Mrs. Devall and Gentlemen:

The dockets prepared by the component institutions listed below are herewith submitted, with my recommendation for approval, for consideration at the meeting of the Board of Regents in Austin on April 26, 1958:

GIFT FROM EX-STUDENTS ASSOCIATION: I submit the following, without recommendation, for your action:

The Ex-Students' Association has given Stock Certificate Number 476 representing one share of stock in the Westwood Country Club Building Corporation of Austin, Texas, issued in the name of the President of The University of Texas, and a check for \$250.00 in favor of the University.

The stock certificate represents a membership in the Westwood Country Club for the President of The University of Texas, whoever he may be, and is presented to the Board of Regents by The Ex-Students' Association for the use of the President of the University in connection with his official duties.

The check for \$250.00 is presented as a gift by The Ex-Students' Association with the understanding that these funds will be used as follows:

- 1. To pay the monthly dues or charges of the Westwood Country Club required to maintain a continuing and active membership.
- 2. To pay expenses incurred either at the Westwood Country Club or elsewhere by the President of the University, or by someone designated to act in his behalf, for official entertainment.
- 3. To reimburse the President for expenses incurred in his official capacity for which he cannot be reimbursed from state funds.



It is the intention of The Ex-Students' Association that these funds should be disbursed by the University for the purposes stated above as approved by the President of The University of Texas, and that such disbursements should be made either upon the submission of bills from those furnishing services or supplies, or upon the submission by the President of statements of expenses incurred by him for the purposes stated. It is anticipated that an additional gift of cash will be made by The Ex-Students' Association later this year to supplement this gift.


