REPORT OF AMENDMENTS TO THE 1967-68 CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION BUDGET

University Lands, Geology

1. Transfer \$915 to the Salaries account from the Maintenance and Operation account to provide funds to employ a Building Attendant for the new Midland office building for the period June 1 through August 31, 1968. (RBC# 44)

Office of the Comptroller

- 2. Appoint Charles B. Robinson as Systems Auditor effective April 1, 1968 at an annual salary rate of \$10,920. Source of funds is the unfilled position budgeted in the Comptroller's Office. (RBC# 40)
- 3. Change the status of Ernest A. Hoffman, Jr. effective May 1, 1968 to Assistant Comptroller at an annual salary rate of \$15,000. Mr. Hoffman was previously serving as Systems Auditor at an annual salary rate of \$13,200. Funds for this change are available in the Comptroller's Office Salaries account. (RBC# 41)

OTHER FISCAL ITEMS

1. Travel Paid from a Non-Travel Account

Budget Rule No. 12 requires reporting of travel expenses paid from non-travel accounts. In connection with the travel for M. Wayne Bell for the month of March, travel expense has been reimbursed from the Special Services Division Maintenance and Operation account in the amount of \$715.86. Purposes of the trips include:

To Washington, D.C. and New York City to consult with various governmental and private officials concerning operation and maintenance of historic sites, small house museums and aging structures.

To San Antonio and Dallas regarding refurbishing of the Lutcher Conference Center.

2. Transfer of Funds Within Accounts for Addition to Physical Plant Building at The University of Texas at El Paso

In completing the Addition to the Physical Plant Building at The University of Texas at El Paso, it was found that a few miscellaneous items, such as additional shelving and counters, were needed to make the building more effective and also it was believed desirable to extend the air conditioning duct to service Office No. 113. A quotation of \$2,747.63 has been secured from the contractor to cover all of this work. There is a balance of only \$169.00 in the Contingency Allowance of the contract, but sufficient funds are available in the Allotment Account for the project to cover the balance of the change order. It is recommended that a transfer of \$2,578.63 be made from Account No. 85-9555-0099 - U. T. El Paso - Addition to Physical Plant Building - Allotment Account to Account No. 85-9555-0120 - U. T. El Paso - Addition to Physical Plant Building - Contract - Guldemann Construction and Engineering, Inc., with authorization to the Director of the Office of Facilities Planning and Construction to issue a change order to the contract for this project as set out above.

meeting of the Board of Regents, The University of Texas at Austin was "authorized to become a member of the Argonne Universities Association ... should the opportunity arise, ... and President Hackerman [was] authorized to execute the necessary documents connected therewith. " This is to report that the University was invited to become a member, President Hackerman has executed the document, "Acceptance of Election to Membership in Argonne Universities Association," and payment of \$10,000 is to be made to the Association for working capital. The University of Texas at Austin is now a member, subject to payment of dues.

COLLEGE WORK-STUDY PROGRAM: The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, has approved the awarding of \$77,683 for the operation of the college work-study program for the period July 1 - December 31, 1968. The University had requested a total of \$329,136 for the year, but this amount was reduced by the Regional Panel to \$164,568, and the \$77,683 is the allocation for the first six months, being approximately 95% of one-half of the amount.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1969: The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, authorized an allocation of \$230,460 for Educational Opportunity Grants for July 1, 1968 through June 30, 1969. This total is made up of \$89,750 allocated for Initial Year and \$140,710 for Renewal Year. The Initial Year allocation is supposed to be mainly for incoming freshmen, but can be used for those who have not had an Educational Opportunity Grant previously. The University had requested \$126,400 for this allocation, and \$36,600 for Incentive awards; none of the latter was granted. The Director of Student Financial Aids thinks it may be possible to obtain additional Initial Year funds late in the year if a reallocation is made.

