OTHER FISCAL ITEMS

Appropriation for East Campus Library Complex for Additional Site Work,
 Casework, and Other Modifications at U. T. Austin

As the construction nears completion and partial occupancy has been taken of the East Campus Library Complex at The University of Texas at Austin, the need has become apparent for additional site work, casework within the buildings, and certain other building modifications. Measures necessary to take care of these needs have been recommended by the Project Architects and approved by President ad interim Jordan and System Administration. To cover the cost thereof including Architect's Rees and miscellaneous expenses, it is recommended by President ad interim Jordan and System Administration that an appropriation of \$595,000,00 be made to this project from Interest on Permanent University Fund Sond Proceeds.

2. Appropriation for Claudia Taylor Johnson Park Complex

Additional building modifications, including fire detection and alarm systems and finishing certain spaces, and additional furniture and fixtures for Claudia Taylor Johnson Hall and O'Henry Hall that were not included in the original appropriation for this project are needed. Since the contractor is approaching completion in early summer, change orders need to be initiated before he has completed his final work. To cover the costs which also include architects fees and miscellaneous expenses, it is requested by System Administration that an appropriation of \$303,000.00 be made to this project from Interest on Permanent University Fund Bond Proceeds.

3. Lapse of Funds in Education Building Accounts at U. 10 Page

In the General Contract for the Education Building at The University of Texas at El Paso, there was an allowance of \$30,000.00 for Metal Plaques and a Mural. \$2,500.00 of this allowance was used for the Metal Plaques, but the balance of \$27,500.00 to cover the cost of the mural was not used, since there was a delay in selecting an artist and determining the type of mural to be used. In order to close out the general contract on this project, a change order was issued deducting this \$27,500.00 from the contract price and it is now desired to place this amount in an account to be used later for the Mural. Also, in order to use the balances remaining in several contract accounts for whatever purposes are still needed to complete this project, it is recommended that the following transfers be made:

CONTRACTS and GRANTS (Federal):

- 1. Modification A/N #7, Administrative Notice to Contract AF 33(615)-1971, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, removes \$13,483.53 considered to be excess funds under the physically completed contract. The research was conducted in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 2. Modification AFOSR-67-1257C to Grant AF-AFOSR-1257-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, transfers title to all permanent equipment at a cost of less than \$1,000 to the grantee at the time of acquisition. The grant is under the direction of Dr. Frederik W. DeWette, Professor of Physics.

- Modification P00002 to Contract F33657-70-C-0491, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, updates to December 4, 1970, the Form 254 dated October 13, 1969. Work under the contract was performed by Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 7. Contract F33615-71-C-1203, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, provides \$265,000 for support of research entitled, "Exploratory Development of Wide Bandwidth Propagation at 15 and 35 GHz." The contract is effective for the period February 1, 1971 through January 31, 1974, and the \$85,000 currently funded is for the period through July 31, 1971. The research will be performed in Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 8. Contract F 33615-71-C-1350, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patters on Air Force Base, Ohio, provides \$309,587 for support of research entitled, "Advanced Avionics Analysis and Evaluation Program." The contract is effective for the period March 1, 1971 through March 30, 1972, and of the total estimated cost there is currently funded \$200,000 for a period through November 30, 1971. The program will be conducted in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 9. Contract DAHC-60-71-C-0053, by which the Department of the Army, U.S. Army Safeguard System Evaluation Agency, Huntsville, Alabama, provides \$59,248 for support of research entitled, "Development of an Automated Software Evaluation System." The contract is effective for the period February 26, 1971, through February 25, 1973, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. C. V. Ramamoorthy, Professor of Computer Sciences and of Electrical Engineering.
- 10. Modification No. 1 to Contract N00014-67-A-0126-0011, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., adds \$30,000 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through February 29, 1972. The research entitled, "The Continuation of the Study of the Detection of Magnetic Anomalies by Means of the Pertubation in the Natural Geomagnetic Field," continues under the direction of Dr. H. W. Smith, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 11. Contract N00014-70-A-0166-0003, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides \$100,000 for support of research entitled, "Doppler Sonar." The contract is effective for the period December 1, 1970 through November 30, 1971, and the work will be performed by Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- Modification P00010, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00017-66-C-0378, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ordnance Systems Command, Washington, D. C., increases the per diem travel rate from \$18 to \$25 per day, and changes the rate accordingly on a quarter-day basis. The research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 14. Modification P00002, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N00017-67-C-5515, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ordnance Systems Command, Washington, D. C., transfers title to research equipment comprising the Wind Tunnel Facility from the Government to The University of Texas at Austin, effective January 22, 1971.
- Modification P00001 to Contract N00024-71-C-1016, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., provides \$49,500 to complete the funding of \$99,500 total estimated cost of the contract. The research continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 17. Contract N00024-71-C-1185, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., provides \$805,000 for support of research entitled, "Computer Aided Classification and Environmental Support of Classification Tests." The contract is effective January 28, 1971 through August 31, 1971, and the research will be conducted in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 18. Modification P004, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N62306-70-C-0361, by which the Department of the Navy, U.S. Naval Oceanographic Office, Washington, D. C., changes the destination or place of delivery section of the contract without otherwise altering it. The program to develop interface specifications for the bottom topography survey system continues in Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

Assignment of Patent Rights, by which the University transfers to the Department of the Navy all right, title and interest in and to an invention entitled, "General Purpose Comparator (Navy Case No. 51,498: Agency Docket No. D-4669). The invention resulted from research under Department of the Navy Contract N60921-7233, directed by Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director, Applied Research Laboratories, The University of Texas at Austin.

