The two additional State Legal Holidays not observed by the University will be added to the statutory allowance to provide a total of twelve working days annual leave for 1966-67. Annual amployees with fifteen or more years of employment with the State shall be entitled to three additional days of vacation.

#### Transfers Between Appropriations of Arlington State College

1. There is a balance at present in the account for Utilities for Auditorium, Theater, Health Center, and Student Center Addition at Arlington State College, and this project has now been completed. # Transfers Between Appropriations of Arlington State College (continued)



In connection with the construction of the Auditorium and Theater Parking Lots at Arlington State College, it is believed desirable to perform some additional work in adjoining parking lots around the Auditorium in order to make the lots more usable. The Contractor for the Auditorium and Theater Parking Lots has agreed to perform this additional work for the sum of \$806.00. There is only \$587.00 remaining in the Contingency Allowance for this contract; however, in the Contingency Allowance for the Health Center Parking Lot, there is a balance of \$320.00 remaining, and this contract has been completed and paid in full. It is, therefore, recommended that the sum of \$219.00 be transferred from Account No. 85-9773-0120 - Arlington State College - Parking Lots for Auditorium, Theater, and Health Center - Contract - Health Center - SRO Asphalt, Inc., to Account No. 85-9773-0121 - Arlington State College - Parking Lots for Auditorium, Theater, and Health Center - Contract - Auditorium and Theater - R.W. Gibbins, Inc., with authorization to E.D. Walker to issue a change order to the Auditorium and Theater Parking Lot Contract in the amount of \$806.00 for additional work desired.

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in El Pasoon May 27 and 28, 1966.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants, and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

#### GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

- 1. Contract AF19(628)-5908, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronics System Division, Bedford, Massachusetts, provides \$30,000.00 for support of research entitled "An Investigation of Millimeter Wavelength Remote Sensing of Atmospheric Temperatures." The contract is effective for the period April 1. 1966 through March 31, 1967 with the final report due June 30, 1967, and the research will be performed in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of C.W. Tolbert.
- 2. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 29(601)-5837, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Special Weapons Center, Kirtland Air Force Base. New Mexico, adds the sum of \$493.84 to the contract funds and establishes a final overhead rate of 38.7% of salaries and wages for the period March 1, 1963 through August 31, 1964. Of the sum of \$134,992.00, \$54,037.00 is made available for the period March 26, 1966 through February 28, 1967. The research will be performed under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann. Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.
- 8. Modification No. Field 1, Change Order to Contract AF 33(600)-29502, by which the Defense Contract Administration Services Office, San Antonio, transfers responsibility for administering the contract to the Office of Naval Research, Resident Representative, The University of Texas, Austin. Contract AF 33(600)-29502 is a facilities contract which holds custody of various Air Force Equipment on the campus at Austin.
- 9. Contract AF 40(609)-1167, by which the Department of the Air Force. Arnold Engineering Development Center, Arnold Air Force Station, Tennessee, provides \$17,943.00 for support of research entitled "Analytical Study of Condensation of Steam in Subsonic Streams of Rocket Exhaust Gas." The contract is effective for the period April 1, 1966 through June 30, 1967, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. J. Parker Lamb, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering.

- 1. Basic Agreement No. DA 41-133 AIV-5863 with the Department of the Army, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which provides for training of military personnel of the Department of the Army, Fort Sam Houston, Texas, during the period April, 1966 to April, 1967.
- 2. Interagency Cooperation Contract IAC (66-67)-195, with the Texas State Department of Public Welfare, signed by Dean W. P. Keeton of the School of Law, whereby the University through its Law Library will furnish facilities and essential materials required for the training of persons in specific skills in library work, the Department under Title V of the Economic Opportunity Act to provide financial assistance in the form of trainee—grants. The terms of the contract are for an indefinite period beginning March 15, 1966, and will continue until the project termination date issued by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, or such date as either the University or the Texas State Department may determine that the need for such training program no longer exists.
- 3. Interagency Contract No. IAC (66-67)-200 with the Texas Education Agency, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, whereby the University through its Hogg Foundation for Mental Health will cooperate with the Agency in the development and execution of a seminar dealing with the problems of educating children from culturally deprived environments. The contract will be in force from March 24, 1966 to October 31, 1966, inclusive, and the total budget is \$35,720, this amount to be paid by the Agency to the University.
- 4. Interagency Cooperative Contract No. IAC (66-67)-201 with the Texas State Department of Health, signed by Business Manager James H. The contract will be in force from April 5, 1966 through August 31, 1966, and the total amount to be paid to the Department of Health for such services is not to exceed \$15,000.