<u>FACULTY LEGISLATION:</u> The following legislation has been passed by the Faculty Council and/or General Faculty. I recommend approval:

l. The Faculty Council at its meeting of March 18, 1968, approved the following legislation for the College of Arts and Sciences (D&P 4132-33):



- (1) Amend the Catalogue for 1967-69 to indicate that effective in September 1970, English 301 (now numbered E 601a) will no longer be counted toward the total hours required for degrees in the College. This does not involve any change in the English requirement for the B.A., Plan I, degree because under the revised curriculum English 301 will not count toward the English requirement for this degree. With the increasing number of entering students able to pass an examination for advanced standing in English 601a (the Chairman of English estimates that between 2/3 and 3/4 of freshmen entering in September 1968 will receive credit for 301 by advanced placement), it is felt that two years advance public notice should give high school teachers and high school students ample warning that students unable to place out of English 301 will be required to take this course from the Division of Extension and not be permitted to count it toward the degree.
- (2) Under "Scholarship Requirements" in the General Information bulletin, under "Unit requirements", effective for students entering the College beginning in Soptember, 1972, change item "4. Mathematics" from 2 to 3, and item "6. Additional from any group (but not more than two from Group G)" from 3 to 4. The reason for this change is that the number of students who receive credit for algebra by examination for advanced standing indicates that for many students, beginning college algebra courses are a repetition of work which could have been completed in high school.
- (3) For the same reason it is proposed to amend item "8" under "Area C" under "Course Requirements in Area Studies" under "A. Prescribed Work" under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, by a footnote to the effect that beginning in September, 1972, algebra courses at the level of M. 301, 301E, and 301F cannot be counted either toward this requirement or toward the total hours required for the degree.
- (4) Change the General Information bulletin under "Repetition of a course" under "Grades of Scholarship" by adding the following sentence: "A student in the College of Arts and Sciences may not take a second time for credit a course in which he has a grade of \underline{C} or better." The reason given is that it is pedagogically unsound and wasteful of college resources to permit such practice. Also, the repetition of a course in which a student already has a grade of \underline{C} or better means that the student's cumulative average shown on his semester grade report will be inaccurate unless the computer is reprogrammed.
- 2. The Faculty Council on March 22, 1968, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal to change the catalogue of the School of Law(D&P 4144-45) as follows:

The resident requirement presently requiring the equivalent of three scholastic years and one summer session has been changed to the equivalent of three scholastic years only; the eighty-nine hours presently required for graduation is reduced to eighty-eight; and the paragraph requiring that a student have a weighted average of at least 65 on all work taken in the School of Law has been expanded to state further that students will receive a numerical grade in all courses except when, because of the nature of a particular course, the faculty determines that a different method of grading is preferable. The administration recommends that this be amended by adding that this is not to apply to more than three courses.

The reduction of time required in residence is to conform to the present trend of other law schools setting total time at three years. The summer session requirement had been added when the trend was to require a period of three and a half or four years. This reason also covers the reduction of total number of hours. The reason given for the request to permit the faculty authority to deviate from numerical grading is as follows:

It is likely that interdisciplinary offerings in the Law School curriculum will increase to reflect current developments in legal research and thought. In order that the Law School average reflect essentially legal skills and in order to encourage law students to take courses with substantial content from other disciplines, the faculty wishes the discretion to deviate from a numerical grading system when, because of the nature of a particular course, this seems desirable.

3. The Faculty Council on March 30, 1968, by the circularization procedure approved the changes in the catalogue of the School of Communication(D&P 4146-4151). These changes adjust the core liberal arts courses required for degrees in the School of Communication to parallel such requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree and provide greater flexibility in choices by students to fit emerging new academic concerns. The legislation also deletes grade average requirements now made obsolete by present scholastic requirements and restates some of the material in regard to departmental honor programs in Journalism and in Radio-TV-Film to clarify existing requirements about which there has been some student confusion.

Changes are made in the requirements relating to the Bachelor of Journalism Degree to adjust to the addition of new courses and the changing of course numbers in the Journalism advertising program.

Some changes in wording have been made relating to degree of Bachelor of Science in Speech to clarify the application of the present degree program by giving increased detail.

