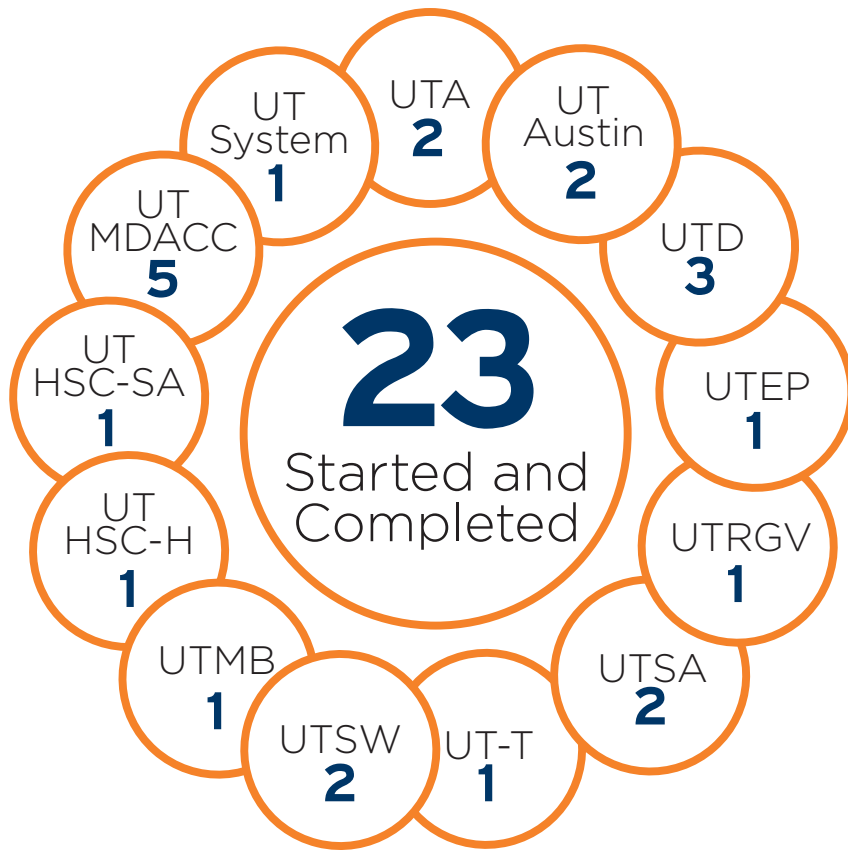


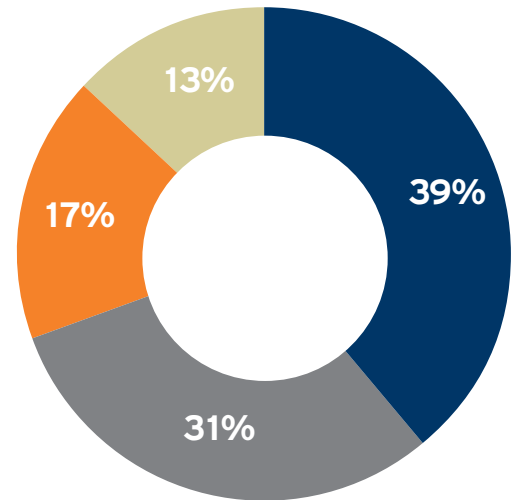

By the Numbers - 2018



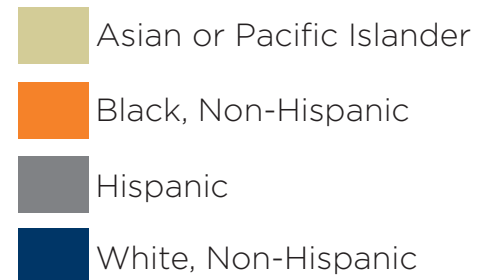
Program Demographics
