RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS TO THE 1964-65 CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION BUDGET

Office of the Director of Facilities Planning and Construction

- 1. Effective June 6, 1965 appoint Robert M. Stein as Clerk-of-the-Works at a twelve-months salary rate of \$8,400 payable on a month-to-month basis. Source of funds: Plant Funds (remodeling projects for six buildings- Main University). (RBC 131)
- 2. Effective July 1, 1965, appoint Carlton D. Yarbrough as Clerk-of-the-Works at a twelve-months salary rate of \$7,800, payable on a month-to-month basis. Source of funds: Plant Funds (Biological Sciences Building Main University). (RBC 137)

3. Transfer \$1,000 from the Travel account to the Publishing and Mailing account to underwrite cost of re-writing certain Development Board brochures and publications in line with revisions in the 1964 Internal Revenue Act. (RBC 124)

Transfer of Funds within Accounts for Remodeling and Renovation of Hill Hall Kitchen

4. After work had been started under the contract with Robert C. Gray Construction Company for the general construction involved in the Remodeling and Renovation of Hill Hall Kitchen, a request was made by the Athletic Council that the dish washing room be belarged, and it was discovered that it would be necessary to perform some additional remodeling work which had not been included in the original plans and specifications. The total cost of these items is \$1,764.67; since there is a Contingency Allowance of \$500.00 in the contract, the sum of \$1,264.67 will have to be added to the contract price in order to perform the additional work desired.

There is a balance in the Allocment Account for this project of over \$26,000.00, and it is, therefore, recommended that in order to issue the change order to cover the items mentioned above, a transfer be made from Account No.

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Houston on August 27 and 28, 1965:

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants, and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

- 1. Contract AF 30(602)-3749, by which the Department of the Air Force, Research and Technology Division, Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss Air Force Base, New York, provides \$96,820.00 for support of research leading to improvement of Russian-English Mechanical Translation. The contract is effective for the period May 20, 1965, which is the date of receipt by the University of a fully executed copy, through May 19, 1966, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages.
- 2. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 33(615)-1971, by which the Department of the Air Force, Systems Engineering Group, Research and Technology Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Chio, increases the estimated cost of the contract by \$358,936.00 and allots \$200,000.00 of this sum for performance under the contract through March 31, 1966. The research in tropical meteorology was performed in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.

Modification No. 6 to Contract DA 36-039 SC-87312 establishes a provisional overhead rate of 37.4% beginning September 1, 1962. The investigation of new methods for frequency control was performed under the direction of Dr. W. H. Hartwig, Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering.

Modification No. 5 to Contract DA 36-039 SC-89179 establishes a provisional overhead rate of 36.5% beginning September 1, 1962. The research in tropical meteorology was performed in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A.W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.



- 8. Interagency Contract No. 4413-1123 with the Texas Youth Council, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which provides tuition and registration fees for employees to attend the Seventh Annual Workshop during the period June 21-25, 1965, the total amount not to exceed \$250 for all registering at \$15.00 for each individual.
 - 9. Memorandum of Agreement with Institute of International Education, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, whereby the University agrees to arrange a special development summer program to provide academically competent potential leaders from developing countries with an opportunity to improve those skills which will enable them to utilize their education and training to full effect in their home countries. The group of not less than 10 nor more than 20 will be of all nationalities. The University will be paid the sum of \$2,000 for arranging and conducting the program, the Institute to pay in addition regular summer school tuition for three credit courses for each student and a daily maintenance allowance of \$6.50 a day for 84 days plus travel time. - 11. Contract N600(22)64140 with Department of the Navy, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which provides for the University to carry out the Regulations for the Administration and Training of the Naval Reserve Officers' Training Corps. The term of the contract is July 1, 1965, until June 30, 1966, and the total estimated amount is \$35,000.
- 12. Contract OSD-47-043 MEP-269 with the Department of Defense, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University will provide course materials and administrative services for military personnel of the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard for correspondence study. The period of the contract is July 1, 1965, through June 30, 1966, and payment is at rate of \$2.00 as an individual lesson service fee.
- 13. Contract No. PC-72-581, Amendment No. 1, with the Peace Corps, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, which increases the cost of the contract by \$112,439.50, making a revised estimated cost of \$122,968.50. This concerns Phase I of an Advance Training Program to train approximately 60 Peace Corps Trainees for a Community Development/Health and Sanitation Project in Brazil. This project is under the direction of Dr. Joe Neal of the International Office.
- 14. Contract No. PC-72-585, Amendment No. 1, with the Peace Corps, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, which increases the cost by \$182,309, thus making a revised estimated cost of \$193,105. This contract concerns the training for approximately 71 Peace Corps Trainees for a Teachers of English as a Foreign Language/Education and Accountants/Secretaries Project in Afghanistan and is under the direction of Dr. Joe Neal of the International Office.
- 15. Contract No. PC-72-608 with the Peace Corps, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, which provides for the training of approximately 75 Peace Corps Trainees for a Teachers of English as a Foreign Language Project in Iran at a total estimated cost of \$201,515. Dr. Joe Neal is the director of the program.
- 16. Grant No. SCC-29793, Amendment No. 4, with the United States Department of State, signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, which awards an additional grant of \$75,000 equivalent in Egyptian pounds, making the total award \$214,300, and extends the expiration date from April 30, 1965, to April 30, 1966. This grant concerns the University's participation in the development of the teaching of the English Language and Linguistics in the United Arab Republic, and is a joint project with Brown and Cornell Universities.

