The following docket for The University of Texas at Austin is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on March 14, 1969.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

CONTRACTS and GRANTS (Federal):

- 1. Modification AFOSR-65-0806C to Grant AF-AFOSR-806-65, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides a new listing of permanent equipment. The research entitled "Crystal Chemistry of the Systems Rare Earth Groups V and VI Elements" continues under the direction of Dr. Hugo Steinfink, Professor of Chemical Engineering.
- 2. Amendment AFOSR-67-1050A to Grant AF-AFOSR-1050-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, adds the sum of \$149,746 to the grant funds and extends the period of the grant through November 30, 1969. The research on organic chemical physics continues under the direction of Dr. Michael J. S. Dewar, Professor of Chemistry, Robert A. Welch Chair in Chemistry.
- 3. Modification No. P008 to Contract AF 30(602)-4246, by which the Department of the Air Force, Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss Air Force Base, New York, extends the period of the contract through December 15, 1968. The research in Russian-English machine translation on syntactic level continues in the Linguistics Research Center under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Director, and Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and of Linguistics.
- 4. Modification A/N #6(69-833) to Contract AF 33(615)-1971, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, incorporates in the contract DD Form 254 dated December 13, 1968, in lieu of the Form DD 254 presently incorporated therein. The research was conducted in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

- 5. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 33(615)-5116, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, authorizes transfer of title of certain Government equipment to the University. The studies on line-broadening were conducted by Dr. Melvin Oakes, Associate Professor of Physics.
- 6. Modification No. P006 to Contract F33657-67-C-0370, by which the Department of the Air Force, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, reviews and leaves unchanged DD Form 254 (Security Classification) dated October 18, 1967, of the contract. The research was conducted in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 7. Modification P-004, Change Order to Contract F 33615-68-C-1619, by which the Department of the Air Force, AFSC, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, adds the sum of \$25,000 to the contract funds, bringing the total funding to \$358,313 through September 30, 1969. The research continues at the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 8. Contract DADA17-69-C-9067, by which the Department of the Army, U.S. Army Medical Research and Development Command, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$47,940 for support of research entitled "New Anti-malarials Based on Inhibitors of Oxidative Metabolism of Plasmodia." The contract is effective for the period January 1, 1969, through December 31, 1969, and the research will be conducted by Dr. Karl Folkers, Professor of Medicinal Chemistry.
- 9. Modification A 005 to Contract DA-29-040-AMC-1259(E), by which the Department of the Army, Purchasing and Contracting Division, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, sets the final negotiated overhead rate of 32.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966. The optical jamming system study was conducted under the direction of Dr. A. H. LaGrone, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 10. Modification A 008 to Contract DA-29-040-AMC-1010(E), by which the Department of the Army, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, sets the overhead rate of 13.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through July 12, 1966. The research was conducted at the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 11. Modification A 016 to Contract DA 23-072-ORD-1564, by which the Department of the Army, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, sets a final negotiated overhead rate of 32.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966, and a provisional overhead rate of 32.3% of salaries and wages beginning September 1, 1966. The theoretical studies of meteorological sensors, and analysis and interpretation of rocket data were conducted under the direction of Kenneth H. Jehn, Associate Professor
- 12. Modification P-003 to Contract NOw 66-0378-d, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ordnance Systems Command, Washington, D. C., increases the total estimated cost by \$484,000 and extends the period of the contract through October 14, 1969. The research continues in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 13. Modification P 001 to Contract N 00019-67-C-0359, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Air Systems Command, Washington, D. C., extends the contract through October 31, 1968, without additional funds. The research continues in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

- Modification P 001 to Contract N00024-68-C-1183, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D.C., makes certain changes in Contract Data Requirements List of the contract. The research continues in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 15. Modification P002 to Contract N00024-68-C-1241, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract until all funds shall have been expended. The research continues at the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 16. Contract N 00024-69-C-1129, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$722,500 for support of psychophysical investigations and classification experiments and analyses. The contract is effective for the period December 16, 1968 through December 31, 1969, and the research will be conducted in the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 17. Contract N 00024-69-C-1159, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$340,000 for the period December 20, 1968, through December 30, 1969, for continuing the program in sonar studies begun under contract NObsr-93126 and continued under contract N00024-68-C-1183. \$225,000 of the estimated cost is currently funded for research being conducted at Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 18. Modification No.20 to Contract N60921-7233, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, funds an additional \$4,000 to Task I under the contract. The research continues at the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 19. Modification No. 14, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(11-1)-490, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, adds the sum of \$40,000 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through September 30, 1969. The research on transport of radionuclides in water (model river and ecological system) continues under the direction of Dr. Earnest F. Gloyna, Professor of Civil Engineering.
- 20. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-3458, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, adds the sum of \$80,000 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through September 30, 1969. The research entitled "Anomalous Diffusion and Thermalization of Turbulent Plasmas," continues in the Center for Plasma Physics and Thermonuclear Research under the direction of Dr. William E. Drummond, Professor of Physics.
- 21. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-3647, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, adds the sum of \$50,000 to the contract funds. The agreement is effective for the period April 15, 1968, through January 14, 1969. The research on oblique collisionless shock waves in plasma continues under the direction of Dr. William E. Drummond, Professor of Physics.

