





Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health and Ima Hogg Foundation to the following institutions and agencies:

1. Houston Achievement Place, Houston, Texas

Independent Apartment Living Program - \$9,000

The Ima Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a third and final grant for the period January 1, 1985 to December 31, 1985. This grant will be used to continue support of the Independent Apartment Living Program and the Family Outreach and Training Program. The first program provides a transitional living experience for children graduating from the Houston Achievement Place group homes, while the outreach program develops support families which serve as an aftercare complement. Mr. Paul Gilford, the Executive Director is responsible for the administration of the program.

2. Mental Health and Mental Retardation Authority of Harris County

After-School Enrichment Program - \$25,000

The Ima Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a third and final grant for the period November 1, 1984 to October 31, 1985. This innovative project provides a variety of therapeutic services for 15 latency-aged children at risk for serious emotional disturbance later in life. The success of the program is documented by the efforts the Authority has taken to secure future support for the services and its plans to replicate the program in other parts of the city. Mr. Eugene Williams, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the program.

3. The Women's Shelter of the Corpus Christi Area, Inc.
 Corpus Christi, Texas

Second House:

Housing Project for Battered Women and Their Children - \$15,000

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a second-year grant for the period October 1, 1984 to September 30, 1985. The Hogg Foundation funds will be used for staffing the Second House, a pilot project addressing the special needs of families victimized by violence in the home. This project has demonstrated a need for a wide array of services, as evidenced by the ever-increasing number of calls for assistance received by the shelter from individuals experiencing neglect, abuse, and family discord. In the second year of support, the program will seek to expand the network of services for the children of battered women and to strengthen and evaluate the therapeutic services available at the Second House, an integral part of The Women's Shelter. Mrs. Sue W. Dyke will be responsible for the administration of the project.

4. Kenwood Community Council, Inc.
 Parent Education Early Intervention Program
 San Antonio, Texas

Training of Day Care Center Staff for Care of Handicapped
 Children Aged Birth through Three - \$16,500

The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second-year grant in support of a project to train day care center staff to care for the handicapped child (0-3 years of age) in the south and west sides of San Antonio. The period of the grant is from November 1, 1984 to October 31, 1985. Since

1981, the program has been serving families with developmentally disabled children from birth to three years of age. An interdisciplinary team of professionals provides a wide variety of educational, therapeutic and counseling services to over one hundred children and their families. Ms. Sonya Masinter will be responsible for the administration of the project.

5. Mental Health Association in Greater San Antonio
San Antonio, Texas Suicide Prevention Symposium - \$254.

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant to provide partial support for travel expenses related to a regional conference to be held November 30, 1984 in San Antonio, Texas. The conference is being co-sponsored by the Mental Health Association in Greater San Antonio, the United Way of San Antonio, and the Continuing Education Department of U. T. Health Science Center - San Antonio. The overall goal of the symposium is to enhance the skills of mental health-related professionals (such as physicians, law enforcement and criminal justice personnel, and others) in dealing with suicidal people and their families. Dr. Wayne L. Dorris, President, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

6. Department of Psychology, Texas Tech University, Lubbock, Texas
Bulimia: A Comparison of Treatment Procedures - \$18,839

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a one-year grant for the period January 1, 1985 to December 31, 1985. This grant will be used to conduct a study of the effectiveness of several modalities of treatment for bulimia, which, like anorexia, is a problem of growing concern. The study will use 30 subjects referred to the Psychology Clinic and meeting the diagnostic criteria for bulimia. Each will undergo a 14-week treatment program which will include three treatment modalities believed to be effective with bulimia. The results of the experiment will have important implications for counseling centers dealing with this problem. Dr. June Chiodo will be responsible for the administration of the project.

7. Department of Sociology, The University of Texas at Austin
Research on Prison Violence - \$18,001

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period January 1, 1985 through August 31, 1985. Extensive secondary analyses will be conducted on existing data sources compiled by the Texas Department of Corrections in order to examine various theoretical frameworks on the forms and causes of prison violence. Because of recent judicial decisions and comprehensive legislative changes passed by the 68th legislature, new alternatives to incarceration are being discussed at every level of government. Moreover, the Texas Department of Corrections is under court order to remedy overcrowded conditions. This research study will examine closely the overcrowding-tension-aggression model, explore prison disciplinary problems, and describe the link between population density and prison violence. Dr. Eklund-Olson, as principal investigator, will collaborate with staff of the Texas Department of Corrections and the Attorney General's Office.