<u>FACULTY LEGISLATION:</u> The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council. I recommend approval.

1. The Faculty Council at its meeting on June 21, 1965, approved the recommendation of the College of Arts and Sciences to change requirements in certain degree programs (D&P 3541-45).

The Department of Classics under Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, under "C. Majors and Minors," under Greek, changes the major requirement from thirty semester hours (with courses specified) to fourteen semester hours of Greek beyond the sophomore level; and under Latin the major requirement is changed from thirty semester hours (with courses specified) for those beginning Latin in college or twenty-six semester hours above the freshman level to those entering with Latin credits, to fourteen semester hours beyond the sophomore level. This is done because beginning with the 1965-66 year the freshman courses in Greek and Latin will be given in two sequences, the regular sequence and an accelerated sequence. In either language, as the student goes to the next higher course he may shift from one sequence to the other provided he is advised to do so by his instructor and the undergraduate adviser. The revised way of stating the major requirement removes the inconsistency between the catalogue statement of the major requirement and the new parallel sequence of courses, and provides for calculating the student's major average from grades made on upper division courses only, so that the student whose work improves as the semesters go by is not penalized for his slow start. The number of semester hours does not change.

The Department of Linguistics has restated its requirements for a major, first minor, and second minor to simplify the present statement of requirements, to reflect better the present status of linguistics as a well defined area of study with its own techniques and principles, and to enrich the specialized part of the Bachelor of Arts program, and to do so by a sequence of required courses covering the essential part of linguistics. There is no change in number of semester hours.

The Department of Romance Languages has made changes in the requirements for the major, first minor, and second minor in both Spanish and French majors to bring the degree program in each closer to the level of programs at other institutions. The choice of two plans in the first minor would liberalize it and provide flexibility for a variety of student programs. The first option in the first minor is the present requirement, while option two provides for numerous humanistic and professional programs around a Spanish or French core. There is no change in number of semester hours.

Under the Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies, the prescribed semester hours in architecture are reduced from fifty-five to fifty-three; the junior year courses eliminate three semester hours elective in arts and sciences and adds courses in Architecture. The revisions are recommended to update the curriculum as reviewed and approved by the Architecture Faculty, December 18, 1964, and to meet some of the recommendations of the National Architectural Accrediting Board. The revisions also better correlate courses in the Five and Six-Year Programs being offered concurrently by the School of Architecture.

- 2. The Faculty Council at its meeting on June 21, 1965, approved the recommendation of the College of Business Administration (D&P 3528) regarding the application of ROTC courses toward the Degree of Bachelor of Business Administration, which permits nine hours for lower division free electives, and three hours to be substituted for speech. The proposed change is designed to adjust permissible credits in ROTC courses to the curricula changes approved in the College.
- 3. The Faculty Council by the circularization procedure approved on June 21, 1965, changes in the College of Education Catalogue (D&P 3548-50). This legislation restates teacher certification V requirements to meet legal requirements therefor in Texas.

It also reduces from a maximum of eighteen to a maximum of nine semester hours the military or naval science courses that may be used as free electives in any degree plan, thereby increasing the number of courses the student may take in the humanities, natural sciences, social sciences, mathematics, and fine arts.