AEC Loan AT(38-1)-657, by which the United States Atomic Energy Commission, Savannah River Operations Office, Aiken, South Carolina, provides one Source 252_{Cf} for loan to The University of Texas at Austin. The loan material and training program in the Nuclear Reactor Laboratory will be under the direction of Dr. E. Linn Draper, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the University Council and/or General Faculty. I recommend approval:

- 1. The University Council at its meeting on February 15, 1971, approved the revised changes in the wording of catalogue requirements for the B. S. degree in Speech and the B. S. degree in Radio-Television-Film, School of Communication (D&P 4716). This legislation had been approved by the circularization procedure, but Dean Danielson submitted some editorial changes at the February 15 meeting. The purpose of the legislation is not to permit more than twelve semester hours of Speech or Radio-Television-Film accepted by transfer to count toward the degree in the respective areas. Students who have had more than twelve hours in another institution may obtain credit at UT Austin by passing advanced standing examinations. The departments feel strongly that any student should have at least eighteen hours at UT Austin either in courses taken here or by advanced standing.
- The University Council on February 4, 1971, approved by the circularization procedure, a change in the catalogue of the College of Arts and Sciences under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Geology" in regard to English requirements (D&P 4715). Instead of three specified required courses, plus three additional semester hours of English, this legislation indicates only two required courses with six additional semester hours. The purpose is to provide a wider range of English courses to choose from because of the broader scope of employment opportunities for geology majors. This does not change the total number of hours for this requirement.

1971 SUMMER SESSION BUDGET

The following Summer Session Budget is allocated within funds set aside in the original operating budget previously approved by the Board for this purpose. The Summer Session includes generally two terms -- the First Term running June 1 through July 15, and the Second Term from July 16 through August 31. Certain courses are scheduled on an overlapping nine weeks basis (June 1 through July 31), and others on a full twelve weeks basis (June 1 through August 31). Salary calculations are pro rata based on the nine-month academic rate with a cut-off for this purpose at a ceiling of \$18,000, the same as used in previous years. No salary rate increases are permitted in the Summer Session Budget.

INTERAGENCY CONTRACTS

I recommend ratification of the following interagency contracts and contract amendments:

- 1. Interagency Contract No. IAC (70-71)-542 beginning February 10, 1971, and terminating August 31, 1971, whereby The University of Texas at E1 Paso agrees to furnish the necessary educational facilities required by employees of the Texas Highway Department while attending the University. The cost of tuition and fees for two employees under this contract shall not exceed \$200.00. The contract was approved by the State Board of Control on February 10, 1971.
- 2. Amendment No. 1 to Interagency Contract No. IAC (70-71)-402 between The University of Texas at El Paso and the Office of the Governor, Division of Planning Coordination, whereby the dollar amount of the contract is increased from \$42,000.00 to \$46,800.00. The amendment became effective on February 4, 1971, the date approved by the State Board of Control.

NON-GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS AND GRANTS

The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations; personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals; and travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

Grant AH-461 by which The Robert A. Welch Foundation, Houston, Texas, provides the sum of \$36,000 for support of research entitled "Photochemical Heterolytic Substitution and Displacement Reactions in Benzenoid Hydrocarbons and Their Derivatives." The grant is effective for the period May 1, 1971, through April 30, 1974, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. Cyril Parkanyi, Associate Professor of Chemistry.

GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS AND GRANTS

The following contracts, grants, and amendments have been negotiated and have been signed by me upon the recommendations of the directors of the projects. I recommend your approval and ratification of the signatures.

- 1. Contract No. V349V-1997, dated January 29, 1971, whereby the Adjudication Officer, V. A. Regional Office, 1400 N. Valley Mills Drive, Waco, Texas 76710, awards \$3.75 per hour for private individual tutoring to veteran students during the period January 31, 1971 through January 30, 1972.
- 2. Contract No. F41615-71-M-6080, dated February 5, 1971, whereby the Contracting Officer, Base Procurement Office, Lackland, AFB, Texas 78236, awards a total of \$25.50 for tuition for two Air Force students to be continued in courses of instruction during the period February 1, 1971 through May 28, 1971.
- 3. Modification No. A011, dated February 5, 1971, to Contract No. DAADO7-67-C-0245, whereby the Contracting Officer, Purchasing and Contracting Division, STEWS-LG-PA, Building 1830, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico 88002, increases the amount of the contract by \$5,000 and a moderate increase in effort, and adds five items of government-furnished property for use on contract work. 