- 22. Contract No. 14-10-7:931-35, by which the Department of the Interior, National Park Service, Globe, Arizona, provides \$5,000 for support of archeological investigations within river basins (Amistad Reservoir on the Rio Grande, Texas). The contract is effective for the period beginning January 13, 1969, with the final report due June 30, 1970. The program will be under the direction of Dr. W. W. Newcomb, Professor of Anthropology, and Director, Texas Memorial Museum.
- 23. Modification No. 2 to Grant 91-46-68-24, by which the Department of Labor, Manpower Administration, Office of Manpower Policy, Evaluation and Research, Washington, D. C., changes the closing date of the grant to read "March 31, 1969." The program entitled "Training Programs of Private Industry in the Greater Cleveland Area" continues under the direction of Dr. Carey C. Thompson, Professor of Economics.
- 24. Modification No. 5 to Contract NAS 5-10387, by which the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Goddard Space Flight Center, Greenbelt, Maryland, extends the period of the contract through April 10, 1971, with \$150,000 in additional funds. Only \$50,000 of this amount is currently funded for the period through June 30, 1969. The boresight and alignment tests of radio telescope installation continue in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Director and Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 25. Award Letter dated December 20, 1968, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., allocates 38 new National Defense Education Act Graduate Fellowships for the academic year 1969-70. The program will be administered under the direction of Dr. William T. Belt, Assistant Dean of the Graduate School.
- Grant OEG-0-9-530719-1801-725, by which the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$10,000 in support of an educational media institute. The grant is effective for the period December 6, 1968, through June 15, 1969, and will be under the direction of Dr. Ernest Tiemann, Associate Professor of Educational Psychology.
- 27. The research will be under the direction of Dr. H. Eldon Sutton, Professor of Zoology and Education.

The program will be under the direction of Dr. David J. Cox, Associate Professor of Chemistry.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council. I recommend approval.

The Faculty Council on January 11, 1969, approved by the circularization procedure changes in the catalogue of the College of Fine Arts (D&P 4356).

This is a revision of Plan IIIC for students majoring in Drama Education, increasing the total number of semester hours required for the degree from 126 to 136, and more closely relating the degree in Drama Education to those given in the Art and Music Departments, and also meeting the changes made by the Texas Education Agency in degree requirements for prospective teachers.

The revised plan requires an additional nine hours of drama courses to give the student a foundation for professional work as well as preparing him for teaching. It also requires that a student take at least six hours of free electives outside of the drama field, thus broadening the scope of his education.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part One of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS MEDICAL BRANCH CATALOGUE FOR 1969-70, REVISION OF GRADUATE COURSES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY .-- On recommendation of the Chairman of the Committee on Graduate Studies, the Chairman of Physiology, and the Associate Dean of Graduate Studies, I recommend approval of the adoption of the following changes and/or additions to the course offerings in the Department of Physiology for inclusion in the 1969-70 Catalogue:

- l. Change course number 6901 as follows:
 - "6901. Medical Physiology and Biophysics .-- A laboratory, lecture, and conference course stressing the fundamentals of mammalian physiology, with consideration of the underlying principles of physics and chemistry. Prerequisite: Anatomy 6403, Biochemistry 6801, and Physiology 6901 can be taken concomitantly. Lecture, five hours a week; conference, two hours a week; laboratory four hours a week (Term 3) and seven hours a week (Term 4); second semester. Nine semester hours. \$8 laboratory fee."
- 2. Change course number 6203 as follows:
 - "6203. Endocrinology .-- A lecture course presented jointly by the staffs of Anatomy and Physiology. Primarily designed to cover recent advances in the field and to explore selected aspects in depth. Prerequisite: Physiology 6901 or equivalent. Lecture, four hours a week. Two semester hours.'
- 3. Change course number 6205 as follows:

Three semester hours."