In the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Education (for Secondary School Teachers), the curriculum has three components, one of which is a basic core of liberal studies, called academic foundations, which are set out on page 18 of the 1964-66 Catalogue, the last two numbered items of which include philosophy, Art 305, Drama 314, Music 302L, Bible, and the second, fine arts, humanities, social sciences, mathematics, and natural sciences. The present legislation would provide that a student registering for twelve semester hours or more must include a minimum of nine semester hours of courses other than the <u>last numbered item specified above</u>, rather than in the <u>last two items</u>, the reason being that the present restriction on registration has made it most difficult to find courses for freshmen who attended a summer session prior to long session enrollment.

Other legislation raises the grade-point average necessary in specializations in order to enroll in practice teaching courses. This reflects the higher requirement in grade-point average for academic specialities previously established by the faculty of the College of Education and the University Council on Teacher—Education.

Also Business is added as a single subject field specialization to make it possible for students to be certified to teach business as well as another academic specialization. Under existing requirements students may not be certified to teach more than one subject if they elect a specialization in business. Two Single-Subject Field Specializations must be completed. In this section this legislation also calls attention to the fact that economics, geology, health education and psychology are not yet recognized for teacher certificates in Texas, and the student should check with his dean concerning regulations in other states. Requests come from school districts in Texas and other states for teachers in these specializations.

The legislation further provides for the inclusion of chemistry and physics under subject concentrations for the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education since these additions will strengthen the offering of academic minors for majors in Elementary Education.

The Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Physical Education reduces from fifteen to nine semester hours the requirements in natural and biological sciences and eliminates six semester hours from philosophy, Music 302L, Art 305, Drama 314, Speech 305, or Bible. These changes are proposed so as to provide more flexibility within the program and to allow free electives for the students. It also rearranges the content of courses in physical and health education.

- 4. The Faculty Council on June 22, 1965, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal to change from ten to six the number of semester hours of ROTC courses that may be applied to the degree of Bachelor of Architecture for the Five Year Program, and these to be only as free nonadvanced electives and only in the case of the student who completes successfully the junior and senior years of the ROTC program. (D&P 3551)
- 5. The Taculty Council on June 25, 1965, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal of the School of Law (D&P 3552) which subjects the transfer student to the same standard of work requirements as if he had completed his first year of study in that school. Presently he is governed by the requirements for freshman law students which means that if his work falls below 63, he is dropped from the School of Law, and after being out for two semesters, is permitted to re-enter as a beginning student. On the advanced student basis he is allowed to take re-examinations in courses in which he made less than 65, and when his overall average is 65 once more, he is in good standing and does not lose credit in courses he passed. The faculty feels that the present rule is too harsh on the transfer student.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the person listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part I of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

1. Mr. E. D. Pendergraft, Associate Director, Linguistics Research Center, to act as Consultant to the United States Projects Officer on Data Exchange Agreement with Germany, under the Department of Defense, effective July 1, 1965.

<u>USE OF TEXTBOOKS WRITTEN BY FACULTY MEMBERS</u>: I recommend approval of the use of the following faculty-authored books as textbooks for the 1965-66 Long Session:

1. <u>Literatura española contemporánea</u>, antología, introducción y notas, by Ricardo Gullón and George D. Schade, Jr., both of the Department of Romance Languages, published by Charles Scribner's Sons, which sells for \$7.95 with 6% royalty to Mr. Gullón and 4% to Mr. Schade.

ESTABLISHMENT OF AGENCY ACCOUNT: Dr. Helmut Rehder, Professor of Germanic Languages and Chairman of the Woodrow Wilson Fellowship Selection Committee of Region XII (Texas-Louisiana), has requested that an agency account from funds to be received from the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation be set up. These funds are to enable him to make appropriate secretarial appointments to the office staff of the Department of Germanic Languages throughout the next academic year, in particular during the months of peak activity, October through January. An advance of approximately \$1,500 will be made in the near future, to be supplemented by additional funds if and when the initial payment is exhausted. The Business Manager has approved and I concur.

DR. AND MRS. C. L. CLINE PROFESSORSHIP IN ENGLISH: Dr. and Mrs. C. L. Cline have established, with the Board of Regents as Trustee, the C. L. and Henriette Cline Trust which will become upon the death of the survivor of the donors the C. L. and Henriette F. Cline Professorship in English. Dr. Cline has now requested that the account established by earlier gifts, now amounting to \$2,052.08 in Funds Grouped for Investment, be changed to the Dr. and Mrs. C. L. Cline Endowment Tund under the Arts and Sciences Foundation with income distributed from Fund Groups as of August 31, 1965, and thereafter to be available for use as recommended by the Advisory Council of the Arts and Sciences Foundation and the Dean of the College, and not reinvested as in the past.



BUSINESS CONTRACT ITEMS