Changes have been made in regard to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Radio-Television-Film, substituting a new 6 hour course for two three hour courses and introducing a new 3 hour course at the upper division level. The total number of hours required for a major has been reduced from thirty-three to thirty, thus allowing the student to take more electives. In the minor in this field the wording has been changed to make it consistent with that of the other two departments in the School of Communication. Also students with special qualifications are permitted to apply to the chairman for permission to take an interdisciplinary minor, thus recognizing that some students might benefit from a more broadly-based minor.

4. The Faculty Council at the December 18, 1967, meeting approved the proposal to permit nine-week graduate courses during the summer terms of 1968 and 1969, with the understanding that the compensation for teaching a nine-week course would not exceed that for teaching a six-week course. The nine-week course program had been approved previously and then withdrawn; however, as a result of the December action, the nine-week course for the 1968 session was submitted for approval of the Regents at the January meeting, but no mention was made of the 1969 session, and this item is to secure that approval.

- 5. The Faculty Council at the April 15, 1968, meeting approved the proposal of the College of Engineering to designate honors graduates in engineering (D&P 4154). The designations "With Honors" and "With Highest Honors" are based on grade points per semester hour on all grades made by a student in upper division courses taken at the University of Texas at Austin which are required and counted toward his degree. A transfer student is eligible if he completes at least sixty semester hours of work toward his degree in the University. The College of Engineering desires to honor the top students (approximately 15% of class) in a manner similar to the practice of almost all of the other colleges on the campus and as do many other universities throughout the country.
- 6. The Faculty Council at the April 15, 1968, meeting approved the recommendation of the Deans' Council that the recommendation of the Faculty Advisory Committee on Policy creating a Faculty Advisory Committee on Extended Service be approved (D&P 4152). This would create a new standing committee of the General Faculty, composed of twelve members appointed by the President, that would review all recommendations for appointment or continued appointment of faculty members to modified service. Every such appointment received by a dean would be referred to this committee by the dean with or without his recommendation. The committee would work in sub-committees which should never have more than one committee member from the academic department of the person under consideration. The sub-committee would report to the Committee on Extended Service, which, in turn, would report in each instance to the appropriate dean or director and to the President.

- l. <u>Workbook to Historical Linguistics:</u> I, by W. P. Lehmann, Professor of Linguistics, which sells for \$2.95 with 8% royalty to author.
- 2. <u>Historical Linguistics: An Introduction</u>, by W. P. Lehmann, Professor of Linguistics, which sells for \$6.25 with 10% royalty to author.
- 3. <u>Vertebrates of the United States</u>, by W. F. Blair, Professor of Zoology et al., which sells for \$8.50 with 15% royalty divided among the five authors.
- 4. <u>An Introduction to Human Genetics</u>, by H. E. Sutton, Professor of Zoology, which sells for \$6.75 with 15% royalty to author.
- 5. <u>Personality Research: A Book of Readings</u>, by Donne <u>Byrne</u>, Professor of Psychology, and M. Hamilton, which sells for \$5.50 with 6% royalty to each author.
- 6. Review of Research in Behavior Pathology, edited by David S. Holmes, Assistant Professor of Psychology, which sells for \$5.95 with royalty of \$0.59 per copy to editor.

ESTABLISHMENT OF SHIELA M. O'GARA SCHOLARSHIP FUND: This scholarship fund has been established per an agreement signed by Elizabeth Baker Long and Carolyn Hewatt of Austin, Texas, and Leah Gregg Tucker of Van Nuys, California, the purpose of which is to support and maintain scholarships for deserving women students at The University of Texas at Austin majoring in physical education or related activities. Miss O'Gara was a member of the faculty in Physical Training for Women at the University of Texas at Austin in 1930-31, 1932-34, and continuously from 1935-36 until her death on January 4, 1968. At that time she was Associate Professor and Chairman of the Department as well as Director of Intramural Sports for Women. A total of \$125 has been received for this fund so far, and the agreement provides for the trustee to determine and allocate income and other receipts as well as expenses between principal and income. It further provides that if the purpose of the trust becomes impracticable, the trustee may designate another purpose, more appropriate under the circumstances, and the purpose so designated shall thereupon become the purpose of the trust.
