
Mrs. Blumberg and Gentlemen:

CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS (State)

Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC (80-81) 0614 between The University of Texas System, University Lands-Surface Interests Office, Midland, Texas, and Angelo State University, San Angelo, Texas, in which Angelo State University through its Department of Agriculture and Dr. Robert E. Steger will conduct research on "Bitterweed and Sheep Behavior" in order to provide techniques and information specifically applicable to the management of University Lands in West Texas. The total amount of the contract will not exceed \$7,000 for the contract period, September 15, 1979 through August 31, 1980.

- . Grant Agreement between the Governor's Budget and Planning Office and The University of Texas System Administration - System Personnel Office in which the Budget and Planning Office will provide \$3,753 to the System Personnel Office for the period March 15, 1980 through August 15, 1980 for the project of developing "class specifications" for use by component institutions of The University of Texas System in writing and developing institutional job descriptions.
- . Grant Agreement between the Governor's Budget and Planning Office and The University of Texas System - Institute of Higher Education Management in which the Budget and Planning Office will provide continued support to the Institute of Higher Education Management in the amount of \$26,020 for the period May 1, 1980 through February 28, 1981.

CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS (Other)

- . Letter of Agreement between the American Council on Education and the Institute of Higher Education Management of The University of Texas System to conduct jointly a seminar on "Faculty Policy Issues for the Eighties," to be held in Austin, Texas on April 10 and 11, 1980. Income and expenditures for this seminar are estimated at approximately \$7,000.
- 2. Letter of Agreement between the American Council on Education and the Institute of Higher Education Management of The University of Texas System to conduct jointly two departmental leadership workshops, to be held in Texas at a mutually agreeable location. The first workshop will be held July 13-18, 1980 and the second in November or December, 1980. Income and expenditures for these workshops are estimated at approximately \$27,923.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH ALLOCATIONS FOR PROGRAM SUPPORT

allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health Trustee Approved Program Support account to the following institutions and agencies:

Texas Foundations Research Center, Austin, Texas - \$950.00

1. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant in the amount of \$950.00 for the period February 1, 1980 to October 1, 1980, to the Texas Foundations Research Center. These funds will be used to partially underwrite the publication of the fourth edition of the Directory of Texas Foundations. This directory will contain data on more than 1,200 Texas foundations, and will make a significant contribution to the efficiency of fund raising in the states. Moreover, the project is consistent with the Hogg Foundation's support of the Regional Foundation Library.

Mr. William T. Hooper, Jr., President, will submit both a fiscal accounting statement and a copy of the Directory at the close of the grant period. Dr. Charles M. Bonjean will serve as liaison person for the project.

Dallas Council on Alcoholism, Dallas, Texas - \$12,000.00

2. The Hogg Foundation recommends approval of an initial one-year grant in the amount of \$12,000.00 for the period February 1, 1980 to January 31, 1981, to the Dallas Council on Alcoholism. This grant is for support of the Council's Family Education Program and will combine with a grant from the Meadows Foundation to meet the grantee support match requirements for funding from the Texas Commission on Alcoholism. Specifically, \$9,720 will go to provide part of the salary for an intake and referral worker. An additional \$1,900 will be directed toward evaluation of the program, with the balance of funds marked for travel and training fees for the staff.

The Family Education Program is a new service of the Dallas Council on Alcoholism, and has active cooperating agreements with Al-Anon, psychologists in private practice, attorneys, clergymen, and marriage and family counselors. The program seeks to strengthen families in which one member is an alcohol abuser. It emphasizes the role of each family member in the treatment and intervention processes.

Mrs. Sara Whitely, the Executive Director, is responsible for the administration of the program. She will also submit an interim progress report in August, 1980 and a first year's fiscal accounting and evaluation summary not later than February 28, 1981. Drs. Wayne Holtzman and Terrence Tutchings will serve as Hogg Foundation liaisons to the project.

Texas Medical Association, Austin, Texas - \$15,936.00

3. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends approval of a grant in the amount of \$15,936.00 to the Texas Medical Association for the period of March 1, 1980 through September 30, 1980.

