The following docket for The University of Texas at Austin is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on July 28 and 29, 1967.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

- Grant AF-AFOSR-1327-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides the sum of \$11,029.00 for "Pilot Projects in a Program of Interamerican Biology." The grant is effective for the period July 1, 1967 through June 30, 1968, and the research will be conducted under the direction of Dr. W. Frank Blair, Professor of Zoology.
- Grant AF-AFOSR-1320-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides \$4,995.00 for support of research entitled "Status of Computational Linguistics and Relation of Machine Translation." - Modification No. 7, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF19(604)-8038, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronic Systems Division (ESKK), Air Force Systems Command, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, adds the sum of \$1,749.92 to the contract to permit the submission of a final voucher. C., corrects certain appropriation data which was included in Modification No. 10. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.

Modification No. 9, Supplemental Agreement to Contract Nonr-3579(01), by which the Office of Naval Research increases the total estimated cost of the contract by \$35,000.00 to a new total of \$1,192,500.00. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director
- 12. Modification No. 9, Supplemental Agreement to Contract Nonr-375(14), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$35,000.00 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through April 30, 1968. The study of hydromagnetic wave propagation in the upper atmosphere at micropulsation frequencies continues at the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. H. W. Smith, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 13. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract Nonr-375(15), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$12,000.00 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through March 31, 1968. The research continues in the Corrosion Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Norman Hackerman, Professor of Chemistry.

- 14. Modification No. 2 to Contract Nonr-375(19), by which the U. S. Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$874.28 to the contract funds to permit the submission of the final voucher. The research on nationalism and the perception of international crises was directed by Dr. Philip Worchel, Professor of Psychology.
- 15. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract NOw 66-0378-d, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ordnance Systems Command, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract through December 14, 1967, and adds \$330,000.00 to the cost of the contract bringing the total cost of the contract to \$827,000.00. Under the terms of the Department of Defense Industrial Security Manual for Safeguarding Classified Information, which is applicable to these contracts, the Contractor (University) may not retain classified material beyond the time required by the "Records" clause of the contract. Under the contract "Records" clause, the University is required to maintain its fiscal and related contract records for a period of three years after final payment under the contract. Thereafter, the government is precluded from further audit. The University Auditor advises that full payment has been made under the contracts, that the "Records" clause of the contracts has been satisfied and that he has no objection to the deletion of the classified portions of these contracts. It is now necessary that we delete those classified sections of the contracts which primarily describe the technical work that was performed under the contracts. I recommend that the Board of Regents authorize the deletion of the classified portions of the above contracts.

Colvin, to provide housing for not less than fifteen geology students and teachers at the Buttrill Ranch at Marathon during the period June 6 July 13, 1967, at a cost of \$178 per individual, or for not less than a total minimum of \$2,670.
- 2. Amendment No. 1 to Interagency Contract No. IAC(66-67)-220 with the State Department of Public Welfare, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which extends the terminal date of the original contract from April 30, 1967, to August 31, 1967, and increases the total amount of the contract from \$3,000 to \$3,500. The purpose of the original contract was to furnish services of faculty members of the Graduate School of Social Work in connection with the demonstration project in regard to social services to the aged, ill, and handicapped recipients in public housing.
- 3. Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC(66-67)-361 with the Lufkin State School (under the control and management of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation), signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Division of Extension will conduct a supervisory training unit on Motivation and Resistance to Change for personnel of the Lufkin State School, at a rate of \$12.50 per person. The contract is in force from June 1, 1967 through June 30, 1967, and the total amount is not to exceed \$187.50.
- 4. Interagency Contract No. IAC(66-67)-373 with the Texas Youth Council, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University is offering a workshop for training purposes under the sponsorship of the Southwestern Association of Executives of Homes for Children in cooperation with the Texas State Department of Public Welfare, the Graduate School of Social Work, and the Divison of Extension of The University of Texas at Austin. The contract is in force from June 25 through July 1, 1967, and the total amount to be received is approximately \$330. representing a fee of \$15.00 for approximately twenty-two employees attending.
- 5. Letter agreement with Shell Oil Company, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the Atmospheric Science Group at the University will conduct research during the month of June on the gulf coast sea-breeze scientific experiment. This agreement permits the installation of certain instruments on well jacket number 5 offshore from Galveston, Texas, owned by Shell and Phillips Petroleum. Shell will also furnish boat transportation to this site and to two other sites contracted from Standard Oil Company, which agreement was reported in the June docket on page M-8, Item 7.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: I recommend approval of the following faculty legis lation passed by the Faculty Council and/or the General Faculty:

1. The Faculty Council on May 24, 1967, approved by the circularization procedure changes in the Catalogue of College of Business Administration for 1968-70 (D&P 3903-4).

This rewords number 4 under objectives of the College of Business Administration and adds a fifth, "Preparation for advanced study." It also changes the specified courses to be taken, not changing the total number of semester hours, however. The reasons given for these changes are: "(1) To reflect the changing needs of the business world and society; (2) To lay a foundation for more effective leadership by the BBA graduate in the field of business; (3) To allow more flexibility, but a structured breadth, within the program to better satisfy the individual needs of the student."

