- Ç. In previous fiscal years, premium rates for component institutions were outlined in three separate plans identified as Plans A, B and C. Plan A (for U. T. Arlington, U. T. Austin and U. T. El Paso) had the same premium rates for 1991-92 as are currently being proposed for 1992-93. Plan C was designed for health institutions and had the same premium rates and coverages as Plan A except for a limitation on laboratory and x-ray benefits. Plan B was written for all other component institutions. Plan B provided fewer benefits at lower premium rates than Plan A for individual students and child dependents and provided fewer benefits at higher premium rates for spouses than Plan A. Plan B offered no optional major medical benefits. The plan proposed for 1992-93 provides uniform coverage at the same premium rates for all component institutions with a maximum benefit of \$50,000 per episode of illness or injury rather than the current \$20,000.