The Texas Medical Association has proposed to undertake a study of physicians in the State of Texas. This study is an outgrowth of related activities of the Association's Special Committee on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse. The Texas Medical Association has shown a growing concern in recent years with the need to reform and educate physicians and student physicians in relation to prescribing habits. Some 150 doctor members of the Association will volunteer their time to take part in an interview to determine their prescribing habits for patients presenting symptoms of mental illness.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

An immediate goal of the Association is to educate its members by disseminating the findings of this study. Furthermore, in-service programs are proposed to educate practicing physicians regarding the prescription of minor tranquilizers and related matters. The information will be shared with medical schools and nursing schools as well.

Mr. C. Lincoln Williston, Executive Director of the Texas Medical Association, will be responsible for the administration and fiscal accounting of the project. Drs. Wayne H. Holtzman and Terrence R. Tutchings will serve as Hogg Foundation liaisons to the project.

Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital, Corpus Christi, Texas - \$18,692.00

4. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a one-year grant in the amount of \$18,692.00 for the period beginning March, 1980 through February, 1981, to the Children's Heart Program of South Texas, Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital.

The focus of this epidemiological research project, to be conducted by the Children's Heart Program of South Texas, will be the incidence of functional chest pain among children and the examination of the familial and psychological factors contributing to the occurrence of this condition. This research study is divided into two parts: (a) the prospective study which will use experimental and control groups to examine family characteristics and the relationship between family structural variables, psychological variables and sociological variables to account for the incidence of functional chest pain in a pediatric cardiology service; and (b) a retrospective study which will examine the pediatric records at the Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital for children between the ages of 5 and 18 years.

Mr. George Phillips, psychologist, will be responsible for the administration and supervision of the research project. The Hogg Foundation funds will be used to support part-time staff which will include the principal investigator (Mr. Phillips), research technician, medical anthropologist, and six days of research consultation. Other expenses include supplies, travel and per diem expenses for the part-time staff and consultants.

The Children's Heart Program will submit both a progress and final report as well as a fiscal accounting at the end of the grant period. Mr. Reymundo Rodriguez is the liaison from the Hogg Foundation.

Samaritan Center, Nacogdoches, Texas - \$10,000.00

5. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a one-year grant in the amount of \$10,000.00 for the period April 1, 1980 to April 1, 1981, to the Samaritan Center. The center is a non-profit, non-denominational agency which offers a team approach (minister, psychotherapist, and/or physician) to help clients with stress-related problems. The service is provided in a church atmosphere and clients unable to pay for services are asked to volunteer time to a worthwhile community project. The Foundation grant will be used for part of the salaries of professional personnel thus, indirectly, permitting the Center to offer services on a reduced fee or no fee basis to some clients.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

Dr. James R. Laurie, Samaritan Center Director, will be responsible for administration of the project, and will submit both a fiscal accounting and narrative evaluation of the project. Dr. Charles M. Bonjean and Ms. Adrian R. Fowler will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation.

Center for the Development of Non-Formal Education, Austin, Texas - \$21,398.00

6. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of the first year of a three-year grant to the Center for the Development of Non-Formal Education in the amount of \$21,398.00. The first-year grant period will extend from January 1 through August 31, 1980.

This grant will aid in supporting the bilingual infant development and parent education program involving low-income Mexican-American families in Austin, Texas. The first-year grant has its central focus on the enhancement of parenting skills, improvement of parent-child relationships, promotion of physical and mental health, and research and evaluation of various intervention models with bilingual audiovisual materials in human development. The Hogg Foundation funds will support part-time administrative, clerical, research and media development/curriculum staff; equipment and supplies; data processing service; and postage and communication expenses.

The program will carry out an innovative program of home visits and small group sessions covering infant stimulation in cognitive and affective areas of development. Complementing the above will be components on infant health and nutrition, as well as demonstration methods combining a bilingual educational curricula, materials and media to motivate and involve parents and other caregivers in guiding the development of their infants.

Dr. Emily Vargas-Adams will be responsible for the administration and supervision of the project, and will submit both a fiscal accounting and narrative evaluation of the project. Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman and Mr. Reymundo Rodriguez will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation.

Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers, Austin, Texas - \$31,384.00

7. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a grant in the amount of \$31,384.00 for the period extending from March, 1980, through December, 1980, to the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers. A subsequent grant will be contingent upon a satisfactory review of the first grant period performance and goal attainment.

The grant will aid in supporting the identification, coordination and dissemination of parenting education information in Texas. An important part of this project is the assessment of parental needs and attitudes and the development of demonstration seminars tailored to meet the special needs of traditional and non-traditional families as identified in the attitudinal needs assessment survey.

