1958-59 Budget

Office of the President

1. Change the appointment of Mr. Lanier Cox, Vice-President for Administrative Services, from two-thirds time during the Long Session to full-time, his entire salary for 1958-59 in the amount of \$15,000 for twelve months to be paid from this budget, additional funds needed to come from Central Administration Unappropriated Balance. He will continue in the budget of Business Services without salary.

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TEXAS WESTERN COLLEGE: Appoint Dr. Joseph R. Smiley as President, effective September 1, 1958, at a total salary of \$17,400 for twelve months, plus house and utilities. Of this amount \$12,600 will come from unused funds in the Office of the President, \$2,000 from Cotton Estate Funds already appropriated to President's Office, and the amount of \$2,800 is to be an additional appropriation from the Unappropriated Surplus in the Frank B. Cotton Trust Income account. Dr. Smiley is being appointed to succeed Dr. Dysart Holcomb, whose resignation appears in the docket for Texas Western College.

2. Mr. Lanier Cox, Vice-President for Administrative Services, September 24-October 1, 1958, to Los Angeles and Berkeley, California, to act as official representative at the inauguration ceremonies for President Kerr, expenses to be paid from Development Expenses - Central Administration.

PROPOSALS (1) TO MAKE A SLIGHT CHANGE IN THE LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT FOR THE DEGREES OF BACHELOR OF ARTS, PLANS I, III, AND IV; BACHELOR OF JOURNALISM; BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN GEOLOGY; BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN HOME ECONOMICS, PLAN I; AND BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN PHYSICS; (2) TO AMEND THE MAJOR REQUIREMENT FOR THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS, PLAN I, WITH A MAJOR IN ECONOMICS; (3) TO AMEND THE MAJOR AND MINOR REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS, PLAN I, WITH A MAJOR IN PSYCHOLOGY; (4) TO SPECIFY A COURSE IN HOME ECONOMICS FOR THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN HOME ECONOMICS, GROUP 4, HOME AND COMMERCIAL DEMONSTRATION; (5) TO DELETE THE SPEECH REQUIREMENT FOR THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN HOME ECONOMICS, GROUP 7, CHILD DEVELOPMENT; AND (6) TO PROVIDE FOR DEPARTMENTAL PARTICIPATION IN SPECIAL HONORS PROGRAMS

The College of Arts and Sciences has filed with the Secretary of the Faculty Council the recommendations published below ~~(1) to specify a grade of at least C in the highest course called for by the language requirement for those students who do not take all of the prerequisite courses for the highest course;~~ (2) to change the major requirement for the Economics major under the degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I; (3) to amend the major and minor requirements for the Psychology major under the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I; (4) to specify a choice between two Home Economics courses for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Home Economics, Plan II, Group 4, Home and Commercial Demonstration; (5) to delete the Speech requirement for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Home Economics, Plan II, Group 7, Child Development; and ~~(6) to establish a Special Honors Program in certain departments.~~ The recommendations were approved by the College of Arts and Sciences by the circularization procedure June 6, 1958. The Secretary has classified these recommendations of exclusive application and primary interest only to a single school or college.

Notice is hereby given that this legislation will be presented to the Board of Regents for adoption unless a signed protest, with reasons, is received by the Secretary of the Faculty Council from a member of the Council within five days of the date of this publication. If a protest is received, the proposed legislation will be presented to the Faculty Council for action at its meeting of July 21, 1958.

On page 32 of the Catalogue of the College of Arts and Sciences for 1957-1959 under the "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I," under "A. Prescribed Work," CHANGE the last sentence of paragraph 2 under requirement 3 (as amended by the College of Arts and Sciences on March 29, 1958, and approved by the Faculty Council on April 18, 1958).

From: "A student who, by departmental permission, enrolls without the prerequisite for the most advanced course required may absolve his language requirement by passing this course."

To: "A student who, by departmental permission, enrolls without the prerequisite for the most advanced course required may absolve his language requirement by passing this course with at least a grade of C."

On page 46 of the same Catalogue make the above change in the appropriate place under requirement 3 under "Plan III, Degree Preparatory to Law: Bachelor of Arts" (as amended April 18, 1958).

On pages 47-48 of the same Catalogue make the above change in the appropriate place in the footnote under "Plan IV, Schemes I and II, Degree Preparatory to Medicine: Bachelor of Arts" (as amended April 18, 1958).

On page 49 of the same Catalogue make the above change in the appropriate place under requirement 2 under "A. Prescribed Work," under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Journalism" (as amended April 18, 1958).

On page 53 of the same Catalogue make the above change in the appropriate place under requirement 3 under "A. Prescribed Work," under "Bachelor of Science in Geology" (as amended April 18, 1958).

