
UT System NIH Funding Data (FY15)


The National Institutes of Health (NIH) is the main source of federal funding for medical research in the United States, investing over 80 percent of its \$30.9 billion budget in competitive grant awards that support more than 300,000 researchers at over 2,500 universities, medical schools, and other research institutions. Since 2007, every UT System institution has received funding from NIH.



The above circle visualization represents the different areas of research at all UT System institutions funded by the NIH. Individual or institutional grant details can be searched <u>here</u>.

- \$601 million NIH funds awarded in FY15 (51% of all NIH funds awarded in Texas)
- 1,583 NIH grants awarded in FY15 (58% of all NIH grants awarded in Texas)
- \$182 million NIH funds for Neuroscience Research in FY15
