonomic and cardiovascular pharmacology, chemotherapy, neuropharmacology, toxicology, endocrine pharmacology and special topics such as GI and respiratory tract pharmacology, prescription writing, etc.

PHMR 20590. Patient Rehabilitation Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation .5 semester hours Students will have an opportunity to learn to predict how illness may interfere with the ability of a patient to carry out functional activities in his or her environment and to appreciate the steps necessary to prevent these predictable functions complications or to restore them lost function in patients with multiple disabling conditions.

MEDI 31605. Medicine Clerkship\* Department of Medicine

14 weeks 16 semester hours

7 weeks

The student clerk spends 10.5 weeks assigned to the General Medicine Services of the Medical Center Hospital, the Veterans Hospital, Brooke Army Medical Center, and Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center, and 3.5 weeks each assigned to the Neurology Services of these institutions. Bedside clinical teaching is emphasized by asking the student to perform patient evaluations, to contribute to the care of selected Medicine patients, and to participate in the clinical rounds of the Medicine or Neurology services. During this clerkship the student receives extensive intensive instruction from the Internal Medicine Housestaff and the Faculty Attending Staff. In addition, the student is expected to undertake independent patient-oriented reading and to systematically review pertinent information learned during the pre-clinical years. Finally, students attend a series of clinical conferences including Medical Grand Rounds, Medical Mortality Conferences, Clinical Subspeciality Conferences, a weekly senference with the department ehairman, and organized courses in electrocardiography, infestious diseases nutrition, and dermatology.

#### Page 65

PEDI 30805. Pediatric Clerkship\* Department of Pediatrics 8 semester hours

The pediatric clerkship is intended to introduce the student to the infant, child, and adolescent as a developing and growing organism. The effects of genetic, environmental, and social factors are emphasized. Students spend one-half of the time on one of the inpatient teaching services and the other half in the Newborn Nursery. The effects of developmental, psychosocial, and environmental factors on the child's growth and health status are emphasized. Students spend variable lengths of time on inpatient teaching services, in the newborn nursery, and in various general and subspecialty outpatient

Students participate along with house staff in care of patients and are responsible for taking a history and doing a complete physical examination. studies and a course of management. Students also participate in house staff and attending, chief resident and ground rounds, as well as departmental conferences. Students also participate in house staff and attending rounds, grand rounds, and departmental conferences as well as student lecture and discussion groups.

PSYC 30805. Psychiatry Clerkship\* Department of Psychiatry

/ weeks 8 semester hours

The psychiatric clinical clerkship serves to familiarize the student with the personality traits, illnesses, and emotional disturbances that affect health and productivity. It is an opportunity for the student to develop and strengthen clinical skills in interviewing patients, formulating treatment plans, and carrying out treatment. The clerkship is arranged so the student may select the assignment area on the basis of particular interest, i.e., an inpatient/outpatient setting. The student's role in the clerkship is arranged to allow experience in the working relationship between patient and "physician" in the treatment process. Seminars have been developed to allow the student an in-depth appreciation of the various aspects of the psychiatric states and emotional problems which affect the general practice of medicine. The student-staff ratio allows for small groups of students to meet with faculty, thereby enhancing teaching learning.

The clerkship is an opportunity for the students to look at their personal feelings and values and understand how they influence patient care, to learn how to deal with psychiatric disease, and to become more comfortable in dealing with the personalities of patients with organic disease.