On page 54 of the same Catalogue make the above change in the appropriate place under requirement 3 under "A. Prescribed Work," under "Bachelor of Science in Home Economics, Plan I" (as amended April 18, 1958).

On page 59 of the same Catalogue make the above change in the appropriate place under requirement 7 and "A. Prescribed Work," under "Bachelor of Science in Physics" (as amended April 18, 1958).

Reason: Recently approved legislation failed to state a grade that a student must make in certain courses under the circumstances described above. The Romance Language Department and the Dean's office concur in recommending that the student be required to pass with at least a C grade.

Department of Economics

On page 36 of the same Catalogue under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I," under "C. Majors and Minors," under "Economics," CHANGE the Major requirement to read,

"Major: Twenty-four hours of economics, including Economics 356K and at least twelve additional advanced hours. Economics 302 and 303 may be counted toward the major."

Reason: The Economics Department feels it is desirable to require more advanced work for a major in Economics.

Department of Psychology

On page 41 of the same Catalogue under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I," under "C. Majors and Minors," under "Psychology," CHANGE the Major and Minor requirements to read,

"Psychology majors must take six semester hours of mathematics.

"Major: Twenty-four semester hours of psychology above freshman rank, of which at least twelve must be in advanced courses. Psychology 317 (Statistical Methods in Psychology) and Psychology 358 (Experimental Psychology) are required.

"First Minor: Twelve semester hours of anthropology, chemistry, educational psychology, home economics, management, mathematics, philosophy, physics, sociology, or zoology.

"Second Minor: Six semester hours in a subject listed above which is not offered as a first minor."

Reason: Statistical analysis is necessary for the understanding of the material presented in advanced courses in Psychology. An understanding of experimental methodology is a desirable requisite for the training of psychologists.

Department of Home Economics

On page 57 of the same Catalogue under "Bachelor of Science in Home Economics, Plan II," under "C. Order and Choice of Work," under "4. Home and Commercial Demonstration Group," in the Senior Year CHANGE "three semester hours elective in home economics," to read, "Home Economics 320 or 369K."

Reason: These courses are particularly suitable for students majoring in the demonstration field and one of them should, therefore, be made a requirement rather than a possibility as an elective.

On page 58 of the same Catalogue under "Bachelor of Science in Home Economics, Plan II," under "C. Order and Choice of Work," under "7. Child Development Group," in the Freshman Year, DELETE "three semester hours of speech," and ADD "Three semester hours of elective and a speech proficiency test."

Reason: Students majoring under this Group can satisfy the speech prerequisite for the required course in Student Teaching by passing a speech proficiency test.

Special Programs Division

On page 27 of the same Catalogue under "HONORS" under "Graduation with honors"
CHANGE the first paragraph

From: "Graduation with honors is based on the average of all the grades made by a student on the courses taken at The University of Texas which are required and counted toward the degree, except for students who receive the degree of Bachelor of Arts under Plan IV, Degree Preparatory to Medicine. The basis for honors for these students is the average of all the grades on the courses taken at the Main University which are required and counted toward the degree and the grades on the work of the first year in the Medical Branch at Galveston or Southwestern Medical School at Dallas."

To: "Certain departments offer their own Honors Program. The basis for graduation with honors for students majoring in those departments is set forth at the beginning of the departmental course offerings appearing in this catalogue. Graduation with honors for other students in departments not offering their own Honors Program is based on the average of all the grades made by a student on the courses taken at the Main University of Texas which are required and counted toward the degree, except for students who receive the degree of Bachelor of Arts under Plan IV, Degree Preparatory to Medicine. The basis for honors for these students is the average of all the grades on the courses taken at the Main University which are required and counted toward the degree and the grades on the work of the first year in the Medical Branch at Galveston or Southwestern Medical School at Dallas. In those exceptional cases in which approval is given for substitution of the first year in another Class A medical school (see provision under the degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan IV, Scheme II, page 48) the grades in that Class A medical school shall be considered on the same basis as those from the Medical Branch or Southwestern."

Reason: As of September, 1958, certain departments will begin offering honors programs for their own majors. In order to insure that the majors in these departments desirous of graduating with honors will pursue these departmental programs, the above change is required.

PURCHASE BY A STAFF MEMBER OF UNIVERSITY EQUIPMENT: During the Second Semester of 1957-58 the Teacher Placement Service advertised for sale to University departments a 1951 model Remington Electromatic typewriter for \$125, but received no offers; the price was reduced to \$100, but no offers were received. Then bids were received from individuals, the highest being \$76.00 which was refused. Now Mr. M. Vere DeVault, an Associate Professor in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, has offered \$100. I recommend that this offer be accepted and that the typewriter be sold to Mr. DeVault.





The following agreement has been executed on behalf of The University of Texas, Postgraduate School of Medicine by the Dean. I recommend approval and ratification of signature:


