#### OTHER FISCAL ITEMS

1. M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute has requested financing of a research project from the John Q. Gaines Foundation for Cancer Research which is controlled through Central Administration of The University of Texas. The fund balance as of May 31, 1966 is \$2,235.63.

Leon Dmochowski, M. D., Ph.D., Head, Department of Virology, has submitted the request for emergency support of a research program entitled "Studies on Spontaneous and Induced Leukemia in Animals." His request has been approved by Dr. Clark and funds are being sought for its support.

The present resurgence of the interest in the possible viral ctiology of human leukemia is a direct result of the studies carried out on mouse leukemias during the last ten years. The similarity of murine leukemia to leukemia in children increases the importance of studies of this disease in mice which is amenable to an experimental approach.

The funds requested are for partial, emergency support to assist Doctor Dmochowski during an interim period in which funding of the research program is being changed to a different source. The need is for two months of support of the mouse colony, and the budget is as follows:

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on July 8 and 9, 1966.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants, and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

#### GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-4046, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronics Systems Division, Air Force Systems Command, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, adds the sum of \$12,900.00 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through March 31, 1967. The electromagnetic investigations in the 001 cps to 5 cps region continue in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. H. W. Smith, Professor of Electrical Engineering.

Contract AF 33(615)-5014, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, provides \$30,000.00 for the design and fabrication of 130 KMC propagation link instrumentation. The research under the contract was conducted in the Radiobiological Laboratory under the direction of Dr. T.S. Painter, Professor of Zoology. Modification No. 4, Change Order to Contract No. DA 28-043 AMC-00316(E), by which the Department of the Army, United States Army Electronics Command, Procurement and Production Directorate, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, designates the agency responsible for contract administration and indicates the name and address of the agency to which invoices should be mailed. The investigation and application of solion transducers continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.

6. Contract DA 28-043-AMC-02276(E), by which the Department of the Army, United States Army Electronics Command, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, provides \$92,318.09 for support of research entitled "Dynamic Adaptive Data Base Management Study." The contract is effective for the period May 16, 1966 through May 15, 1967, and the research will be performed in the Linguistics Research Center under the direction of Dr. W.P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.

6. Grant DA-ARO-D-31-124-G819, by which the Department of the Army, Army Research Office (Durham) Durham, North Carolina, provides \$10,290.00 for support of research entitled "The Adsorption of Water Vapor on Evaporated Iron Films Selectively Contaminated with Chemisorbed Oxygen." The grant is effective for the period September 1, 1966 through August 31, 1967, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. William H. Wade, Assistant Professor of Chemistry.

Modification No. 26, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N60921-7002, by which the Department of the Navy, United States Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, establishes a final overhead rate of 19% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1962 through August 31, 1964, and changes the provisional overhead rate from 20% to 19%. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.

Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N60921-7233, by which the Department of the Navy, United States Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, increases the scope of the contract and adds: the sum of \$25,000.00 for Task I, provides the sum of \$35,000.00 for Task II and increases the estimated cost of the contract by \$60,000.00 to a new total of \$350,000. Washington, D.C., letter dated April 22, 1966, by which 24 two-year Prospective Teacher Fellowships are allocated to the University for the academic year 1966 through 1967 under Title V, Part C of the Higher Education Act of 1965. Dr. Lorene Rogers, Associate Dean of the Graduate School, will coordinate the program.

The grant is effective for the period May 1, 1966 through April 30, 1967, and the conference will be under the direction of Dr. Harlan J. Smith, Professor of Astronomy and Director, McDonald Observatory.

Washington, D.C., provides the sum of \$46,000.00 for support of research entitled "Relaxation and Spectroscopy in Magnetically Dilute Crystals." The grant is effective for the period June 1, 1966 through May 31, 1968, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. A. Wilson Nolle, Professor of Physics.

39. Grant GS-1142, by which the National Science Foundation, Washington, D.C., provides \$1,800.00 for support of a project entitled "Doctoral Dissertation Research in the History of Science." The Doctoral Candidate is Thomas M. Camfield. The grant is effective for the period May 15, 1966 through November 14, 1966, and the project will be conducted under the direction of Dr. David D. Van Fassel, Professor of History.

#### PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY NON-FEDERAL SPONSORS:

- 1. Award letter dated April 5, 1966, by which the American Petroleum Institute, Dallas, Texas extends the period of Research Project 67-E through June 30, 1967 and adds the sum of \$22,000.00 to the grant funds. The investigation of deformation-failure mechanism of ductile materials under impulsive loadings will continue under the direction of Dr. Kenneth E. Gray, Associate Professor of Petroleum Engineering.
- 2. Award letter dated April 5, 1966, by which the American Petroleum Institute, Dallas, Toxas, extends the period of Research Project 67-H through June 30, 1967, and adds the sum of \$5,000.00 to the grant funds. The investigation of a method for computing deformation of soil and rock under static loading continues under the direction of Dr. Lymon C. Reesc, Professor of Civil Engineering.
- 3. Grant MLMRF 66A, by which the Modern Language Association of America, New York, New York, provides \$20,000.00 for Phase One of the Portuguese Language Development Group Project for a Modern Portuguese Textbook. The grant is effective for the period May 18, 1966 through February 28, 1967, and the project will be under the direction of Dr. Fred P. Ellison, Professor of Romance Languages.
- 4. Grant-in-Aid No. BR-918, by which the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, New York, New York, provides a Research Fellowship for Dr. Nathan L. Bauld, in Ch-mistry. The fellowship awards the sum of \$i6, i00, 00 for the period September 16, 1966 through September 15, 1968.
- 5. Grant-in-Aid No. BR-919, by which the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, New York, New York, provides a Research Fellowship for Dr. Neville J. Woolf, in Astronomy. The fellowship awards the sum of \$9,200.00 for the period September 16, 1966 through September 15, 1968.
- 6. Grant-in-aid No. BR-920, by which the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, New York, New York, provides \$8,000.00 for major capital equipment needed by Dr. Neville J. Woolf as an Alfred P. Sloan Research Fellow in Astronomy, for the period September 16, 1966 through September 15, 1968.
- 7. Contract dated May 17, 1966, by which the Travis County Child Welfard Unit provides \$1,047.84 for the purpose of providing speech and hearing screening tests in the day care centers of Austin. The contract is effective for the period June 1, 1966 through July 31, 1966, and the screening tests will be under the direction of Dr. L. L. Kopra, Professor of Speech and Education.

8. Supplemental Grant No. F-130-1-160 to Grant No. F-130, by which The Robert A. Welch Foundation, Houston, Texas, adds the sum of \$15,295.00 to the grant funds for the period May 1, 1965 through April 30, 1966. The research on "Chemistry and Structure Determination of Sesquiterpone Lactones" continues under the direction of Dr. Tom J. Mabry, Assistant Professor of Botany.

ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts have been executed at Main University by the official indicated. I recommend approval and ratification of signatures:

- 1. Contract No. AF 11(602)-5334 with the United States Air Force, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which provides for basic weather training for not more than 20 students who are military personnel during the period June 1, 1966 May 31, 1967. The total estimated amount of contract is \$17,880.
- 2. Contract No. AF 01(600)-5121 with United States Air Force, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which provides for the enrollment in the University and instruction in miscellaneous fields of education for students selected from the Air Force. The period of the contract is July 1, 1966 through June 30, 1967, and the total estimated amount is \$1,685.00.
- 3. Interagency Contract No. IAC (66-67)-203 with the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, signed by Chancellor Harry Ransom, whereby the University through its Industrial Education Department will conduct supervisory training units in human relations for personnel of institutions under the control and management of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation. The contract is in force from April 22, 1966 to and including July 31, 1966, and total payment to be made for these services is not to exceed \$2,500.
- 4. Interagency Contract No. IAC (66-67)-206 with the Texas Employment Commission, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Division of Extension will conduct executive development seminars for personnel of the Commission. The contract is in force from May 4, 1966 to no later than June 30, 1966, and the total payment is not to exceed \$6,200.
- 5. Interagency Contract No. IAC (66-67)-209 with the Texas College of Arts and Industries, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University will furnish necessary clerical and staff services and materials, supplies and equipment to furnish to A&I photocopies of documents and other materials in lieu of an interlibrary loan. The contract extends from May 15, 1966 to and including August 31, 1967, and the total to be paid to the University is not to exceed \$2,000.

- 6. Letter Agreement dated February 4, 1966, with International Business Machines Corporation, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman on June 13, 1966, concerning a joint study to explore the feasibility of adapting advanced application and machine technologies to the area of teaching and instruction. The agreement will remain in effect for a period of one year after the date on which IBM shall complete the installation of the Computer Assisted Instruction (CAI) System at the University, the equipment to remain the property of IBM, but IBM will provide and service the equipment on a rent-free basis.
- 7. Letter Agreement with Mr. Tom B. Leary of Marathon, Texas, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which provides for the housing of geology students and teachers at the Buttrill Ranch during a portion of the Summer of 1966. For the period June 6 July 14 a minimum of \$3,024 is to be paid for 18 individuals for a cost of \$168 each; during the period June 6 July 9, a minimum of \$1,008 for 7 individuals at \$144 each.

TRAVEL FROM NON-TRAVEL FUNDS: The following trips have been paid from funds not specifically marked for travel:

1. Mr. Hugo Leipziger-Pearce, Professor of Architecture, April 27 and 28, 1966, to Arlington, Texas, to meet with President Woolf and others to plan for the Urban Affairs Conference to be held in October, 1966; and again on May 9, 1966, to Arlington to make further arrangements about the Conference, expenses for both trips to be paid from Miscellaneous Administrative Expenses, Office of the Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the April trip to cost approximately \$56.00 and the May one \$46.00.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT. I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part I of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

- 1. Mr. Norman M. Martin, Associate Professor of Philosophy, to act as consultant to Logicon, Inc., on design of special purpose computers, reliability, and other problems in computer theory. Mr. Martin was formerly a full-time employee and executive of the corporation.
- 2. Mr. Pierre R. Loiseaux, Professor of Law, to do research for The Brookings Institution, Washington, D. C., in the administration of federal bankruptcy law in the Western District of Texas (interviewing and statistical study of cases).
- 3. Mr. Millard H. Ruud, Professor of Law, to continue as consultant to law firm in Memphis, Tennessee, concerning Subcontractors, Inc. v. National Gypsum Co.
- 4. Mr. John F. Sutton, Jr., Professor of Law, to do research and drafting (for the American Bar Foundation) in a revision of the ABA Canons of Ethics.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Countil. I recommend approval.

1. The Faculty Council on May 10, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal to change the College of Engineering degree plans (D&P 3705). These changes simply correct for the forthcoming issue of the catalogue changes already made and approved by the College, but which, when presented for approval to the Faculty Council and Regents, at the September 20, 1965 meeting, contained minor errors.

- 2. The Faculty Council at its meeting on April 18, 1966, approved the Summer Session calendar for 1967 (D&P 3688). This provides for registration for the first term on June 6 and 7 (Tuesday and Wednesday) with classes beginning June 8. Examinations for the first 6-week term are scheduled for July 15 18, Saturday Tuesday, with classes for nine-week and twelve-week courses suspended during these days. Registration for second term is on July 19, Wednesday, with classes beginning Thursday, July 20. Final examinations for nine-week courses are on August 5 8, Saturday Tuesday, and for second six weeks and twelve weeks on August 26 29, Saturday Tuesday. Graduation day is August 29 (no public exercises).
- 3. The General Faculty at its meeting on May 10, 1966, approved the Long Session calendar for 1967-68 (D&P 3688-89). This provides for the opening of the session on Sunday, September 17, with orientation scheduled on Monday and Tuesday, September 18 and 19, registration September 18 - 22, and classes beginning Monday, September 25. Holidays scheduled are Thursday - Saturday, November 23 - 25, and Christmas vacation extends from Friday, December 22, 1966, through Tuesday, January 2, 1967. Tuesday and Wodnesday, January 16-17 are "no class" days and examinations will be given from Thursday, January 18, through Saturday, January 27, which latter is also listed as graduation day (no public exercises). Second semester begins with registration Monday, January 29, through Friday, February 2, with classes beginning Monday, February 5. Spring vacation is scheduled for Monday - Saturday, April 1 - 6. May 17-18, Friday - Saturday, are "no class" days except in School of Law, where final examinations extend from May 17 - 29. Final examinations in other areas begin May 20 and extend through May 29, a Wednesday. Commencement is June 1, Saturday.
- 4. The General Faculty at its meeting on May 10, 1966, approved the recommendation of the Faculty Council that voting membership, ex-officio, on the Faculty Council be given to the Director of the Graduate School of Social Work and to the Director of the Graduate School of Library Science.
- 5. The Faculty Council on May 25, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the following changes in the catalogue of the College of Arts and Sciences (D&P 3732-35):
- 1) Under Plan I for Bachelor of Arts degree, in requirement 4 under Prescribed Work, section (a) the laboratory course phrase is deleted as well as Physics 609 in stipulating that 12 semester hours in the natural sciences are required since beginning 1966-67 some of the courses given for non-science majors will not have laboratory work. The wording is broadened to cover all types of courses offered.

- 2) Under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, American Studies, under Majors and Minors the number of semester hours specified by course number are reduced from 33 to 24 which will allow the student greater freedom in selecting a minor and provide for greater variety and flexibility in the undergraduate major in American Studies.
- 3) Under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, Asian Studies, under Majors and Minors, Asian Studies 301 is added to prescribed courses, but the number of semester hours required does not change. The reason given for this change is that Asian Studies 301 (offered for the first time in 1965-66) will provide the student with the core information and concepts necessary for a better understanding of Asia in general and the topics covered in later advanced courses in particular. This legislation also eliminates the possibility of taking an intensive course in an Asian language at the senior level since intensive courses will no longer be given at the undergraduate level.
- 4) The Department of Psychology under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan 1, under Majors and Minors, eliminates home economics and management from among the courses to be taken for First Minor Requirements and adds linguistics, social welfare studies, and special education, the change being designed primarily to reflect the changes in course offerings of other departments, eliminating those which no longer offer sufficient course work relevant to psychology and adding those which do. The change also takes into account the creation of new departments in which a minor would be appropriate for psychology majors. The number of semester hours needed remains at twelve.
- 5) Under Bachelor of Science in Home Economics, Prescribed Work, change the total semester hours to 126 instead of "126 or 128." In the past 128 semester hours were required of those who chose Chemistry 801, and thus these students were in a sense penalized for having chosen a course regarded by many as more difficult than the alternate course.
- 6. The Faculty Council at its meeting on May 28, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposed change in the catalogue of the College of Business Administration (D&P 3730) under required work which should be taken during the freshman year toward fulfilling the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Business Administration which substitutes "(a) Six semester hours in a physical and/or biological science" for "(a) Six semester hours in a laboratory science" since a strictly laboratory science course at freshman level in chemistry has been abolished.
- 7. At same time approval was given to the recommendation of the School of Communication (D&P 3731) where under Plan I: News and Related Fields for a Bachelor of Journalism, a new course, Journalism 320R is added as a required course, and the number of selected courses is limited to six instead of the nine semester hours. The faculty feels that the new course should be required.

8. The Faculty Council on June 10, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal to change the degree requirements for the Bachelor of Journalism (D&P 3736). This change makes Journalism 312K a required course whereas heretofore other courses could be substituted for it. The faculty feel that 312K is a basic course and taking it will give the students a more logical arrangement of work. There is no

change in number of hours for degree.

BUSINESS CONTRACTS: Set out below are reports from Business Manager James H. Colvin in regard to the awarding of various contracts for the 1966-67 fiscal year based on bids. I concur in his recommendations and recommend that he be authorized to execute contracts in accordance therewith. Tabulations of the bids on the Uniform and Linen Rental Contract and on the Contract for Dairy Products are set out on pages following these recommendations.

AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR AIR FORCE ROTC UNIFORMS: On June 12, 1963, bids were received to supply Air Force ROTC uniforms for the 1963-64 year. Bid invitations were sent to nine firms, but only two bids were received. Sol Frank Company of San Antonio was awarded the contract on a low bid of \$91.92 for the complete uniform. The material and services furnished under this contract have been satisfactory and have met Air Force standards. I concur in the recommendations of Lt. Colonel Karl Y. Benson, Jr., Professor and Chairman of Air Force Science, and Mr. W. R. Dustin, Military Property Custodian, that the present contract with Sol Frank Company be extended for the academic year 1966-67, and that the Business Manager be authorized to sign such contract, subject to the same conditions and requirements as in the previous years.

AWARD OF PEST CONTROL SERVICE CONTRACT: On June 8 bids were opened for the Pest Control Service contract for food service units in the Division of Housing and Food Service. Bid invitations and specifications were sent to the following:

I therefore recommend that the Board of Regents approve the awarding of a contract for this service to the Orkin Exterminating Company, the low bidder.

AWARD OF LAUNDRY SERVICE CONTRACTS: On June 8 bids were opened in the Business Manager's Office for the laundry service contracts for the several Division of Housing and Food Service units. I recommend that the Board of Regents approve the awarding of contracts for this service for the 1966-67 fiscal year as follows:

The above represent the only bids received in the indicated areas, except that in Group 4 Austin Laundry bid . 0775.

It should be pointed out that the low bids average about 25% higher than the prices called for in the current contracts. We discussed this with the bidders present and were informed that these price increases were the result of rapidly increasing labor costs, and that the Minimum Wage Bill now in Congress will cause an even greater increase next year for these services.

I recommend that the awards be made as indicated. I think the price is reasonable and fair and substantially below the retail prices for finished flat work.

AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR LAUNDRY AND DRY CLEANING FOR OCCUPANTS OF KINSOLVING DORMITORY: For several years Austin Laundry and Dry Cleaning Company, Inc., and Burtons Laundry and Cleaners have provided laundry and dry cleaning services to the occupants of Kinsolving Dormitory. The contract for these services provides that the University will be paid \$25.00 per month. I concur in the recommendation of Mr. F. C. McConnell, Director of Housing and Food Service, that this contract be extended for the 1966-67 year and request that the Business Manager be authorized to sign such contract, subject to the same conditions and requirements as in the previous year.

AWARD OF UNIFORM AND LINEN RENTAL CONTRACT: On June 8 bids were opened in the Business Manager's Office for the uniform and linen rental contract for the various units of the Division of Housing and Food Service. I recommend that the Board of Regents approve the awarding of a contract for this service for the 1966-67 fiscal year to Martin Linen Supply Company, of San Antonio, the low bidder.

An examination of the bids shows that this company's bids were low or the same price on all but six items, none of which are of large volume. The additional cost for these items was computed, based on a typical month, and compared with the savings resulting from the 10% discount which Martin Linen Supply Company will allow on the entire bill. The resulting figures clearly show Martin Linen Supply Company to be the low bidder.

Therefore, I recommend that the award be made in accordance with the bid submitted.

AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR DAIRY PRODUCTS: On June 8 bids were opened in the Business Manager's Office for the Dairy Products contracts for the various units of the Division of Housing and Food Service. I recommend that the Board of Regents approve the awarding of contracts for dairy products for 1966-67 as follows:

A study of the individual unit prices has been made and where differences in unit prices exist we have determined the consumption of the products based on the minimum quantities shown on the Estimate Sheet submitted with the bid specifications. This study revealed that we should make awards to the companies submitting the greater discount on the monthly bill, except for frozen dessert mix.

For frozen dessert mix, Superior Dairies is the low bidder with a net bid of 75¢ per gallon. Oak Parms bid \$1.18 per gallon less 12% discount, and Carnation bid 95¢ per gallon less 10% discount, which are both higher than the net bid of Superior Dairies.

It is therefore my recommendation that milk and ice cream contracts be awarded to Oak Farms Dairies and the frozen dessert mix contract be awarded to Superior Dairies.

AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS AND RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MEDICAL STAFF OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS MEDICAL BRANCH HOSPITALS: In accordance with Articles IX and X of the By-Laws and Rules and Regulations of the Medical Staff, approval is recommended for the addition of the following amendment to Article VI, Section 2, Page 9, of the By-Laws and Rules and Regulations of the Medical Staff of The University of Texas Medical Branch Hospitals.--Addition of a Utilization Committee:

The UTILIZATION COMMITTEE shall consist of twenty-two members of the Medical Staff which will include a Chairman and additionally three Representatives each from the Departments of Medicine, Surgery, Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology, and Neuropsychiatry, and one Ropresentative each from the Departments of Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Pathology, Radiology, Anesthesiology, and Hospital Administration (non-voting member). It is the responsibility of this Committee to (1) Evaluate Medical Care of Patients during their period of hospitalization, (2) Develop review mechanisms for the establishment of criteria for under or over-use of hospital stay, laboratory tests, radiological examinations, professional services, drugs and biologicals and/or any other service provided by the hospital, (3) Apply these established criteria to effect maximal efficiency in use of available medical facilities at reasonable economic costs, (4) Establish adequate limison with all members of the Medical Staff to review pertinent case findings and assign a course of action, and (5) comply with all the requirements of a Utilization Committee as promulgated by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals and the Medicare Act, Public Law 89-97.

- 2. Dectors Don E. Blanton and George G. Dunkerley, Residents, Department of Medicine, for appointment on the Courtesy Staff of The University of Texas Medical Branch Hospitals for the months of March and April, 1966. Drs. Blanton and Dunkerley also serve as Clinical Instructors in the Department of Medicine.

LEASE OF MOSPITALITY SHOF: -- On the recommendation of the Rusiness Manager, Associate Director, and the Executive Director and Dean, approval is requested for the lease of the Hospitality Shop, an auxiliary enterprise of the Medical Branch, located on the first floor of the John Sealy Hospital, to the University Medical Branch Cooperative Society, Inc., (Co-op Bookstore) for \$212.50 per month (850 square feet at  $25\phi$  per square foot) effective April 1, 1966. 