The Hogg Foundation funds will be utilized to support administrative and research staff, which includes a project director, parent education coordinator/researcher, secretary, research assistant, and two researchers.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

Mr. Alvis Bentley, Executive Director, and Ms. Coyleen Bohu Project Director, will be responsible for the administration, coordination and supervision of this project. The Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers will submit a fiscal accounting, and a progress and final report prior to the end of the first grant period. Mr. Reymundo Rodriguez and Dr. Terrence R. Tutchings will serve as liaison persons for this project.

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio  
Department of Psychiatry

Biological Research Program - \$25,000.00

8. After careful review of the third-year progress report submitted by Dr. Robert Leon, the Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a fourth-year grant in the amount of \$25,000.00 to the Department of Psychiatry at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio.

It is the understanding of the Foundation that this grant will be used primarily for the support of Dr. Rogness' work in the study of monoamine oxidase and dopamine hydroxylase in psychiatrically hospitalized children and adolescents; Dr. Miller's studies of glucose metabolism; Dr. Augustin de la Pena's research on the computerized analysis and psychophysiology of sleep; Dr. Bowden's study of enzyme transport systems; and Dr. Shulman's research into the development of radio-receptor assay for antipsychotic drugs.

A report on the currently proposed work is to be submitted by Dr. Leon in anticipation of a fifth year of support from the Mary Yates Memorial Fund. Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman will continue to serve as the liaison person for this project.

The University of Houston, Department of Psychology

Depression in Children: A Developmental High Risk Approach - \$23,000.00

9. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a one-year grant in the amount of \$23,000.00 for the period March 1, 1980 to February 28, 1981, to the University of Houston.

It is the Foundation's understanding that these funds will be used to conduct a three-part research project investigating childhood depression. The first stage of the study will examine the correlates of depression in normal children. The second stage will be aimed at determining the correlates of depression in clinically depressed children and their mothers. The third part will examine the correlates of depression in children of depressed and non-depressed mothers. By using these three types of subject, normal, depressed and high risk, the investigators hope to sharpen the definition of childhood depression as a distinct symptom syndrome.

Dr. Lynn P. Rehm and Dr. Alexander W. Siegel will be responsible for the administration of the project, and will submit both a fiscal accounting and narrative evaluation of the project. Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman and Dr. Ralph E. Culler will serve as liaison persons for the Foundation.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)The University of Houston at Clear Lake CityThe Relationship Between Family System Dynamics and Parenting Behavior:  
A Study of Abusing Families - \$4,339.00

10. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a final grant of \$4,339.00 to the University of Houston at Clear Lake City for the period February 1, 1980 to June 1, 1981.

This is the third and final year of funding for a study of family system dynamics and parenting behavior. The funds are being used for a study of factors related to child abuse and development of educational and therapeutic techniques aimed at the primary and secondary prevention of such abuse. These funds, with \$2,437 remaining from the 1979 grant, will be used primarily for research and secretarial assistance.

Dr. Linda Bell is responsible for the administration of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and narrative evaluation of the project. Dr. Charles M. Bonjean will continue to serve as liaison person for the Hogg Foundation.

The University of Texas at AustinDepartment of Educational PsychologyPerceived Parental Responsibilities in Dual Working Families - \$9,710

11. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-year grant in the amount of \$9,710 for the period March 1, 1980, through February 28, 1981, to the Department of Educational Psychology at The University of Texas at Austin. These funds will be used to investigate working parents' perceptions regarding the degree to which various parental role functions are viewed as their primary responsibility and the degree to which they would like community institutions and agencies to assume primary responsibility. The research findings will have implications for both effective parenting and family service agencies.

Dr. Lucia A. Gilbert will be responsible for administering the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period in February, 1981.

Dr. Charles M. Bonjean and Dr. Terrence Tutchings will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation. (RBC # H-21)

- . Contract by and between the Behavioral Research Services, Inc., Valencia, Pennsylvania, and The University of Texas at Arlington in support of scoring of psychometric instruments. The total amount of this contract shall not exceed \$5,000.00, and is to begin December 4, 1979 and shall terminate August 31, 1981.
- . Contract by and between the Associates Financial Services Company, Inc. and The University of Texas at Arlington in support of analysis of a questionnaire pertaining to an industrial survey. The total amount of this contract shall not exceed \$300.00, and is to begin January 1, 1980 and shall terminate April 30, 1980.