- 2. The Faculty Council on May 26, 1967, approved by the circularization procedure changes in the Catalogue of the College of Arts and Sciences (D&P 3905-6) as follows:
- 1) Under major requirements for Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, German, additional upper division courses are listed from which to make a choice, with no change in the total of twenty-one semester hours required. The reason given is to broaden the German major's knowledge of literature and to strengthen his training in literary analysis as well as in the practical application of the German language.
- 2) Under minor requirements for major in Greek for Bachelor of Arts, the twelve semester hours of upper division courses required for the first minor are made more general, and the six semester hours of courses for the second minor are specified as Latin or classical civilization. In the present catalogue these latter courses are among those specified for the major, and the minor specified six hours of those not chosen for the major. The reason given is to liberalize specific requirements for the degree in such a way as to allow the student a greater choice of subjects for his minor.
- 3) Under Latin requirements for major and minor in Bachelor of Arts degree, the major requirement has been changed from fourteen semester hours of upper-division courses in Latin to fifteen, including Latin 324. This is to require specifically a prose composition course which is felt to be essential to the major program. The changes in the minor requirements follow the pattern of those in the Greek minors above, again to liberalize specific requirements in such a way as to allow the student a greater choice of subjects for his minor. These changes will also aid students working toward teaching certificates since specific requirements have been added in the teacher certification program in Latin.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part I of the Rules and Regulation of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

- 1. Mr. Richard L. Beard, Assistant Professor of General Business, to teach not more than one three-hour course at Huston-Tillotson College during the 1967-68 Long Session.
- 2. Mr. Millard H. Ruud, Professor of Law, to act as consultant to a firm of attorneys in Houston on a warehouse receipts problem under the Uniform Commercial Code.

3. Mr. David Young, Director, Computation Center and Professor of Mathematics, to act as consultant to National Science Foundation, Science Facilities Section; to the National Academy of Science, National Research Council Committee on Basic Research Advisory to the U. S. Army Research Office involving the evaluation of research proposals in applied mathematics; to Argonne National Laboratories, Applied Mathematics Division on application of digital computers to the solution of problems in applied mathematics; and to the University of Illinois on applications of the Illiac IV Computer being designed by the University of Illinois under a contract with the Defense Department.

The following docket is submitted for your approval and presentation to the Board of Regents in Austin on July 28-29, 1967:

GROUP MEDICAL AND SURGICAL PLAN

A new group medical and surgical service contract for the employees of The University of Texas at El Paso has been negotiated with Group Hospital Services, Inc. The contract was signed by Halbert G. St. Clair, Business Manager, for the University of Texas at El Paso and by Vice-Chancellor Walker for The University of Texas System. The contract has not been revised since March, 1961. The new Custom Coverage Plan provides for much more extensive benefits than the old plan. The overall increase in premium for Department I (for employees at monthly rates of \$375 or more) is about 7 percent and for Department II (for employees at monthly rates of less than \$375) less than 1 percent.

BUSINESS CONTRACT ITEMS

I recommend that The University of Texas at El Paso be authorized to execute the following proposed contracts:

- 1. Contract with Western Container Company, Inc., 7241 Stiles, El Paso, Texas, to collect and dispose of trash and rubbish from the campus for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 1967, for the sum of \$6,800.00. The funds for this contract will come from the maintenance and operation appropriation for Physical Plant General Services in the 1967-68 general budget.
- 2. Contract with Clinton D. Green for maintenance of refrigerated air-conditioning systems and heating facilities for the fiscal year beginning September 1, 1967, for the sum of \$5,700.00. The funds for this contract will come from the maintenance and operation appropriation for Physical Plant Building Maintenance in the 1967-68 general budget.
- 3. Contract with Garland Company, 1318 North Stevens, El Paso, Texas for the concessions sales rights for athletic events for a period of three years beginning September 1, 1967 and ending August 31, 1970. Under the terms of the contract The University of Texas at El Paso will receive from the gross receipts twenty seven percent (27%) from football games, twenty-five (25%) from basketball games, and twenty percent (20%) from baseball games, track meets and other athletic events. This proposed contract has been approved as to form by University Attorney Waldrep and as to content by Vice-Chancellor Walker.
- 4. Contract with Tri-State Broadcasting Company, Inc. 801 North Oregon Street, El Paso, Texas for the exclusive radio broadcasting rights for the home football games for the 1967 season. Invitations to bid and specifications were sent to six broadcasting companies; one bid was received from Tri-State Broadcasting Company for \$7,601.76. Receipts from the contract will be treated as income of Intercollegiate Athletics.

BUSINESS CONTRACT ITEMS (Continued)

5. Contract with Tri-State Broadcasting Company, Inc., 801 North Oregon Street, El Paso, Texas, for the exclusive radio broadcasting rights for the home basketball games played during the 1967-68 season. Invitations to bid and specifications were sent to three broadcasting companies: one bid was received from Tri-State Broadcasting Company, Inc. for \$9,001.01. Receipts from this contract will be treated as income of Intercollegiate Athletics.
