

- ❖ Architectural/engineering Professional Services (IDIQ and RFQ)
- ❖ Request for Qualifications (RFQ)
- ❖ Miscellaneous Services on Projects of Limited Scope – Indefinite delivery/indefinite quantity/ (IDIQ)
- ❖ GPO
 - is an entity that is created to leverage the purchasing power of a group of businesses to obtain discounts from vendors based on the collective buying power of the GPO members.

UTMB does not maintain a vendor database for supplier selection. All suppliers must register on the State of Texas Centralized Master Bidders List (CMBL). The CMBL is managed by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts State-wide Procurement Department. To register, please visit their website at:

- ❖ Make sure the National Institute of Governmental Purchasing (NIGP) codes are correct on your firm's CMBL profile.
- ❖ Make sure the contact information your firm has listed on the CMBL is correct.

What You Need To Know...

HUB Coordinators

- ❖ Start with getting to know the HUB Coordinator at each location. *Unless we can identify your core business we do not know if there is a current or future opportunity for your firm.*
- ❖ HUB Coordinator is the correct person you need to speak with until there is a bid opportunity.
- ❖ Provide capabilities statement (Contact your local APEX Accelerators (Formerly Procurement and Technical Assistance Program Centers (PTAC) to assist you.
- ❖ Provide references upon request.

State of Texas HUB Certification

- ❖ When you market your company to universities and state agencies make sure you inform them of the company name you are certified under.
- ❖ Please know the difference between State of Texas HUB certified and a Federal HUBZone.

Subcontractors

- ❖ Learn the name of the general contractors on the *campuses (Contact agency HUB Coordinators)*
- ❖ Register with the individual prime contractors. The prime firms are looking for HUB subs for their various projects.
 - Respond to the bids the prime firms provide to your firm. The biggest complaint I receive is we provided the opportunity; we receive responses.
- ❖ Know your bonding capacity.

- ❖ Comply with the HUB Subcontracting Plan requirements per the instructions in the bid document.
- ❖ Never submit bids to UTMB unless there is a sourcing event posted to the UTMB Bid Website.

Group Purchasing Organization (GPO) Accreditation Program

- ❖ Please familiarize yourself with the UT list of accredited GPO's.
 - ❖ Let us know if your firm is affiliated with any GPO's

Prime HUB contractors

- ❖ **Your firm must complete a State of Texas HUB Subcontracting Plan just like any other firm. There are no exceptions.**



Estimated Spend	Procurement Activity
<\$15,000	No Competitive procurement required.
\$15,000 to \$50,000	Informal quotes via email from three or more potential vendors are required (End users may secure these quotes directly). Two (2) HUB quotes (if available) are required. Also, GPO, State Contract, Local Contract or Exclusive Acquisition Justification (EAJ) may be used.
>\$50,000	Formal RFP/ITB procurement directly or via another state agency or a GPO. The institution's purchasing office, not departmental staff, must take lead responsibility for conducting or overseeing the procurement, unless the procurement is led by the UT System Supply Chain Alliance. Local Contract or Exclusive Acquisition Justification (EAJ) may be used.

NOTE: A large purchase may not be divided into small lot purchases to meet the contract value thresholds prescribed by this Section.





How does UTHealth post a bid?

- ❖ UTHealth is required to post all formal solicitations on the Procurement Services web site, <https://www.uth.edu/buy/bid-list.htm>.
- ❖ Sourcing Events are conducted via an electronic bid process. Coupa eSourcing is used to facilitate the entire Sourcing process from bid creation to evaluation and award.
- ❖ The posting within Coupa includes the bid documents, scope of work, drawings, specs, sample agreement, HUB plan, etc.
- ❖ An email notification is also sent to potential proposers advising of the bid opportunity.
- ❖ All communication goes through the Buyer (or through HUB Manager for HUB questions).



HUB Subcontracting Plans

- When submitting a formal bid, a HUB Subcontracting Plan (HSP) is a required document that must be submitted for projects projected to be at \$100,000 and above.
 - Failure to submit an HSP will result in being disqualified from the bid process.
 - UT-Physician formal bids do not require an HSP.
- There is a goal attached to each project. Each goal is listed on the HSP under Agency Special Instructions.
 - Knowing the goal will assist in deciding which option to do while filling out the HSP.
- There are four (4) different options when filling out the HSP.
 - Option One - 100% HUB Participation.
 - Option Two - Will meet the HUB Goal.
 - Option Three - Will NOT meet the HUB Goal.
 - Option Four - Self-Perform.
- Courtesy Review
 - Please allow 48 hours for HUB Manager to review.







Understanding MD Anderson “Best Value” Procurement


The institution may acquire goods or services by the method that provides the best value to the institution, including:

- competitive bidding;
- competitive sealed proposals;
- catalogue purchase;
- a group purchasing program; or
- an open market contract.

In determining what is the best value to the institution, the institution shall consider:

- the purchase price;
- the reputation of the vendor and of the vendor's goods or services;
- the quality of the vendor's goods or services;
- the extent to which the goods or services meet the institution's needs;
- the vendor's past relationship with the institution;
- the impact on the ability of the institution to comply with laws and rules relating to historically underutilized businesses;
- the total long-term cost to the institution of acquiring the vendor's goods or services; and
- any other relevant factor that a private business entity would consider in selecting a vendor.



Purchasing personnel will first refer to any Applicable Laws or University Rules that may direct the use of a specific procurement method.

If not applicable Purchasing will use the following contract value thresholds to determine procurement methods should be used:

Estimated Spend	Procurement Activities
<\$15,000	No competitive procurement required.
\$15,000 to \$50,000	Informal quotes from three or more potential vendors are required (Institutions may allow end users to secure these quotes directly). Two (2) HUB quotes are strongly encouraged within this range.
>\$50,000	Formal procurement by the Institution directly or via another state agency or a GPO. The Institution's purchasing office, not program staff, must take lead responsibility for conducting or overseeing the procurement, unless the <u>procurement is led by the UT System Supply Chain Alliance</u> .

NOTE: A large purchase may not be divided into small lot purchases to meet the contract value thresholds prescribed by this Section.







UT Tyler Purchasing Function Semi- Decentralized

Purchasing at UT Tyler is semi-decentralized. The Procurement Services office at UT Tyler is organized to serve all departments of the University, which has over 200 Budget Authorities that are authorized to expend funds. At lower dollar thresholds, departments have considerable discretion in purchasing of goods and services. As dollar threshold rise, individual departments must seek various levels of assistance from Procurement Services. At the highest threshold, a formal procurement must be conducted by the Procurement Services division with departments providing subject matter expertise.

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
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UT Tyler Health Science Center Purchasing Function centralized

Purchasing at UT Tyler Health Science Center is centralized. The Procurement Services office at UTTHSC serves all departments at the Health Center and all clinical areas. At lower dollar thresholds, satellite buyers in certain designated departments can make the purchases up to \$14,999.99. However, all satellite buyers are a branch off of the procurement department and have gone through the same training as the procurement department. Anything over \$14,999 a formal procurement must be conducted by the Procurement Services division with departments providing subject matter expertise. At this level the Buyer is certified with the state of Texas.