Memorandum of Agreement signed by the executive officers of the universities in the southern region and the Southern Regional Education Board which provides for a Regional Committee on Statistics. This memorandum constitutes a review of the agreement in force from the period 1961-65 and provides for a revision to be in effect for a new five year period, January 1, 1966 to December 31, 1970. The ultimate objective of the Southern Regional Education Board's continuing program of summer sessions in statistics has been and continues to be to meet both regional and national needs for increased competence in the important field of statistics. The Regional Graduate Summer Session supplements the advanced educational opportunities not generally available through individual graduate schools of higher institutions in the South during the summer months for advanced work in statistics.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council. I recommend approval.

1. The Faculty Council on March 11, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposed changes in wording for requirements for the Bachelor of Journalism Degree (D&P 3661-62).

These changes are minor and serve to bring the journalism degree requirements more in line with the typical Bachelor of Arts degree. The primary change is to rearrange the requirements into the customary major-minor arrangement. In the past, 18 semester hours of English have been required with 6 of those hours at the advanced level, thus automatically requiring a first minor in English. This legislation proposes 12 semester hours of English and gives the student greater freedom of choice in selecting the area which will actually become the first minor. While English can continue to be the minor with the required 12 hours plus 6 advanced, with the approval of the student's advisor, 12 hours, including at least 6 advanced, may be selected in another subject for a minor.

2. The General Faculty on March 14, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal to change classification of courses from "freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior" to "lower division" and "upper division" (G. F. M. 8730).

The separation of courses into five levels (including graduate) by use of class standing is unrealistic in terms of actual prerequisites needed for a course. Individual courses can still be protected for certain level students by use of specific prerequisites as is done at present. This was an extension of Arts and Sciences' legislation which specified the changes to become effective September 1967, and presumably this date will apply to the General Faculty legislation.

3. The Faculty Council on April 20, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal to change the School of Communication catalogue in regard to Radio-Television-Film (D&P 3696).

Thirty semester hours are still required for a major but two of the specified courses have been changed since two of the three required have been abolished. Art and music have been added to the list for minors since it is felt that they are especially valuable for students of Radio-Television-Film. These changes are to become effective September 1, 1966.

- 2. Mr. Ervin J. Prouse, Associate Professor of Mathematics, to teach astronomy to the new generation of astronauts for NASA.

- 3. Mr. H. Elton Lacey, Assistant Professor of Mathematics, to act as consultant to NASA.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE MOLLIE FITZHUGH THORNTON MUSIC SCHOLARSHI FUND: Mrs. Ann Caswell Allison has sent \$200 to establish the Mollie Fitzhugh Thornton Music Scholarship Fund. Mollie Fitzhugh was born in Covington, Kentucky, but came with her parents to Texas in 1860. She attended elementary and secondary schools in Austin, going to Baylor University for college work. On the death of her husband in 1892, she returned to Austin and took up residence at 100 East 15 where she gave

#### Vacation

The annual vacation entitlement for eligible employees will be a maximum of ten (10) working days. Persons who have been continuously employed for six (6) months or longer, on at least a half-time basis, are eligible to take annual leave to the extent of one (1) day for each month of continuous employment in the current fiscal year, not to exceed ten (10) working days. Employees on an annual basis with fifteen (15) years or more of employment with the State of Texas shall be entitled to two (2) normal work weeks plus three (3) additional normal working days of vacation in any one fiscal year.


